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Introduction



The church of St Michael, Burnett

From the *Imperial Gazetteer of England and Wales 1870-72* by John Marius Wilson:

BURNETT, a parish in Keynsham district, Somerset; on the river Chew, adjacent to the Great Western railway, 2 miles SE of Keynsham. Post Town, Keynsham, under Bristol. Acres, 608. Real property, £1,339. Pop., 98. Houses, 16. The property is subdivided. The living is a rectory in the diocese of Bath and Wells. Value, £125. Patron, the Rev. J. B. Doveton. The church has a brass of 1575, and is good.

The Church of St Michael dates from the 13th century and is a Grade II listed building. It contains a monumental brass to John Cutte (mayor of Bristol) from 1575 who owned the village. A church is thought to have existed prior to its building in the 13th century as it has Norman features and from

1102 until the dissolution of the monasteries the village was owned by Tewkesbury Abbey.

From an article on the history of Burnett “About 1050, the village and church were given to Edith, sister of King Harold, on her marriage to Edward the Confessor (*The Journal of the Keynsham & Saltford Local History Society Series 2. No. 9. 2009*).”

From the *Bristol Mercury* of Mon 15 Aug 1825 p1 col d: “There was neither birth, marriage, or burial, in the parish of Burnett, throughout last year.”

The *Bristol Mirror* of Sat 13 Oct 1837 p4 col b reported on a donation of “20s. for the poor of Burnett, in Somersetshire”

From the *Bristol Mercury* of Sat 3 Sep 1842 p1 had an advertisement for the sale by auction at the Commercial Rooms, Bristol by Alderman Whitson’s charity of the advowson of Burnett:

“The Right of Next Presentation to the Rectory of Burnett, in the county of Somerset, which will arise upon the decease of the present Incumbent, now in his 69th Year, and the income of which is estimated at the clear annual sum of £135.

Burnett is beautifully situated in a Sporting Neighbourhood, within 7 miles of each of the Cities of Bristol and Bath, and 1 mile and a half from the Keynsham Station of the Great Western Railway. The population is entirely rural, and amounting to 100.”

The charity retained land at Burnett and a report in 1845 of a monster turnip weighing 23lbs (10kg)

refers to the grower as being a tenant of the charity. In 1846 the charity’s accounts show that it built two cottages at Burnett for an outlay of £100 and donated £1 to the poor of Burnett.

From the *Bristol Mirror* of 3 Sep 1842 p1:

“The manors of Keynsham, Burnett and Winford, (and Backwell-Hill Allotment, with Lands adjoining) are strictly preserved. Any Person Trespassing thereon in pursuit of Game, WITH or WITHOUT a Certificate, will be Prosecuted without further Notice, according to Law.”

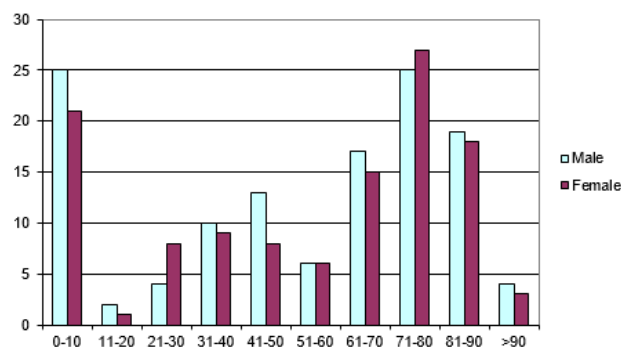
In 1852 the South Midlands Union Railway announced that it was petitioning Parliament for the power to build a railway from Poole to Mangotsfield. This included a long list of parishes that the line was intended to pass through, including: “Hound Street, Stanton Prior, Publloleigh St. Thomas, Pansford, Pansford Publow, Woollard, Compton Dando, Burnet or Burnett, Queen Charlton, Keynsham. . .” (*Bristol Times and Mirror* of Sat 20 Nov 1852 p3).



