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## Brief history

By 1790 the old Bathwick parish church, dedicated to St Mary, was already hundreds of years old and in a poor state of repair. It was demolished in 1818 and only a small section of the churchyard that once surrounded it survives today.

The original church was small and its tower end stood near what is now the eastern end of the large body of St John the Baptist Church which was first built in 1861 but enlarged in 1871. The surviving section of the old churchyard now forms part of St John's Churchyard, Bathwick Street, although most burials from St John's Church took place in the St Mary the Virgin Churchyard, Smallcombe, which opened four years previously in 1856.

At the end of the 18<sup>th</sup> Century lack of burial space became a serious concern in the parish and in 1808 the Vestry committee then purchased land adjacent to the old Bathwick churchyard as additional burying-ground. This extra ground, now known as the old St Mary's Churchyard, Henrietta Road, opened in 1809 and from burial records we know that the first internment there was John Bagshaw, the (first) landlord of the Pulteney Arms.

As the old church was pulled down some materials salvaged were used to construct the mortuary chapel (now a ruin). The old chancel arch was rebuilt into its structure and some of the memorials were also moved there. The architect was John Pinch and he, his wife and two sons are buried in a tomb beneath the centre of the chapel's east end exterior wall. From 1818 until the new Bathwick parish church was operational the chapel was used for both funerals and baptisms but was not licensed for marriages, these took place at St Michael's Church, Broad Street, Bath.

When the new St Mary the Virgin Churchyard opened at Smallcombe in 1856 the old churchyard in Henrietta Road, by then almost full and closed to new burials, gradually became unused and eventually inaccessible to the general public. However during the years that it was in use thousands of people were buried there, from the rich and titled to paupers, from

employers to servants and so historically a whole community are therefore represented in this place. Today, apart from three tablets on the north-east exterior wall, none of the memorials from the old church which were originally re-sited on the interior and exterior walls of the mortuary chapel have survived. In the graveyard only a small proportion of tombs and tombstones have withstood the ravages of time, the rest being either broken or illegible. Many of the parish poor had no memorial and are thought to have been buried in the far south-west corner of the churchyard where there are no stones. Nearby is a Roman coffin unearthed in Bathwick in 1819 and placed in the wall when it was rebuilt in 1852.

In 2000 the Rector of Bathwick, the Reverend David Prothero, together with B&NES Council, who are responsible for maintenance, granted members of the Bathwick Local History Society permission to access and record all surviving memorial inscriptions in the old churchyard. Unfortunately due mainly to the overgrown state and the inaccessibility of large sections of the place this project has taken several years to complete. In 2004 the 'Friends of Old St Mary's Churchyard' group was formed and with assistance from B&NES Council Parks & Cemeteries department shrub clearance and restoration commenced. In September 2006 a churchyard trail was completed and the old St Mary's Churchyard was reopened to the public.

The memorial tablets and windows in the Bathwick churches also tell their stories and many are linked to people buried in the Bathwick Churchyards.

