

Section 1

The section has 16 main rows, 5 rows on the western side that are deemed to be a border, an eastern border along the boundary wall and a northern border. On the southern side by the boundary wall are 6 large deciduous trees on top of a bank about 3m high.





Others were convicted on lesser charges. Lord and Lady de Blaquiere sustained a double bereavement during the war. Their elder son, who was an officer in the Cameronians, fell in action at Neuve Chapelle in March, 1915, and their younger son, a naval sub-lieutenant, was drowned by the torpedoing of the <i>Laurentic</i> off the Irish coast on June 25, 1917, and these losses deeply affected Lord de Blaquiere's health. 




View of border looking south
