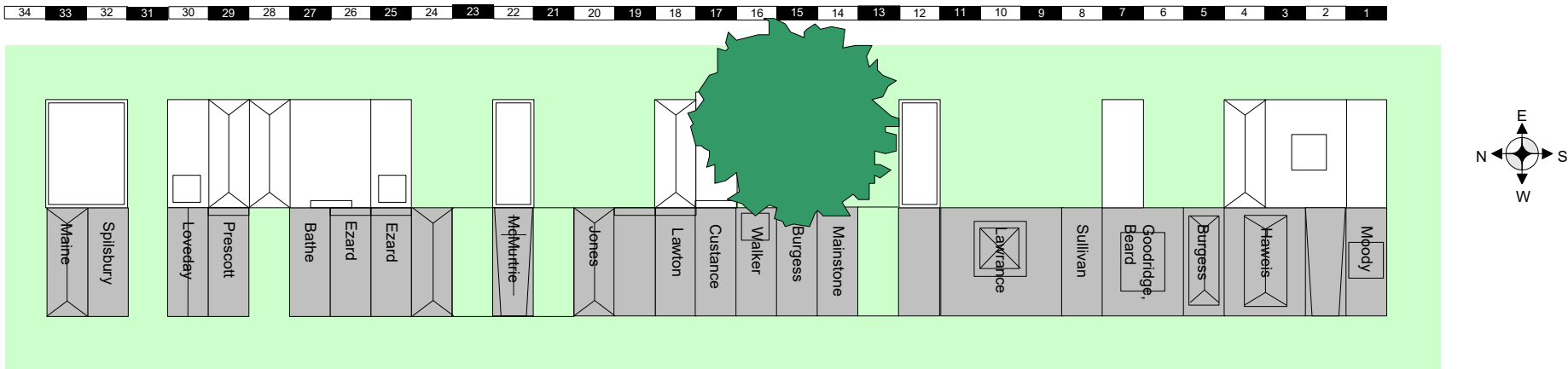

He practised as a physician, and then attended Christ's College, Cambridge, then took Holy Orders. After ordination in 1757, he became a curate at St Mary Magdalene Oxford and caused such a stir by his Evangelical ministry that he was finally dismissed. He became assistant preacher with Martin Madan§ at the Lock Hospital, Aldwinkle, Northamptonshire. He was also chaplain to Lady Huntingdon's chapel at Bath, and rector at All Saints' Church in Aldwinkle. He was an author and hymn writer. He was named in the Countess of Huntingdon's will as trustee-executor. He was one of the founders of the Church Missionary Society. He died on 11 Feb 1820 and was buried at Bath Abbey. **Northern Border of Section 2**

The northern border of Section 2 runs from the main north-south path west in a curve to the Crimean War memorial. It is 16' wide with two rows of graves, north and south. Almost all graves are 3' wide with a 1' gap each side. Graves in the two rows are aligned.

The burial book includes a number of entries which specify a location of the northern border of Section 2 but without giving a position. For those which have been found, an arbitrary relative position has been given. There remain various unmarked graves in this border as the burial book has entries for them but no memorials for them have been found.