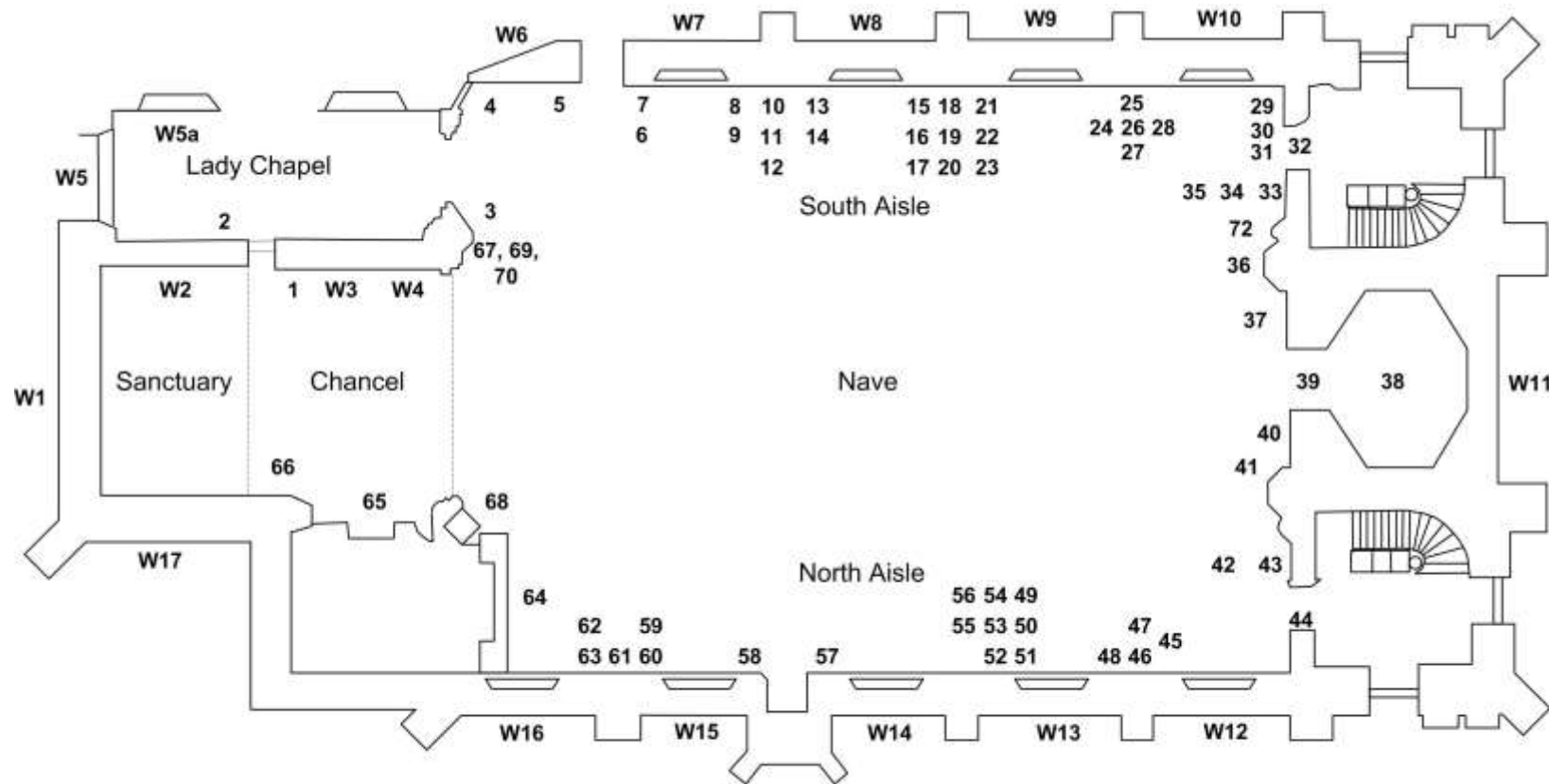

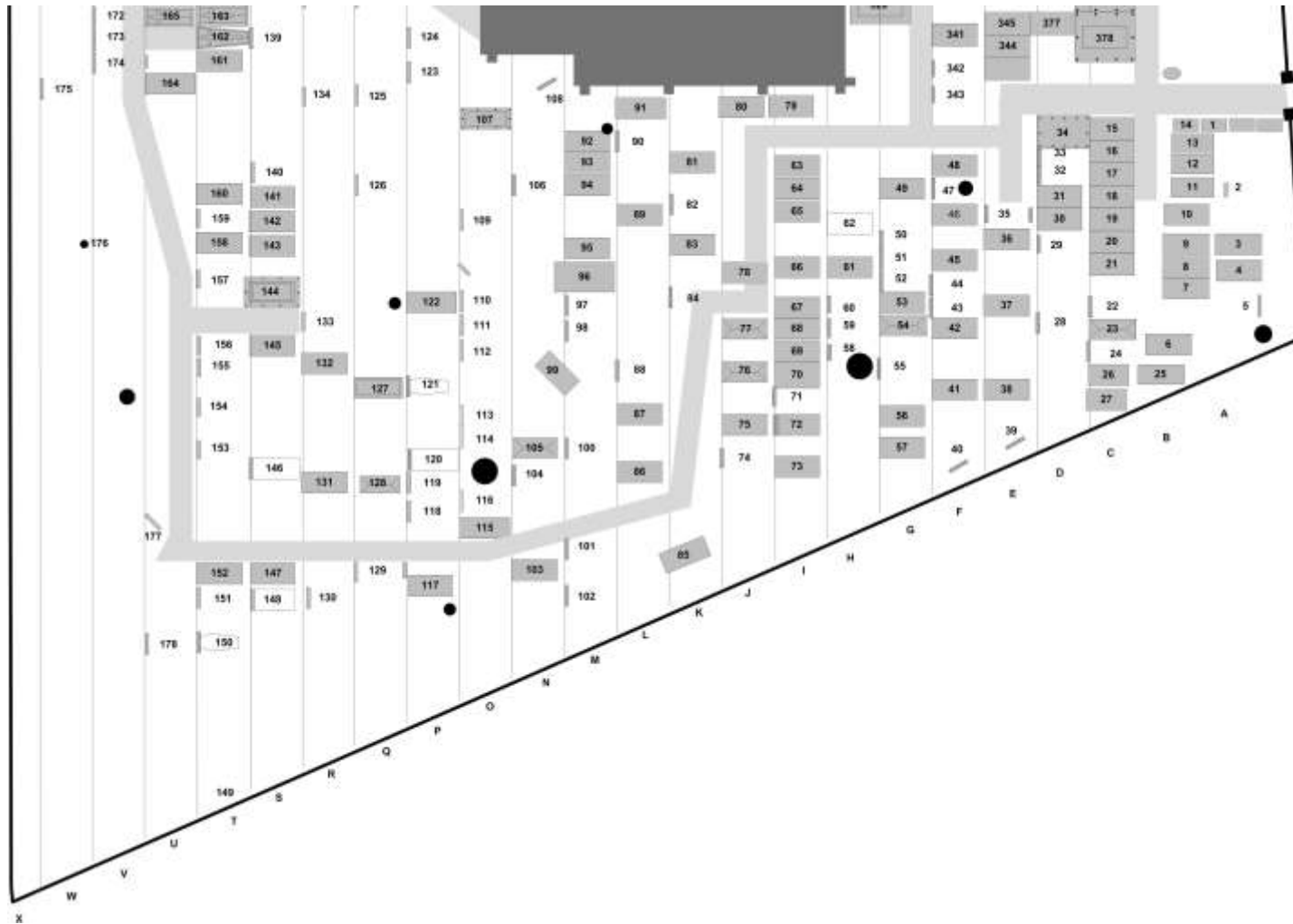


Figure 4 Plan of the southern side of the churchyard

