Introduction



The church of the Blessed Virgin Mary

From the *Imperial Gazetteer of England and Wales 1870-72* by John Marius Wilson:

EMBORROW, or Emborough, a parish in Shepton Mallet district, Somerset; under the Mendip hills, 5 miles NE of Wells r. station. It includes the tything of Whitnell. Post town, Chewton-Mendip, under Bath. Acres, 2,039. Real property, £1,737. Pop., 178. Houses, 41. The living is a p. curacy, annexed to the vicarage of Chewton-Mendip, in the diocese of Bath and Wells. The church is small.

It is remarkable how great a change has the last half-century taken place in the attitude of the public towards the many ancient objects contained in the parish churches of the country districts. There was time, quite within living memory; when to have been interested in such antiquities would have been regarded as a mark of eccentricity. But nowadays all this is changed, and the country parishes have been favoured with the increasing attentions both of the ordinary tourist and of many able writers. Especially is attention quickened when local discoveries throw light on the spirit and method of the old-time inhabitants, even if the subject is not quite as engrossing as the latest excavations in Egypt.

Some discoveries have recently been made during restorations to the fabric of

Emborough Church. Emborough, it may be stated, is small parish 5½ miles north-east of Wells, and 1½ miles from Binegar Station, on the Somerset and Dorset Railway. It contains only 150 inhabitants, and beyond the church there is not very much to attract the sightseer. The church itself, a handsome little building in the Early English style, could, until a few months ago, boast only two features of interest, a Norman font of rude workmanship, and a 14th century sanctus bell the tower. Kelly describes it as comprising "a chancel, nave of three bays, transepts, and embattled central tower." Prior to 1886, however, the building had not been systematically repaired since the 15th century, but that year the condition of the stonework made imperative that extensive restorations should be carried out. Unfortunately, St. Mary's was only partially renovated on that occasion, and the matter did not receive attention till just before the outbreak of the great war, when a sum of money was set aside for the purpose by private benefactions. The period of hostilities, of course, necessitated further delay, and it was September last that the whole structure was carefully overhauled.

Investigation proved that the decay was even greater than had been imagined. The stone materials were in many places defective, while almost all the woodwork crumbled at the touch owing to dry rot and the attentions of the death-watch beetle which is the inveterate enemy of all large buildings. One piece of timber with a lion's head carved on it simply melted away when handled, and the beams in the roof

were so rotten that when a workman trod on them they collapsed and precipitated him into the church! The bell wheels were found to be in a parlous condition, and when the big bell was examined it proved to be cracked. The tale of woe was completed by the discovery that owls and jackdaws had taken up permanent residence in the tower and aisle, leaving behind them, when ousted, eggs, nests, and the dead bodies of their kind.

The process of restoration brought to light several features of the old building which had hitherto escaped notice. Previously, the font was the only relic that could be definitely ascribed to the Norman period, but built into the wall of the tower was found a stone with the chevron pattern carved on it, which left no doubt as to its origin. Apparently the church which was erected next comprised only the present chancel and part of the tower, as shown within the white line in the larger photograph. As it is calculated that there were only six houses in the parish at that remote period, the size the building probably sufficed for parochial needs. When this chancel was examined two ancient windows, formerly hidden beneath plaster and a tangled mass of ivy roots, were revealed. The oldest of these windows is rectangular, and is probably coeval with the foundation of the church.

Emborough, in common with the other villages of the district, seems once to have been a mining outpost, and it was, perhaps, to accommodate the influx of miners that St. Mary's was enlarged by the addition of a nave and north aisle. Building material must have been scarce in those days, for the aisle is constructed of clay. The restorers brought to light in it another ancient window, and, what is quite

novelty, the buttress outside was found to rest a rounded foundation-stone. The rood-loft stairs were laid bare from under an accumulation of plaster and stones, and the corbel, on which the rood beam reposed, was found on the south wall. Finally, the removal a large stone revealed a piscina in the south wall of the chancel. The drain outside yielded, on investigation, several decorated stones, which had evidently been cast away by the masons. Two or three of them bore an incised cross.

It is expected that the restorations now in hand will be completed about two months' time. Among sundry other renovations, a new roof is to be put on, together with a staircase and floor to the gallery. The tower is to have another floor and new oak beams. When all is finished, it is confidently anticipated that Emborough Church will have as trim an appearance as any such building in the county, together with as complete a presentment of its old-time mediaeval glories

The caption to the main picture highlights that an unusual feature is that the tower is at the eastern rather than the western end of the church.

EMBOROUGH

PARISH CHURCH RESTORATION.

It was during the summer of 1924 that the Bishop of Bath and Wells conducted a service of joy and thanksgiving for the restoration of Emborough Church which had been in a bad state of dis-repair, having had the attentions of the death watch beetle. Once again the old church is badly in need of extensive repair and redecoration and of course, Emborough is determined to see that the work is carried out. Money is not so easy to find as it was 1923, but, says the Vicar, the Rev. K. A. Latter, "I feel sure that the money needed can be found if we set our minds to the job and all pull together." First function to be organised in aid of the restoration fund will be fete and gymkhana during September.