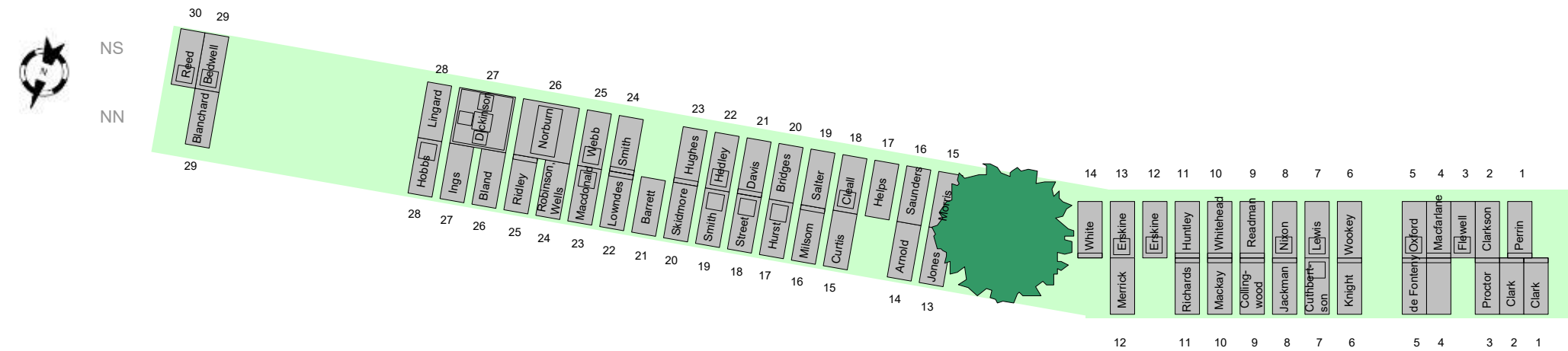

- Bomarsund

A fort in Sund on the Åland islands in the Baltic built by the Russians in 1832. It was destroyed in 1854 by a Franco-British fleet.
- Alma

The battle of the Alma on 20 Sep 1854 is considered as the first battle in the Crimean War. The Russians attempted to stop a force of 26,000 British and French troupes who had landed in Crimea from advancing toward Sebastopol at the Alma river.
- Balaklava

On 20 Oct 1854 an attack by Russian cavalry and infantry was driven back by the 93<sup>rd</sup> Highlanders and the Heavy Brigade, the latter under the command of General Sir James Scarlett. It was also the site of the charge of the Light Brigade.
- Inkerman

On 5 Nov 1854 the Russians launched an attack on British and French forces east of Sebastopol. The Russian force of 42,000 men and 134 guns faced a British force of 2,700 men and guns. With the help of additional guns and British and French reinforcements, the attack was repulsed.
- Sweaborg

A granite fortress that guarded Helsinki’s inner harbour. It was bombarded on 9 and 10 Aug 1855.
- Tchernaya

The site of a failed Russian attack to lift the siege of Sebastopol on 16 Aug 1855. Various pictures of the battle exist.

Richard Debaufre Guyon (1803-1856)

From the Encyclopaedia Britannica 1911:

“RICHARD DEBAUFRE GUYON (1803-1856), British soldier, general in the Hungarian revolutionary army and Turkish pasha, was born at Walcot, near Bath, in 1803. After receiving a military education in England and in Austria he entered the Hungarian hussars in 1823, in which he served until after his marriage with a daughter of Baron Spleny, a general officer in the imperial service. At the outbreak of the Hungarian War in 1848, he re-entered active service as an officer of the Hungarian Honveds, and he won great distinction in the action of Sukoro (September 29, 1848) and the battle of Schwechat (October 30). He added to his reputation as a leader in various actions in the winter of 1848-1849, and after the battle of Kopolna was made a general officer. He served in important and sometimes independent commands to the end of the war, after which he escaped to Turkey. In 1852 he entered the service of the sultan. He was made a pasha and lieutenant-general without being required to change his faith, and rendered distinguished service in the campaign against the Russians in Asia Minor (1854-55). General Guyon died of cholera at Scutari on the 12th of October 1856. See A. W. Kinglake, *The Patriot and the Hero* General Guyon (1856).”

Some sources have his year of birth as 1813. Kars is a city in eastern Turkey (originally part of Armenia) which was the scene of a protracted siege by the Russians in the Crimean War.