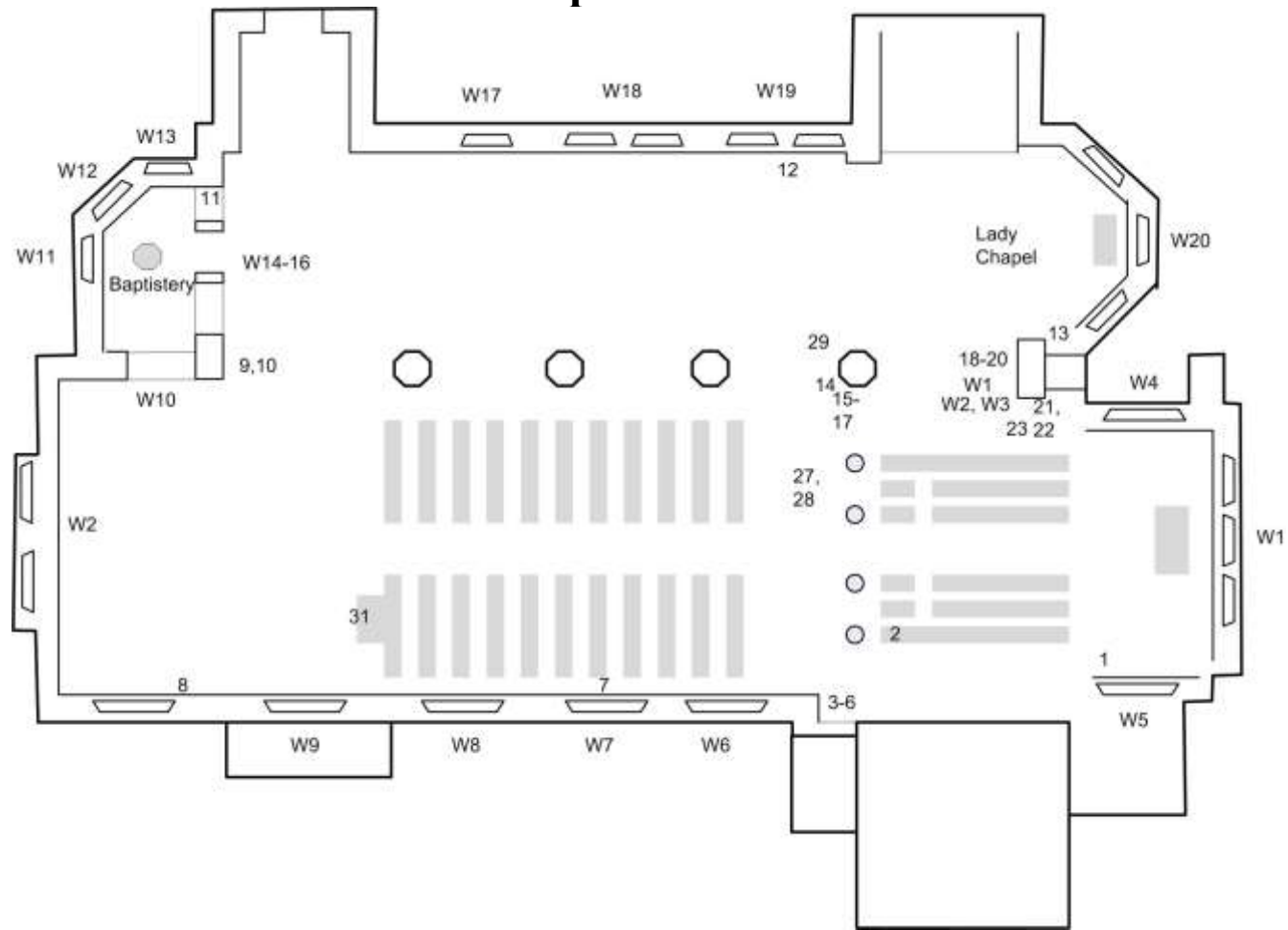


Figure 6 Plan of the Church showing the locations of memorial plaques and windows
