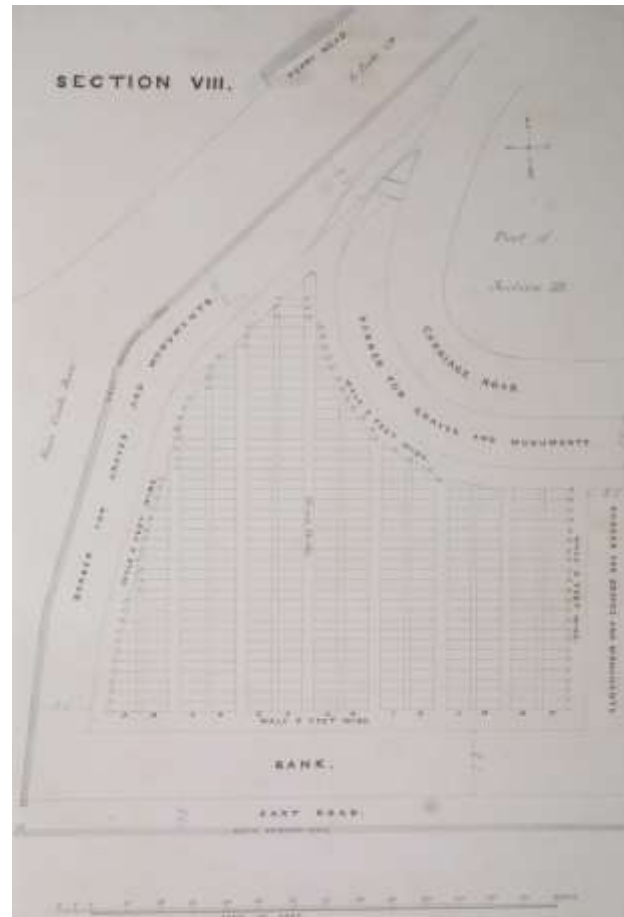


## Section 8

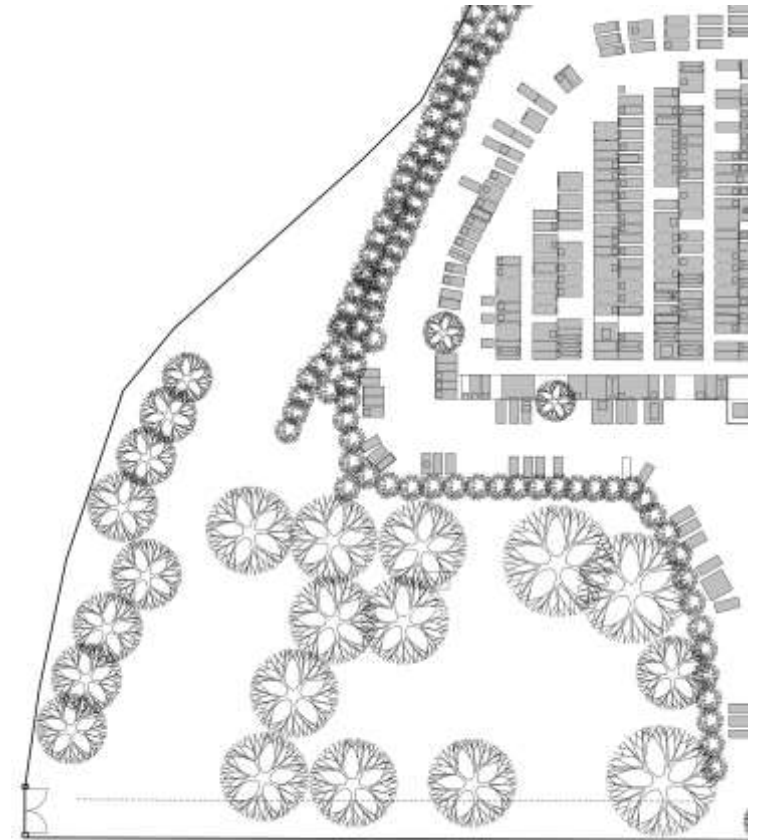
The original layout for Section 8 made provision for a series of rows with, behind a bank, a cart road leading from a gate in Perrymead to the chapel.

The section is now almost completely enclosed by a wire fence and the area is overgrown with trees and large laurel bushes. The ground is almost completely covered by ivy which hides fallen trees and branches. On the southern side is the wall, the other side of which is the adjoining Catholic cemetery. The ground is above the general level of the other parts of the cemetery and there is a drop of about 3 metres to the graves in the border. A stone hut exists. The growth from the laurels has intruded into it and it is in a poor state. Presumably it was used by the cemetery's caretaker.

The only graves in the section are along its border.