John Campbell (1807-1855)

John Campbell served in India, Burma, the Mediterranean, the West Indies and Canada before being posted to the Crimea in March, 1854, where he was present at the Alma and Inkerman. He commanded 1<sup>st</sup> Brigade, 4<sup>th</sup> Division. On 18 June 1855, contrary to orders and sending away Captain Hume, his ADC, he led a storming party on the Redan and was killed instantly. He was buried on Cathcart's Hill - "Sacred to the memory of Major General Sir John Campbell Bart. killed in action June 18th 1855." The Illustrated London News of 29 Sep 1855 (vol XXVII edition 763) has a picture of 'The late Major-General John Campbell, Bart.'. The north aisle of

St John's church, Edinburgh has a memorial tablet to Major-General John Campbell, killed at Redan, Crimea 1855. The National Portrait Gallery has a photograph by Roger Fenton (1819-1869) of Capt Hume and Sir John Campbell Bt (NPG Ax24906). There is an account of the attack on Redan in Chapter 5 of *Journal Kept during the Russian War: from the Departure of the Army from England in April 1854, to the Fall of Sebastopol* by Fanny (Mrs Henry) Duberly, 1855 (republished in 2000 by Elibron Classics, but also available online). ('The Redan' or 'The Great Redan' was the name given to the number 3 bastion at Sebastopol. There is a pub at Chilcompton (Som) with this name and a picture of Crimean soldiers.)

Walter Trevelyan (1798-1854)

From *Gentleman's Magazine* Vol XLII Jul-Dec 1851 p411

Aug 21 ... At Varna, from an attack of cholera, in nine hours, Col. Walter Trevelyan, of the second battalion of the Coldstream Guards. He was the second son of the late Rev. Walter Trevelyan (son of Sir John Trevelyan, 4th Bart. M.P. for Somerset) by Charlotte, third dau. of John Hudson, esq. of Bessingby, co. York, afterwards Lady Carington.

*The Journal of the Household Brigade for the Year 1863* by I E A Dolby p316 in a documentation of the Guards' Memorial in Trinity Church, Windsor has:

“COLONEL WALTER TREVELYAN, second son of the Rev. W. TREVELYAN, Incumbent of Henbury, Gloucestershire.—Died of cholera at Varna, Bulgaria, August 24th, 1854.”

(He was aged 56.) From *Seventy-One Years of a Guardsman's Life* by General Sir George Higginson, London: Smith Elder & Co, 1916 Ch VII Preliminaries of Invasion Jun-Sep 1854 p133: “You will have heard of poor Trevelyan\* of the Coldstream. His death was fearfully sudden. The evening before, I was laughing and talking with him; he being in apparently perfect health. Certainly cholera is a terrible thing!” The footnote has “Capt. and Lieut.-Col. Walter Trevelyan, grandson of Sir John Trevelyan of Nettlecombe, Somerset.” Will of Walter Trevelyan, Colonel in Her Majesty's Service of Saint James Place London, date 28 Dec 1854, PROB 11/2203. From the *New Army List* of in the section on the 60<sup>th</sup> (The Kings Royal Rifle Corps) on p 111:

Walter Trevelyan, 2nd Lt. Royal Artillery, 18 Nov. 17; Lieut. 25 Sep. 25; Capt. 19 Sept. 26; Major, 28 Dec 1832; Lieut.-Col. 10 Aug. 41.

*A System of Light Drill; or, Questions and Answers on the Rudiments of Skirmishing; Changes of Position; Relieving or Reinforcing Skirmishers; ... Covering the Movements of a Battalion, Regiment, or Brigade; ... as practised by the First Battalion both, or the King's Royal Rifle Corps. ...* Published by Authority of Lieut. - Col. Walter Trevelyan. London: W. Clowes & Sons, 1843. In *Journal Kept During the Russian War from the Departure of the Army from England in April 1854, to the Fall of Sebastopol* by Fanny Duberly (wife of Captain Henry Duberly, paymaster of the 8<sup>th</sup> Hussars) Chapter 2 Disembarkation and Encampment at Varna, mentions the deaths that were occurring there from cholera.

