

Section 5

Sections 5 and 6 were originally meant to be distinct with a 6' path running east-west separating them. There is no longer a path, graves having been placed there in the 1940s so that sections 5 and 6 form continuous rows.

Here the overall maps of the area show the two sections separately. However, the layouts for the individual rows ignore the boundary between the sections as, on the ground, this separation between sections is not apparent and for navigational purposes it is easier to treat each row as a distinct unit.

The western edge has a much-overgrown laurel hedge. In 2007 this was cut back to reveal the graves.

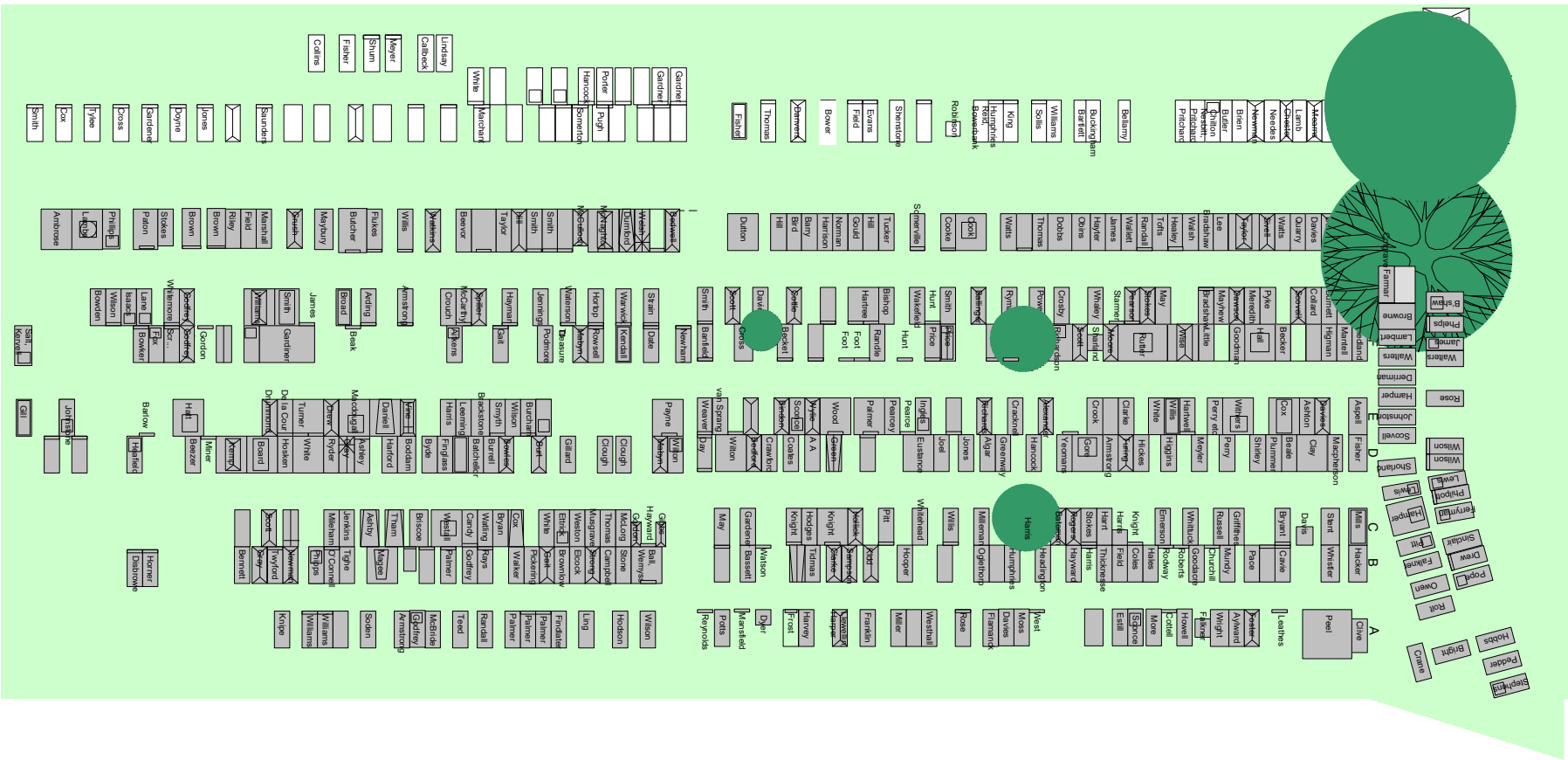

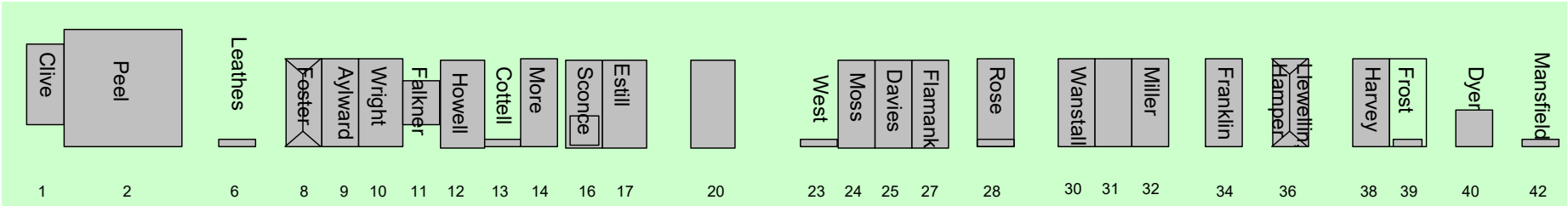

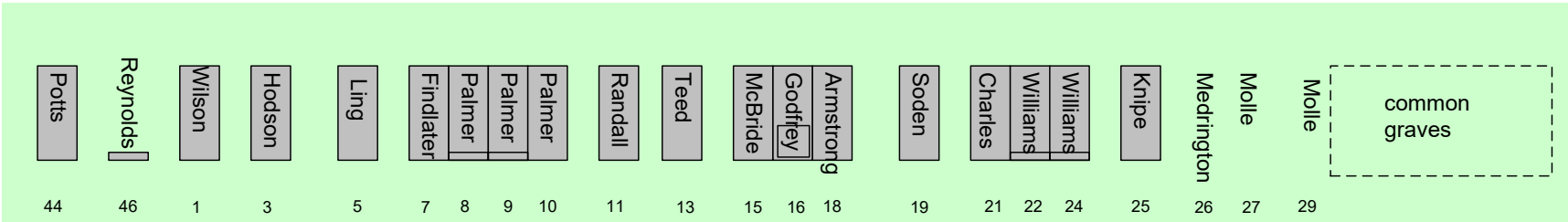

According to the original plan Row A is on the western edge of the section. The orientation of some of the headstones indicates that west of this row was a path which is no longer in evidence.

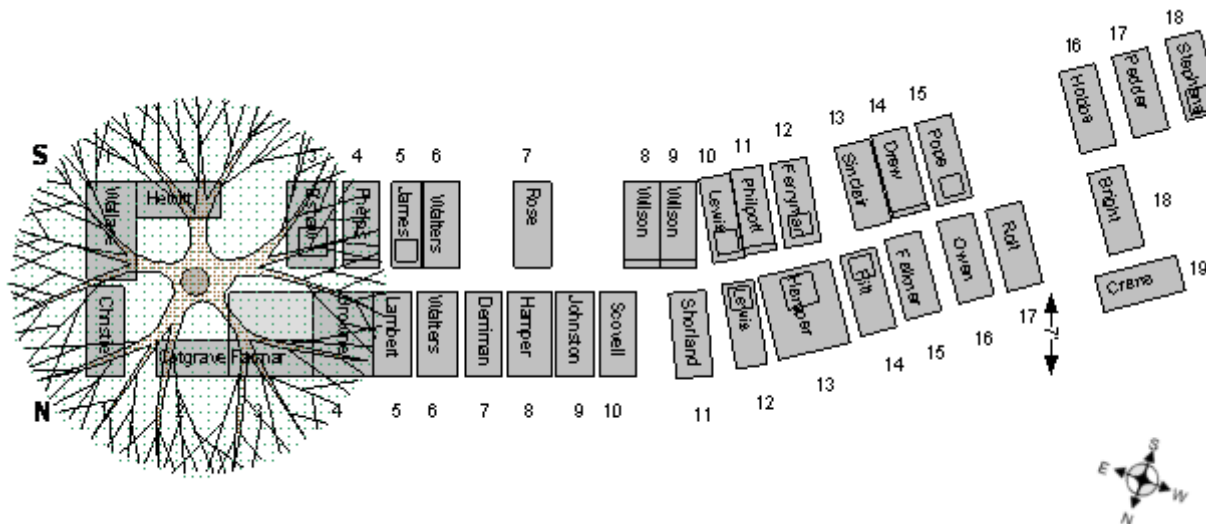