### Eastern Border of Section 8

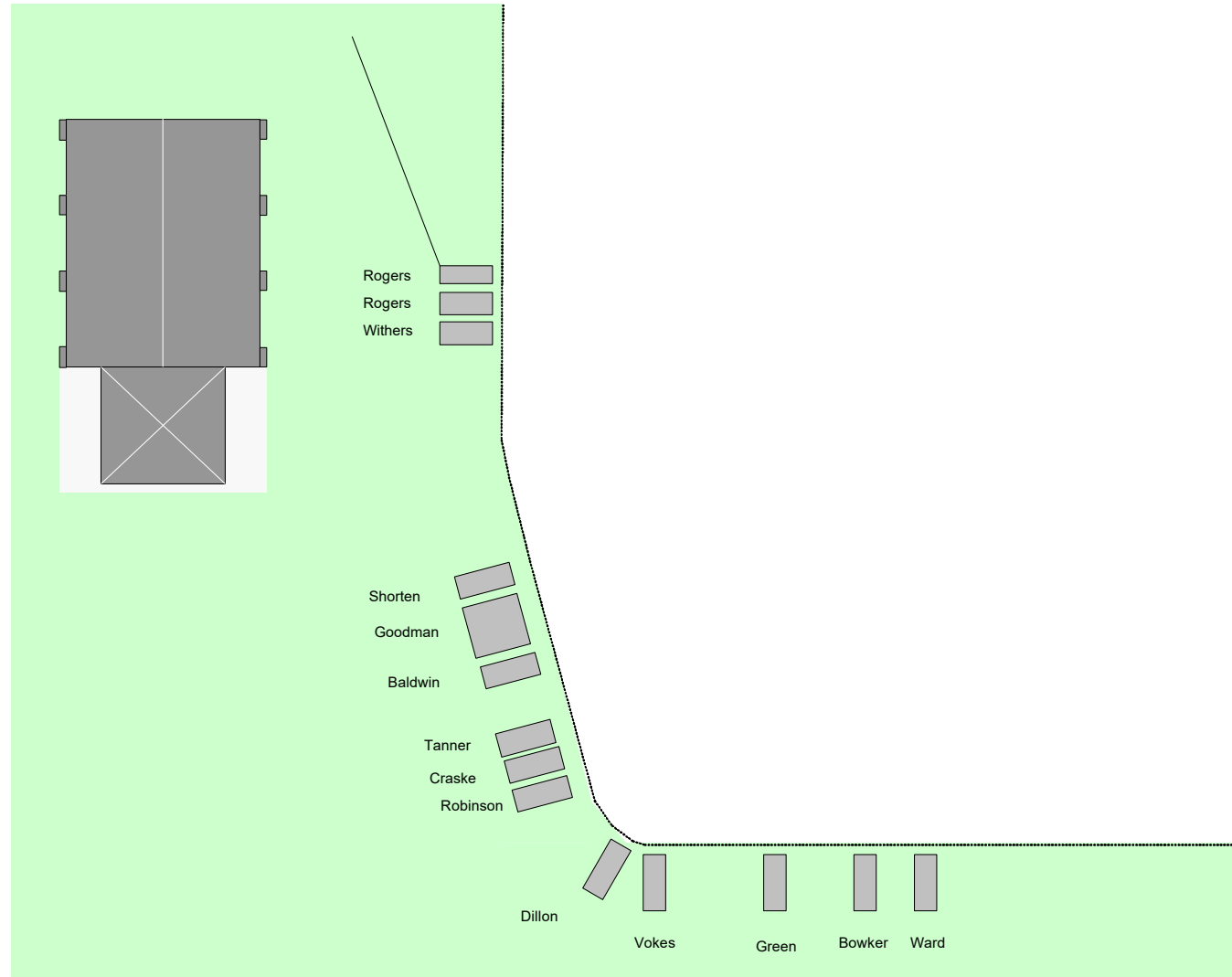

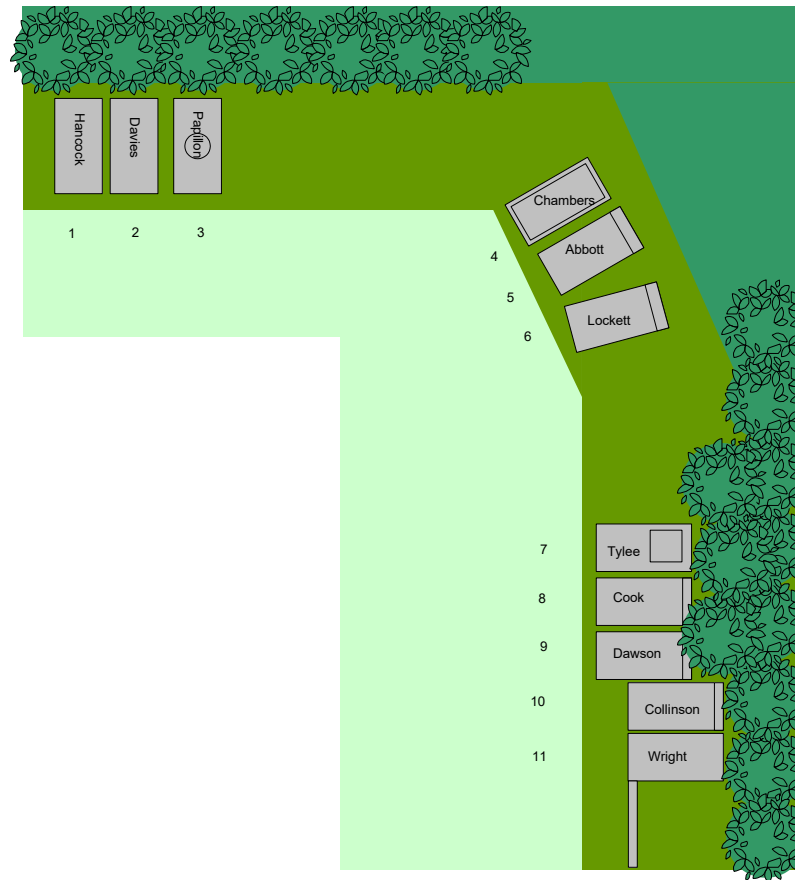