Exham Schomberg Turner Swyny (1807-1854)

Baptised on 21 Jan 1807 at St Olave's, Chichester (Sussex), son of Thomas Rowley & Charlotte Swyny. On 4 Mar 1852 at Dauntsey (Wilts) Exham Schomberg Turner Swyny married Bertha Biedermann [IGI] (registered 1852/Q1 Malmesbury). (Swyny would seem to be a variant of Sweeney and of Irish origin.) Lieutenant-Colonel E.S.T. Swyny - killed at Inkermann - 5th November 1854. Buried on Cathcart's Hill - "Sacred to the memory of Lieut. Colonel E.S.T. Swyny who fell on the 5th Novr 1854 when in comd of the 63rd Regt at the battle of Inkerman. Also in memory of Lieut. G.C.W. Curtois, Ensn H.T. Clutterbuck who fell in the same battle- the last two while carrying the Colors of the Regt Also in memory of Bt. Major G.N. Harrison who was killed whilst on duty at the trenches on the 7 July 1855."

Lennard Barrett Tyler (-1855)

Born circa 1815 son of George Peter Tyler (1762-1834) and Ann Long (-1849). (Presumably born in India as his brothers Charles Henry Tyler (1813-1890) and Owen Blathwayt Tyler (1820-1892) were both born in the East Indies.) In 1845 the 62nd (Wiltshire) Regiment was stationed in Madras and Bengal. From the *New Army List* by H G Hart No. XXIX 1-Jan-1846 p114 for the 62<sup>nd</sup> (Wiltshire) Regt. of Foot “Lennard Barrett Tyler Ensign:

23-Mar-1838 Lieutenant: 18-Jul-1840". From *Bulletins and Other State Intelligence for the Year 1854* Part II Jul-Dec p1690 "62nd Foot, Captain Lennard Barrett Tyler to be Major by purchase, vice Brevet-Lieutenant-Colonel Matthias who retires. Dated 17th November 1854." The regiment spent the worst Russian winter for 100 years on the heights in front of Sebastopol in the Crimea. The *Annual Register* 1855 p347 reported the promotion on 29 Jun of Major L B Tyler of the 62nd Foot to Lieutenant-Colonel. The following September they attacked the Great Redan (see Sir John Campbell, above), losing half its Sergeants and Officers and over 100 men. Lieutenant-Colonel L. Tyler - died of wounds on 23 Oct 1855. Memorial on Cathcart's Hill - "Sacred to the memory of Lt. Col. Tyler 62d Regt. who died at Balaklava Hospital on the 23d October 1855 from the effects of a wound received at the assault on the Redan on the 8th Sept 1855." From *Gentleman's Magazine* vol XLIV Jul-Dec 1855 p669 "At Balaklava, Lieut.-Col. Barrett Lennard Tyler, commanding H.M. 62nd Foot, of his severe wounds received when leading his regiment to the assault of the Redan, on the 8th Sept."

#### William Swinton (-1855)

The Order of Battle in 1855 had Brevet Major W Swinton, Royal Artillery. Brevet-Major William Swinton - Royal Artillery - died in camp at Sebastopol - 2 Jan 1855. Son of the late Colonel Swinton, Bengal Army. From *Gentleman's Magazine* of March 1855 in the Deaths section, on page 328 "In camp before Sebastopol, brevet Major William SWINTON, R. Art. eldest son of the late Col. Wm. Swinton, Bengal army." In the 1841 census at Rivers Street, Bath: William Swinton, aged 55, ind[ependent], born in Scotland, Eliza Swinton, aged 40, Eliza Swinton, aged 20, Mary Swinton, aged 14, Charlotte Swinton, aged 10, George Swinton, aged 4, Aaron Swinton, aged 2, Arthur Swinton, aged 5 months, Isabella Swinton, aged 7, and four servants. In the 1841 census at the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich: Edward Swinton, aged 15, gentleman cadet, born in Scotland. (The 'S' for Scotland and 'I' for India are close in shape in the original.) In the 1851 census at 19 St James Square, Bath: William Swinton, aged 66, fundholder, born in Scotland, wife Francis (sic) S, aged 53, born in E Indies,

