

Section 5

Section 5 is an irregularly shaped 'island' between section 1 to the west and section 4 to the east. The western side is at the same level as section 1 and, going eastwards, this slopes down to the lower section 4. A path from east to west cuts through the section.

The majority of the graves are in a single, curved row on the western side. The remainder of the graves are on the slope in the middle of the section or on the eastern border.



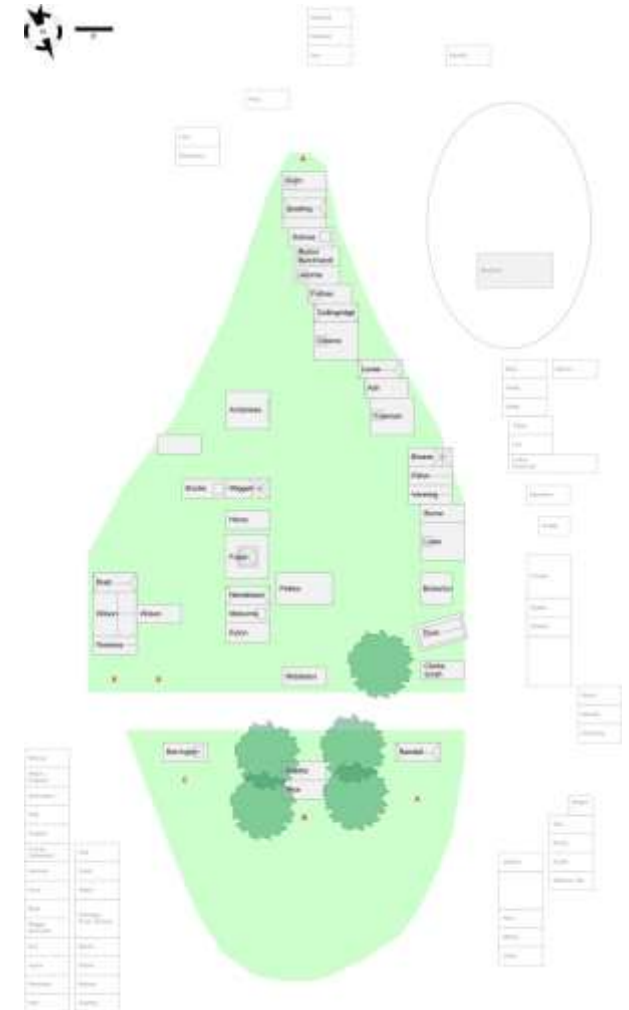
