## Introduction



This document contains transcriptions of inscriptions on memorials at St Peter's church, Englishcombe near Bath.

From *Rambles About Bath and Its Neighbourhood* by R E Peach (6th edition 1876) p271:

Here stood one of [the De Gournay] baronial castles; but Sir Thomas de Gournay being attainted for the murder of King Edward II., Englishcombe, with his other estates, was confiscated

and bestowed on the Duchy of Cornwall, the Prince of Wales, in right of the said Duchy, being lord of the manor.

The Church is pleasantly situated on the brow of a hill, and presents a contrast to those which we have lately described, in having a central embattled tower, with pinnacles. The font is Norman, and square. On the north side of the tower, which contains five bells, are two finely preserved zigzag arches. The west window is of the decorated period, and contains stained glass. There are four shields in the mouldings: one of the Abbey of Bath; another depicting a bugle horn; the third a bow; and the fourth a quiver of arrows. In the porch is a small decorated canopy, and near the altar a piscina. The south chapel has a square-headed decorated window, and on the wall between it and the nave is a figure of an angel supporting a coat-of-arms. Above is a window divided into two compartments, which contains some ancient stained glass. The church was thoroughly repaired in 1840, when sixty additional sittings were obtained. In the graveyard is a decaying recumbent effigy, which probably once occupied an altar-tomb in the chapel.

The church contains the remains of a stone coffin - presumable the 'recumbent effigy' - which the histories suggest dates from the 13<sup>th</sup> century. From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 23 Jul 1840 p3;

INTERESTING DISCOVERY.—During the early part of last week, as some workmen were employed in digging and levelling the floor of Englishcombe church, with a view to re-pewing it, they discovered, close to the spot where the pulpit stood, and partly embedded in the foundation-wall, a large coffin, the lid composed of a single stone, on which was carved a recumbent figure, with hands crossed in the attitude of prayer, and enveloped in a rude representation of a gown or drapery. The coffin contained a skeleton on perfect preservation, the back part of the skull resting in a cavity formed at the bottom of the coffin to receive it. They also, in digging a drain outside the edifice, at a depth considerably below the foundation, uncovered several similar stone coffins, the contents of which time and

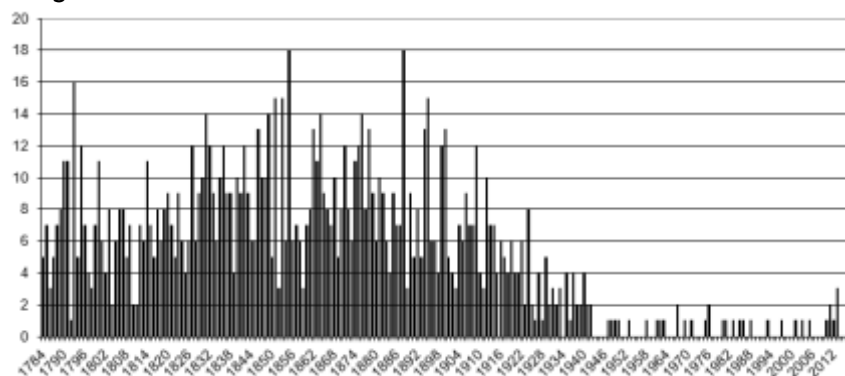
damp had converted to dust. The inference seems to be that the present church has been erected on the site of some ecclesiastical edifice existing at a remote period on the same spot. Stone coffins have, from time to time, in the memory of persons now living, been discovered in this parish during the last thirty-five years, in draining a field belonging to John Cottle, Esq., of Hatfield-place.

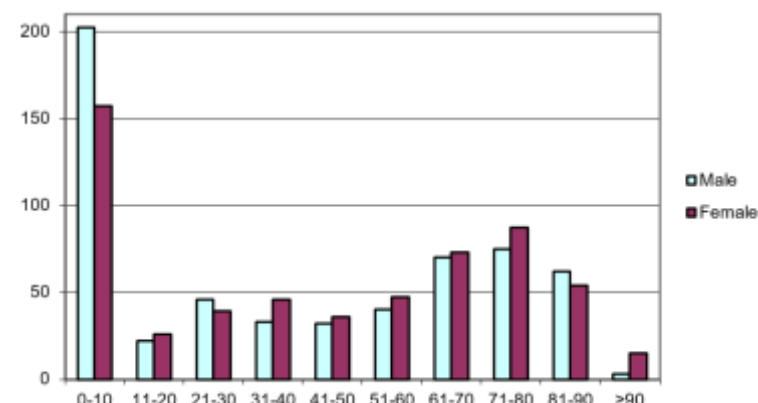
21. On the W. buttress of the S. transept there is what seem to be a dial. It is 6 feet 6 inches above the ground, the noonline is about 3 inches in length, and the stylehole, which is small and shallow, is about  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch in depth and  $\frac{3}{16}$  of an inch in diameter. The aspect is S. by  $10^{\circ}$  E. Jun 3d, 1913.

