

Section Z

This section is part of the nonconformist area. It extends from the middle path up the hill. It has 101 graves but only about half have memorials.

The majority of the graves are in the lower section. The path leading from the lower to the upper part has a row of graves bordering it. The upper part has only a small number of graves.



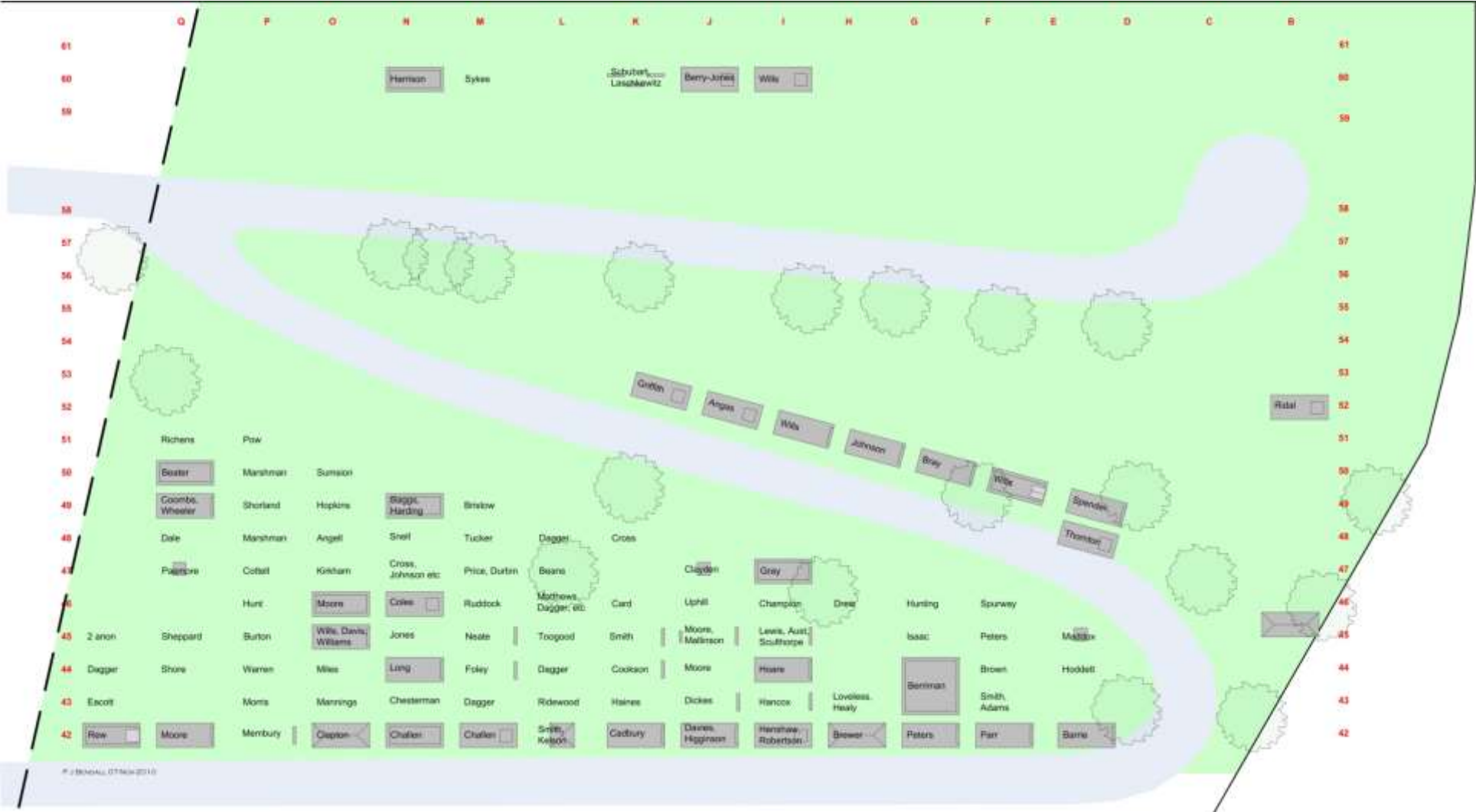
Lower part

The son of a man of some distinction as a journalist, who had served on the staff of the <i>Times</i>, he was educated at Merchant Taylors' School and St John's College, Oxford, of which College, after taking honours in Classic and Modern History, he became a Fellow. This was in 1855, when the Indian Civil Service was being thrown open to competition, and Thornton was one of the first batch of "competition wallahs". Among the twenty who were selected from more than a hundred candidates there were several who did well in India, and one whose career was somewhat closely connected with Thornton's, namely, Charles Aitchison, who passed sixth in the list, Thornton coming out tenth. Both were sent to the Punjab, both did good service in the Mutiny, and being held for a time - Aitchison for an unusually long time - the post of Foreign Secretary. It was my good fortune when a young man to serve under them in turn as an Attaché in the Foreign Office, and to know them both well.</p> <p>Thornton's service in the Mutiny won him considerable reputation.
