

Section W

The section is part of the nonconformist area. It has 113 graves but only about a half have memorials.

It is bounded on northern side by the curved path which ascends the hill to the level path which runs across the cemetery from east to west.

In an obituary for Lord Lisgar which appeared in the *Cavan Weekly News* of 13 Oct 1876:


The remains of the deceased nobleman were interred at Bailieborough Church on Wednesday last. He is succeeded in the estates and Baronetcy by his nephew, William Need Muston Young, who was born at Calcutta in 1847.