The dial is faint, the lines weak, and its is a doubtful one, as it is difficult to see how the central hole could have held a style. There is a good deal of ivy on the church which prevents a thorough examination of the dial being made.



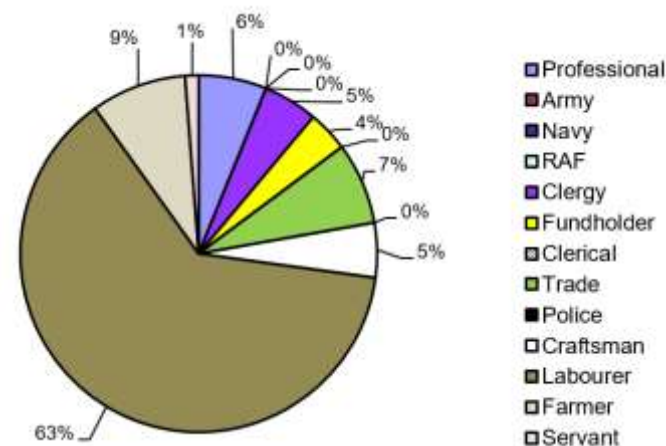
Number of burials per year

In the period from 1784 to present there have been 1,182 burials. The number of burials per year was between 6 and 10 during the 19th century, this decreasing over the next 50 years to less than one per year. The churchyard is now 'closed' with only the burial of cremated remains outside the eastern end of the church.



Age profile

The age profile has 30% aged under 11 and 25% aged over 70.



Occupation profile

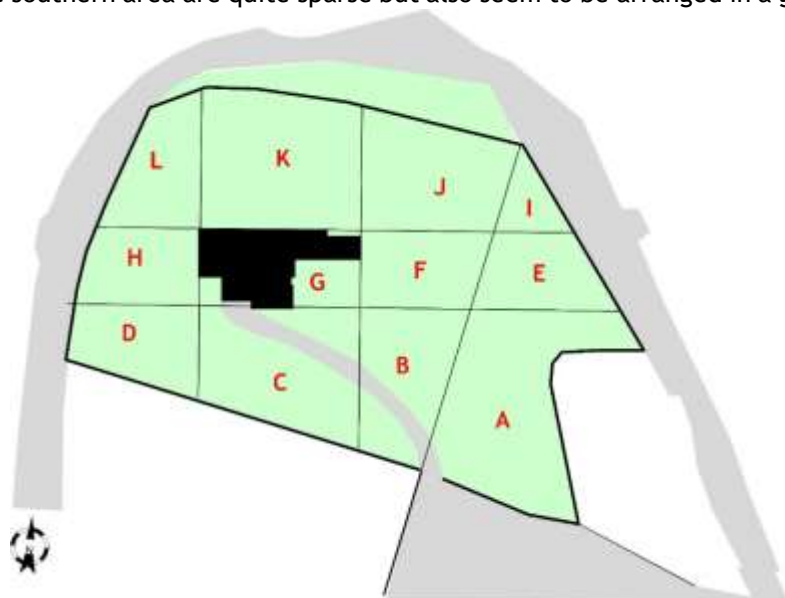
From census entries for about 10% of those buried, the occupational profile reflects the farm-based economy although there are some who worked in the nearby stone quarries.

The country of birth has been established for about a quarter of those buried, mainly in the 19<sup>th</sup> century; this is almost exclusively England.