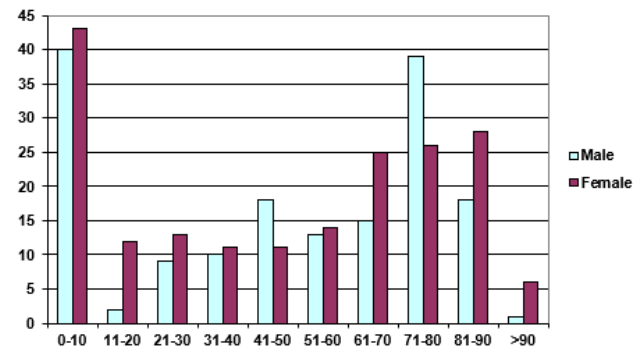
Later that year it was reported that lead had been stolen from the roof (*Shepton Mallet Journal* Fri 27 Jul 1951 p1). Various functions such as fetes and

gymkhanas held at Old Down continued to raise money for the restoration fund. By 1954 the debt for the restoration had all but been cleared (*Central Somerset Gazette* Fri 10 Sep 1954 p7).



The church has been designated Grade II* by Historic England. It is in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust having been declared redundant in 1978.

In 2021 the church had an entry at a website for locations for 'champing', that is, camping in a church.



The age profile has 23% aged under 11 and 33% aged over 70.

Previous Survey

The Gravestone Photographic Resource has 56 grave and 146 person records and date from early 2014. There is no map. The names are those from the memorials are not necessarily the full names as they appear in the burial register and there are various names which have no corresponding entry in the burial register. A reconciliation between its entries and those in the burial register has found several where the year of burial is incorrect.

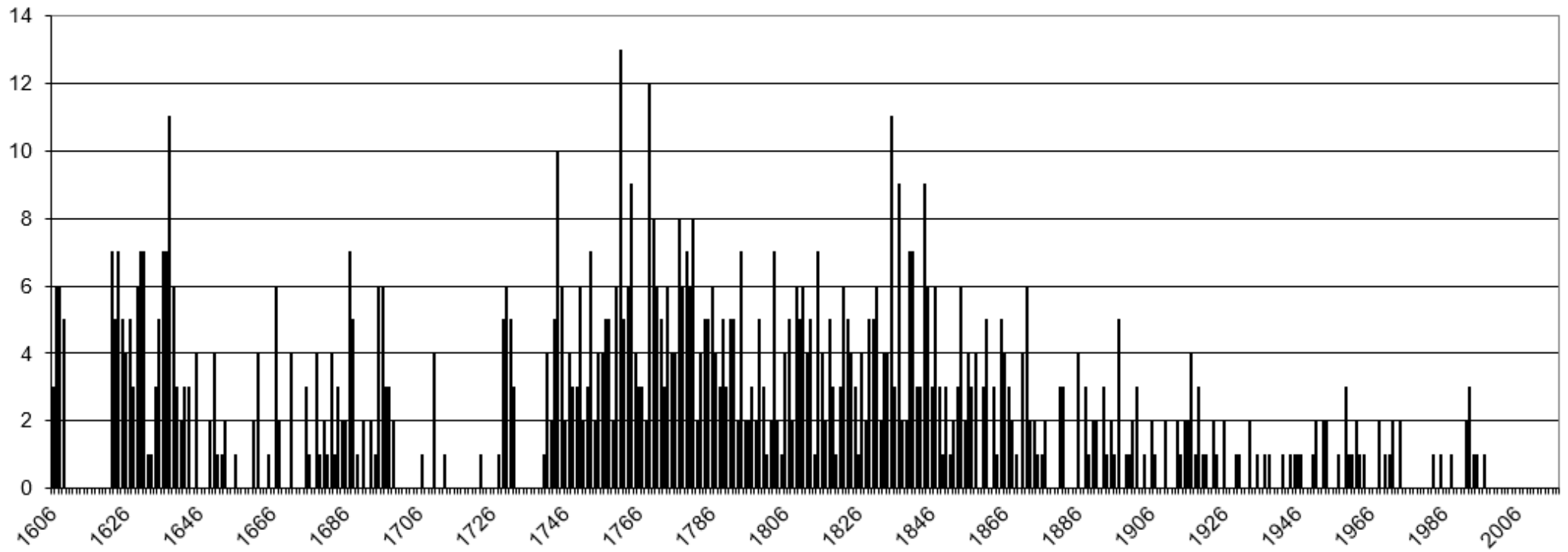

The register for 1569-1732 has the usual vagaries of spelling and in some cases illegible entries. The writing becomes more 'modern' around 1700.

In 1775 there is a change in hand and the spelling deteriorates leading to anomalous spellings of forenames, surnames and parishes. As an example 'Samuel Gould' becomes 'Sammul Guld'. Numbering of entries start in 1784 but serves only to count the number per year. 'Pauper' is rendered as 'popper' in the 1790s when it was necessary to discount entries for paupers for tax purposes. The spelling improves in 1799 although 'Elizebeth' and 'Guld' persist.

