

## Section 7

Section 7, in the north-eastern area, has two sets of graves. The main set is a series of rows containing about 100 graves which are almost continuations from those in Section 4. There is also an eastern border of two rows with 33 graves from the 1920s.

The main set of graves is sparse with major gaps. Row A, which is alongside the main path, is well ordered. Row B is directly behind it but has graves at the top abutting those in row A while, lower, these have a different orientation. From the examination of the Burial Register entries, this section contains a large number of unmarked graves many of which are common graves.

The graves in row A date are mainly from the period 1855-1870. Those at the lower end of row B are from the same period with additions at the top of the row from the 1930s.

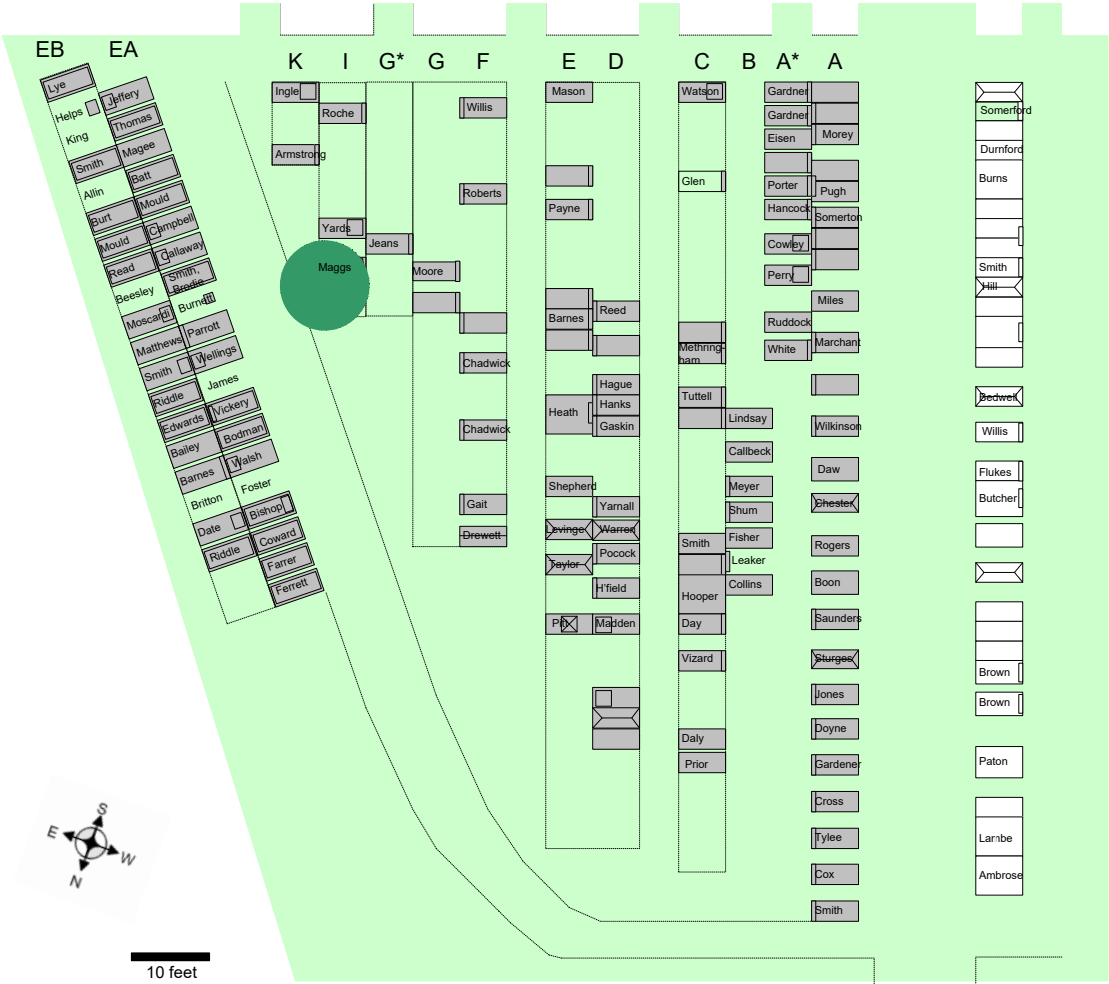

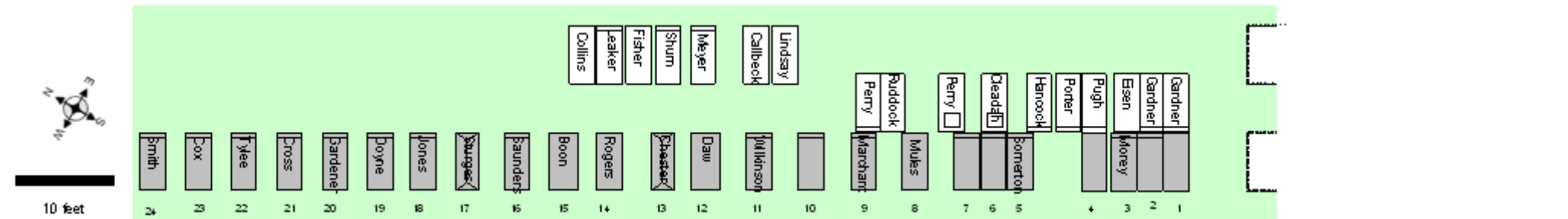

Sheridan WWM/H/142 1811</p> <p>The matter concerned an unsuccessful insurrection in Ireland in 1803 and his cousin Robert Emmet (1778-1803), a member of the banned United Irishmen, who was found guilty of high treason and was hanged, drawn and quartered on 20 Sep 1803 at Thomas Street, Dublin. For example from <i>The United Irishmen, Their Lives and Times</i> by Richard Robert Madden, Third Series Vol III , Dublin: James Duffy, 1846, p211:</p> <p>"The case, as far as I have been able to discover it, was this : – " St. John Mason was first cousin to Robert Emmet ; <i>his</i> trial is in print, and the reading of it might be no bad preparation for any gentleman who wished to understand the state of Dublin at that time, and the views and feelings of government : Emmet's concern in the insurrection of July 23, 1803, appeared by the papers which on that night were found in the Rebel Depot in Mass-lane, and sent to the Castle, some of which were proved on his trial ; so far the government was fully informed ; but what the extent of their information in other respects was, it is perhaps impossible now to discover : we must endeavour to ascertain the facts, and suppose them to have been known at the time.</p> <p>For some months previous to the insurrection, Emmet had lived in or near Dublin, occupied chiefly in preparations for that event. At the time of the insurrection, and for some time before, but how long does not appear, St. John Mason, the first cousin and intimate friend of Emmet, resided at Sea Point, a genteel boarding-house, about four miles from the city, to which he probably made frequent visits, though this does not appear : I cannot find any evidence of any intercourse having taken place between them during this time ; but it seems natural, that in the alarm and doubt, and suspense which followed the 23rd July, it should have been at least strongly suspected that such intercourse had existed. Mason certainly took no part in the murders in Thomas- street ; the insurrection in that quarter took place about nine o'clock in the evening, at which time he was in a large company at the house of a very respectable gentleman who resided about ____miles from town, and ____ from Sea Point. Even this, however, did not tend to exempt him from all suspicion, as it was generally said that the company were surprised at his not coming till eight o'clock, (though a dinner-party) and at his arriving there, not from Sea Point, but from town. On that night Mason lay at Sea Point ;</p>