### Overall Layout

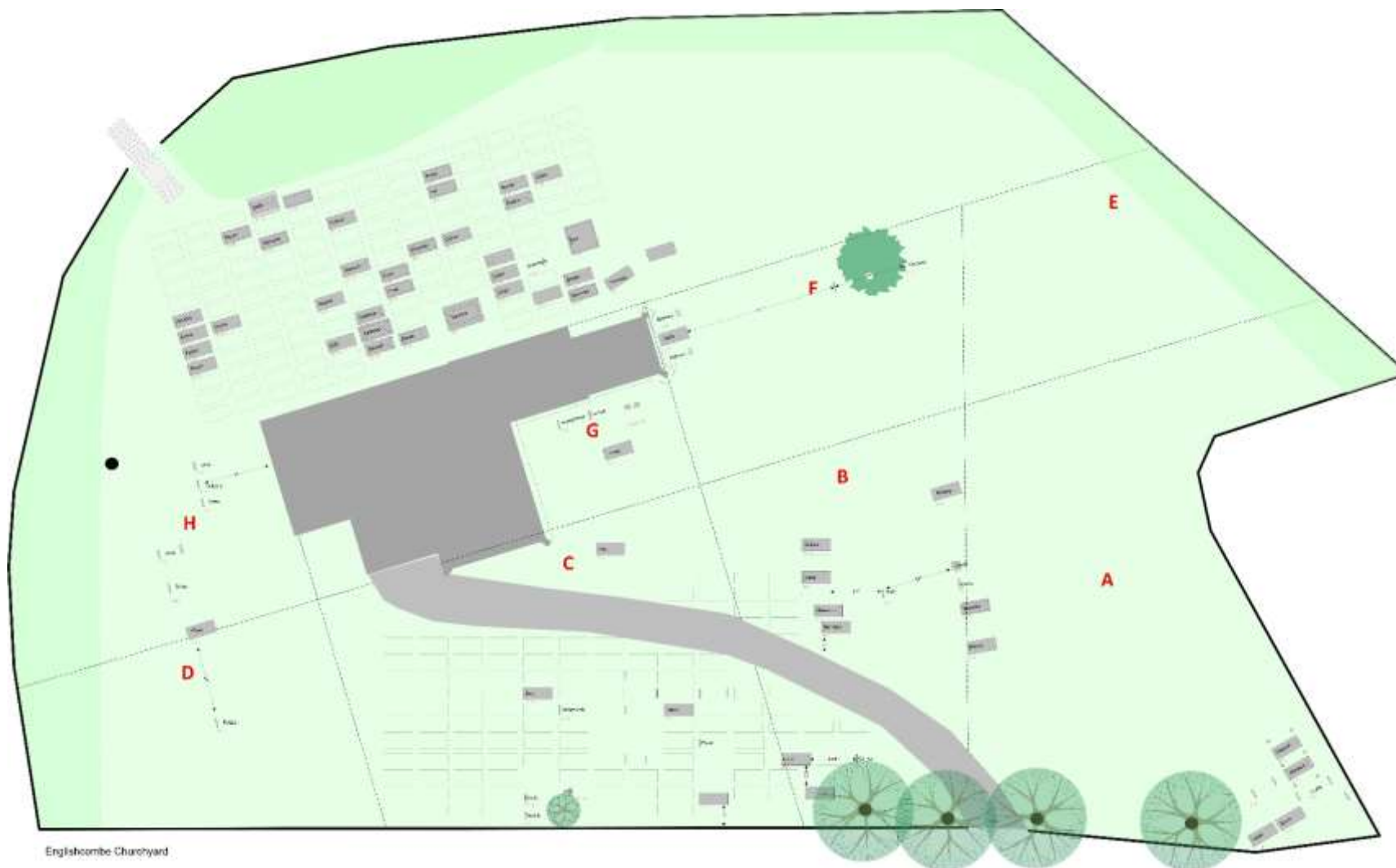
The churchyard is on all four sides of the church. A survey was started out in about 2002 but never completed. No sexton's book describing who is buried where seems to have survived. In the absence of this the original survey divided the churchyard into arbitrary areas A-L with numbers then assigned to the surviving memorials.

The northern side of the churchyard had the graves arranged in a grid aligned with the line of the northern wall of the church. The graves in the southern area are quite sparse but also seem to be arranged in a grid.