children: Edward, aged 26, Captain Royal Artillery, born in E Indies, Mary, aged 24, born in E Indies, Charlott, aged 19, born at Bath, and Arthur, aged 14, born at Bath, and four servants. The death of William Swinton, aged 69, was registered 1853/Q4 Bath. Will of William Swinton, Colonel in the Bengal Army of Bath, Somerset, date 29 Dec 1853, PROB 11/2183. (Baptised in Bengal on 6 Mar 1820 Eliza Herculina Swinton, daughter of William & Eliza Swinton [IGI]. Baptised at Barrackpore on 27 Apr 1828: Isabella Jessy Swinton, daughter of William & Eliza Swinton, date of birth 15 Jan 1828 IGI.)

#### John Burton Forster (-1855)

From the *New Army List* by H G Hart No. XXIX 1-Jan-1846 p114 for the 62<sup>nd</sup> (Wiltshire) Regt. of Foot "John Burton Forster Ensign: 22-Nov-1839 Lieutenant: 31-Dec-1841". Captain J.B. Forster - killed in the assault on the Quarries - 7 Jun 1855. The Quarries was an area at Sebastopol close to Redan. Sebastopol finally fell in Sep 1855. From *Gentleman's Magazine* vol XLIV Jul-Dec 1855 p217 "Apr. 22. Capt. John Burton Forster, senior Capt. 62nd Foot (1848), youngest son of the late Col. Thomas Watkin Forster, 24th Foot, of the Manor House, Holt, Wilts.". The death of Thomas Watkin Forster, aged 66, was registered 1842 Bath. Will of Thomas Watkin Forster, Lieutenant Colonel in His Majesty's Army, date 12 Apr 1842, PROB 11/1960. (Thomas Burton (Watkin) Forster, first son of Thomas Watkin Forster, has an entry in *Alumni Oxonienses*.)

#### Thomas Molyneux Graves (1831-1855)

Baptised on 17 Sep 1831 at St Martin in the Fields, London: Thomas Molyneux Graves, son of John Samuel & Maria Graves, date of birth 22 Mar 1831 [IGI]. Lieutenant Thomas Molyneux Graves killed in assault on the Redan 18 Jun 1855, aged 23. Son of the late Lawrence Graves (!), of Bath. Memorial at St. Nicholas Church, Combe Raleigh, Devon - "In memory of Thomas Molyneux Graves Lt. R.E. Born 22 Mar 1831. Killed in the assault on Redan 18 Jun 1855 and Thomas Molyneux Graves Lt. 76 Punjab Indian Army. Born 1 Jun 1890 at Woodbine Hill, Combe Raleigh, killed in action at Sanna-i-at Mesopotamia 22 April 1916. The eldest son and grandson

of J.S. Graves, Esq. of Woodbine Hill, Combe Raleigh. These were men who put their duty above all else."

#### Frederick George Ainslie (1810-1854)

Born on 19 Feb 1810 at Edinburgh son of Col. George Robert Ainslie & Sophia Charlotte Neville [IGI]. Lieutenant-Colonel Frederick George Ainslie - wounded at Inkermann on 5 Nov 1854. Died of wounds on 14 Nov 1854. Son of Lt-General George Robert Ainslie and Sophia. Buried at Scutari - "Erected as a mark of respect & esteem by his brother officers to the memory of Lt Col George Ainslie 21st Royal British Fusiliers who died at Scutari on the 14th Novr 1854 aged 45 years from a wound received when leading on the right wing of the Regt at the battle of Inkerman on the 5th November 1854." Memorial at Aubourn St. Peter, Lincolnshire - "In memory of Frederick George Ainslie, C.B. Lieut. Colonel of the 21st R.N.B. Fusiliers, younger son of the late Lieut. General Ainslie and his wife Sophia Charlotte Nevile, who died November 14th 1854, aged 44, of a wound received whilst in command of his regiment at the Battle of Inkermann, November 5th 1854. He was a good man, a perfect gentleman and a gallant soldier. This monument is erected by his mother and the surviving members of his family."
