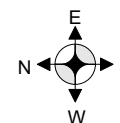
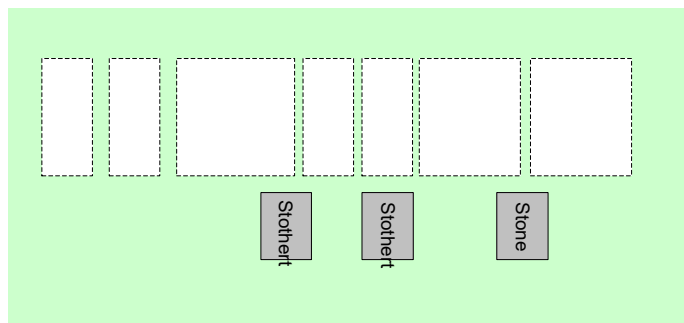

This seems to have been taken from Debrett's entry. 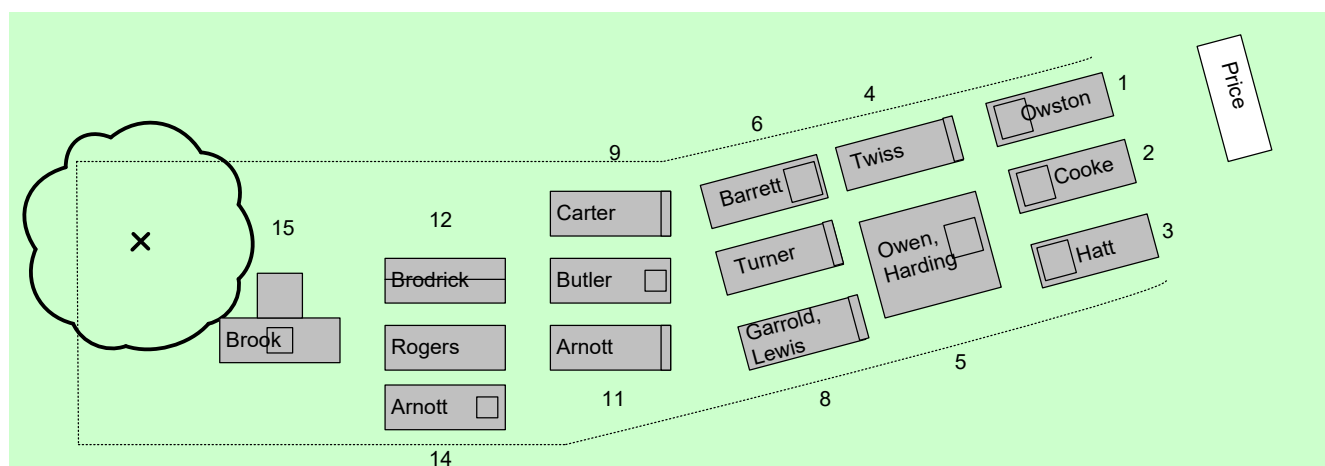

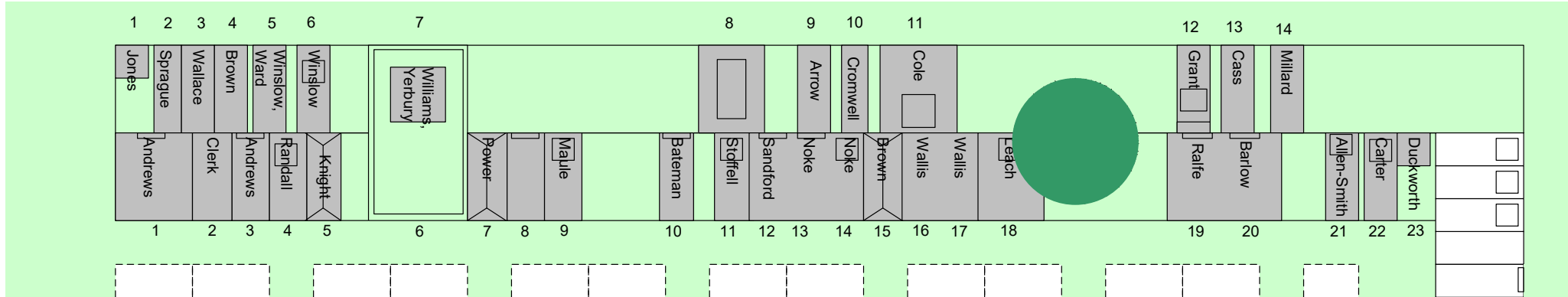