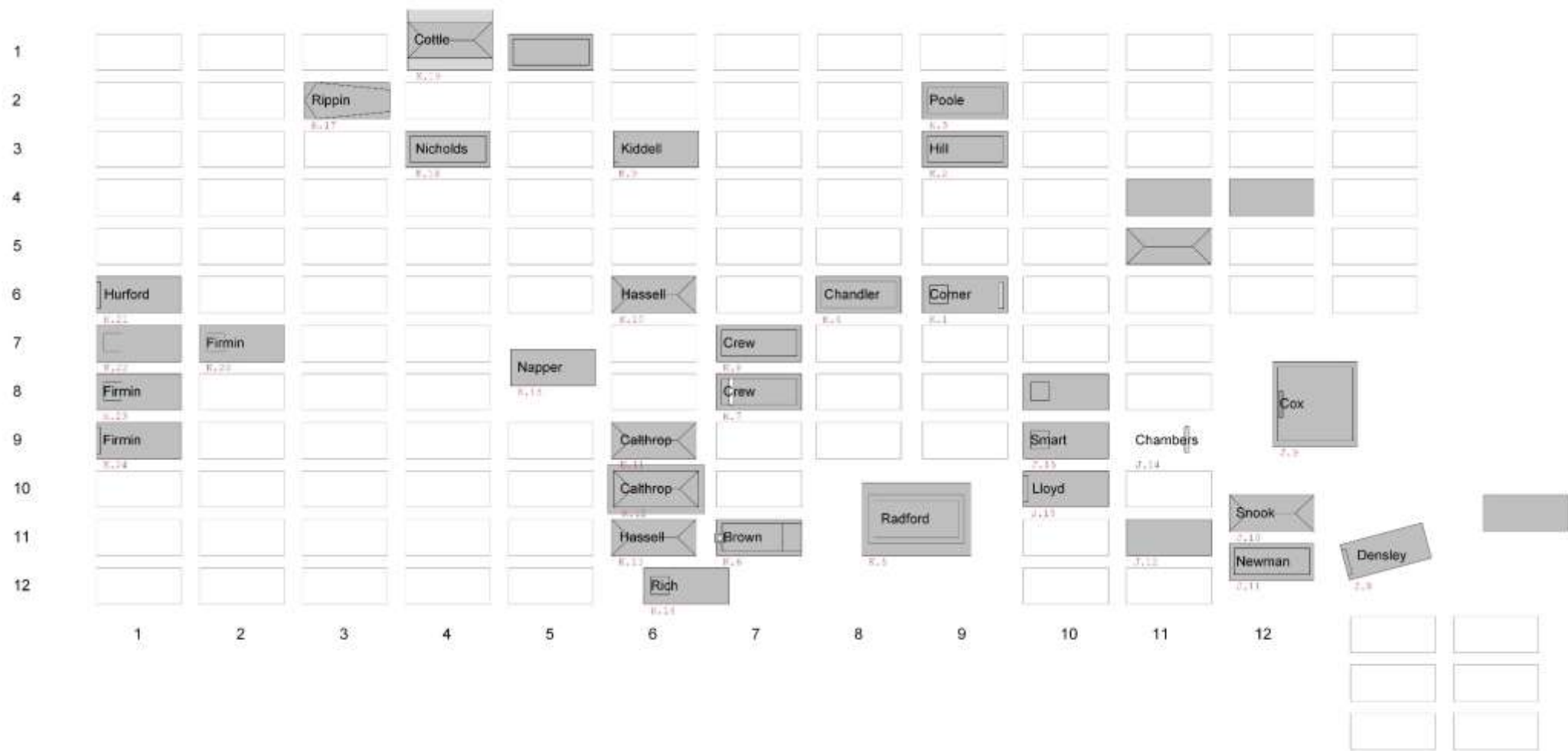

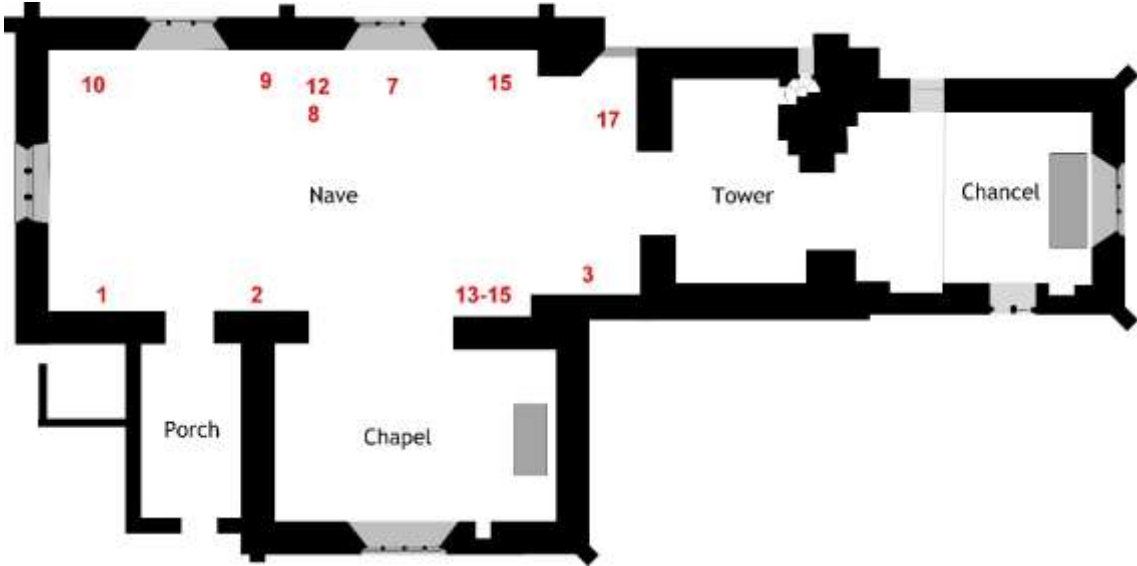