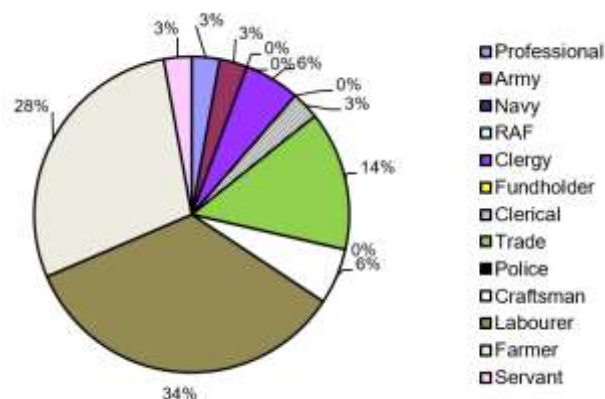
Burnett - Memorial Inscriptions

The Keynsham Poor Law Union encompassed nineteen parishes in Somerset and Gloucestershire and included the parishes of: Keynsham, Brislington, Whitechurch, Queen Charlton, Compton Dando, Marksbury, Priston, Newton St. Loe, Stanton Prior, Corston, Burnett, Salford, Kelston, Northstoke; the population being 7265. (*Bristol Mercury* 6 Mar 1858 p5). The burial register has only two entries where the abode is given as the Keynsham Union workhouse while another entry has St Clement's House which was how the workhouse was renamed. (Such renaming occurred in the 1930s when workhouses were formally abolished being reclassified as 'public assistance institutions', so Clutton Union workhouse became 'Cambrook House' and Bath Union workhouse became 'Frome Road House'. The workhouse system ceased with the National Assistance Act 1948 which abolished the Elizabethan Poor Laws of 1597 and 1601.)

The parish merged with Compton Dando in 1933. It is now in the benefice of Keynsham which also includes Queen Charlton.



The age profile has about 20% aged under 11 and 40% aged over 70.



For the few dozen entries where occupations have been determined, the profile is that of a predominantly farming community.

A previous survey was carried out circa 1997 and, in the porch, is a framed map at a scale of 1:100. To avoid confusion, the numbering system used in that survey has been retained with additions starting at 101 for those memorials after that time.

The survey documented here took place in May 2020 (during a time when it was permitted to travel locally) with visits to the church in May 2021 (after the end of the 3rd lockdown) and Jul 2021 (after the so-called 'Freedom Day').