			<p>on the next or the following night he lay at an hotel in James-street, almost adjoining the spot where the insurrection had broken out, and from thence proceeded by various modes of travelling as far as Nenagh, that being the direct way to Kerry, where Mason's connections lay ; there he was arrested (it does not appear on what day) by ___, a Magistrate of the County, in consequence, as he states, of an order for that purpose from the then Under Secretary. In Mason's letter-case were found some letters, particularly one directed to him, concerning which he expressed considerable anxiety, saying, that it was from a female in London. This letter the magistrate read, and forwarded with the rest, and the prisoner, to the Castle. It cannot be found, but the magistrate's account of it is, that it purported to be from a woman, but was expressed as if it had some covered meaning ; mentioned a longing till her nails should grow so long as to tear flesh and draw blood, and in more than one place expressed a wish to draw blood. He was ordained to the curacy of St Thomas's, Dublin, but, being threatened with consumption, went after two years to Malaga. On his return he took a curacy at Bath, and was speedily appointed to the Octagon Chapel, where his fame both as preacher and platform speaker continued to spread. Some years afterwards he was made prebendary of Wells Cathedral. In 1860 the delicate state of his health caused him to accept the living of Enniskillen. In 1864 he was made dean of Cork and chaplain to the lord lieutenant. Here he manifested those great gifts which ultimately raised him to high office; a powerful grasp of mental, moral and political problems, combined with eloquence of a high order, and illuminated with brilliant flashes of wit. In 1868 the question of the disestablishment of the Irish Church came to the front, and Magee threw himself into the task of its defence with his usual energy and vivacity. The success of his orations caused Disraeli to offer him the bishopric of Peterborough. He justified his appointment by his magnificent speech when the Disestablishment Bill reached the House of Lords in 1869, and then plunged into diocesan and general work in England. He preached three remarkable sermons on Christian Evidence in Norwich Cathedral in 1871. He took up the temperance question, and declared in the House of Lords that he would rather see "England free than England compulsorily sober," an utterance which</p>

			the extreme advocates of total abstinence misquoted and attacked. He was also a supporter of the movement for abolishing the recitation of the Athanasian Creed in the public services of the Church of England, believing, as he said, that the "presence" of the damnatory clauses, "as they stand and where they stand, is a real peril to the Church and to Christianity itself," and that those clauses "are no essential part" of the creed. The project was laid aside in consequence of the hostility of a large body of the clergy, reinforced by the threat of Dr Pusey and Canon Liddon to abandon their offices if it were carried. Magee took a prominent part in the Ritual controversy, opposing what he conceived to be romanizing excess in ritual, as well as the endeavour of the opposite party to "put down Ritualism," as Disraeli expressed it, by the operation of the civil law. His incisive way of putting things earned for him the title of the "Militant Bishop," but, as he himself remarked in relation to this title, his efforts were ever for peace. Unfortunately for the Church, he was not elevated to the see of York until his energies were exhausted. He died on the 5th of May 1891, about four months after his appointment. Magee's manifold activities, his capability as an administrator, his sound judgment, and his remarkable insight into the ecclesiastical problems of his time, rank him among the most distinguished of English prelates.