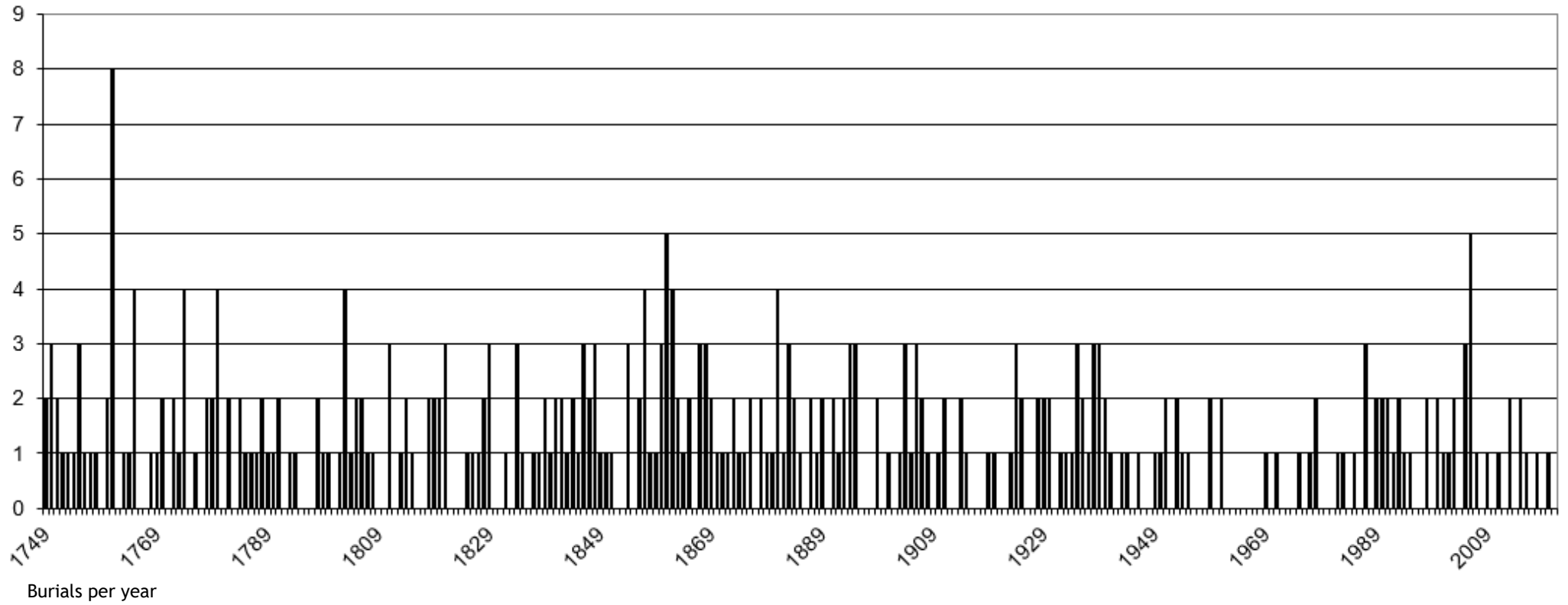

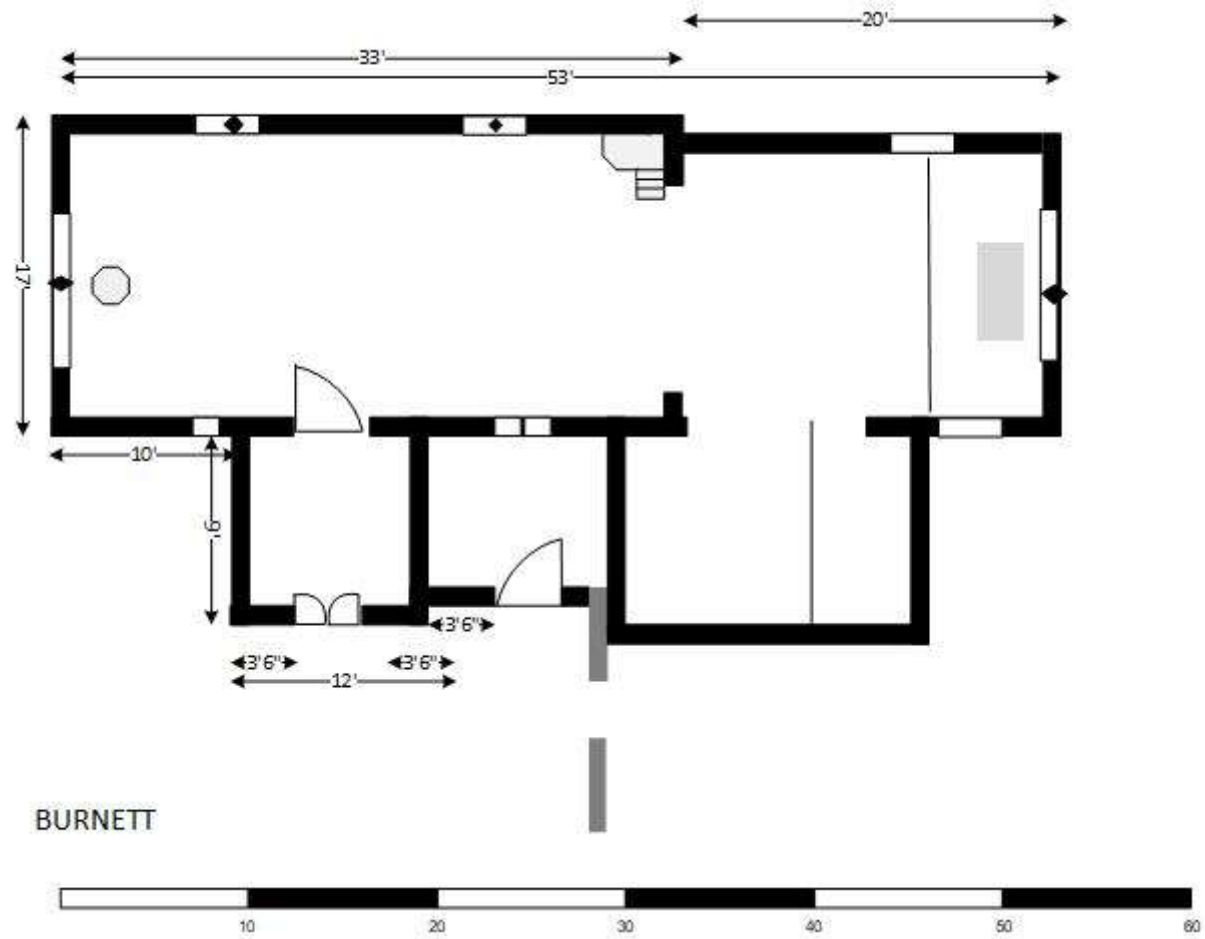