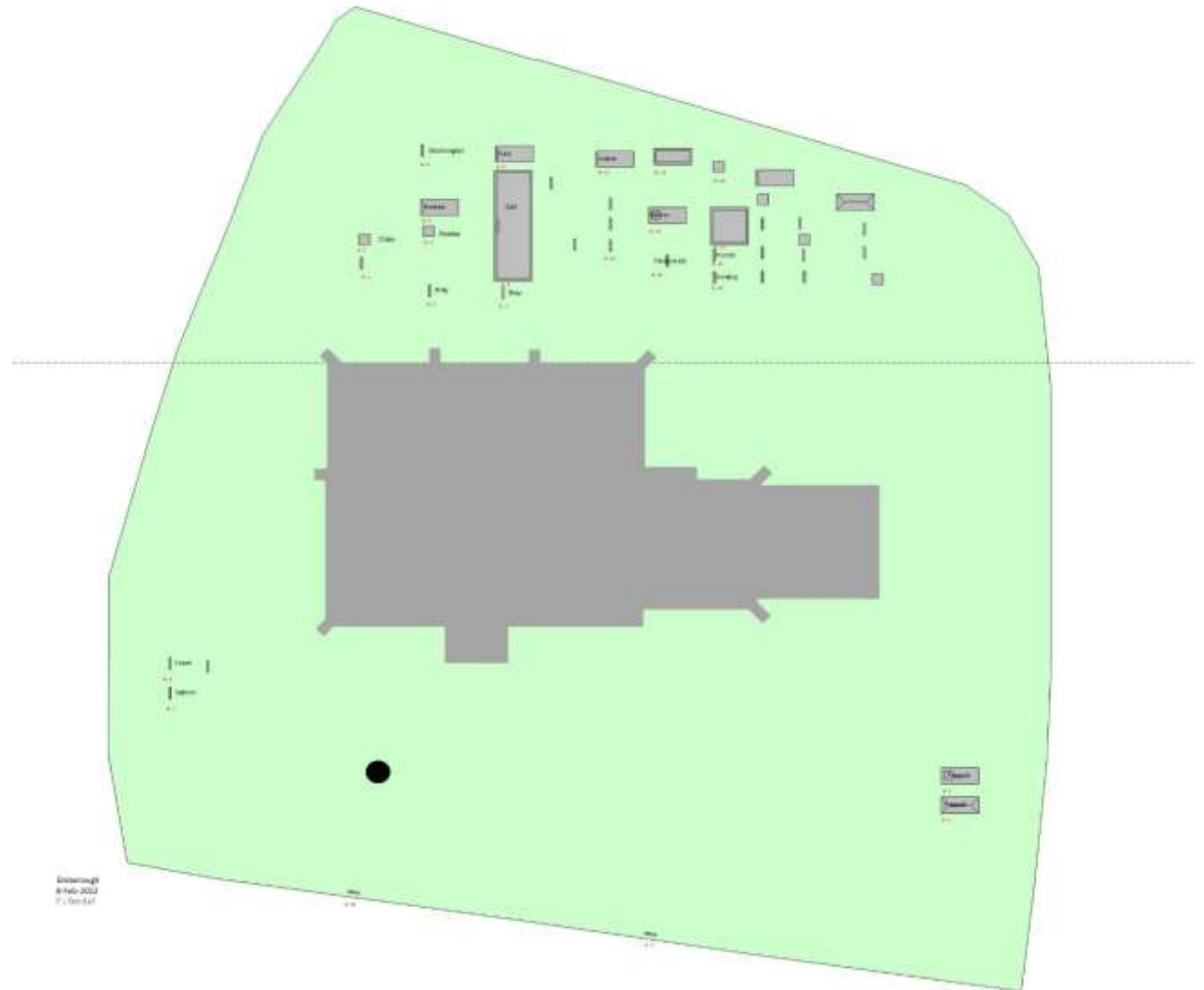
Emborough - Memorial Inscriptions

Internal Memorials

From John Collinson's *History and Antiquities of the County of Somerset*, 1791, vol 2, p 136:

On the south side of the chancel are two small mural monuments of stone, the first of which is inscribed,- "Under lyes the body of Elizabeth wife of John Hippisley, gent. who died October 14, 1793 And also the bodies of three of their children, John, Elizabeth, and John, who all died in the years 1700 and 1702." Arms: Sable, three mullets between two bendlets or, impaling three battle-axes sable.

On the second monumnet:- "near this place lye the bodies of Mary and John, son and daughter of John Hippisley, gent. John died Mar 12 Mary died March 4"

On the north side of the aile is a mural monument of stone, on which is this inscription "Underneath lies interred the bidy of Ann, daughter of Mr. Robert Hippisley of this parish by Margaret his wife, she died Nov. 8, 1726, aged eight years and eight months.

At the west end of the aile are three old mural monuments of black stone.

On the first is this inscription:- "Near this place lieth the body of Mr. Edward Hippisley, senr who died May 29, 1711, aged 65, Abigail his wife died the 27th of April, 1727. Also of Edward, Richard, and Christoper, three of their children." - Arms: Hippisley, impaling gules, in chief a talbot sable trippant, in base three tiger's heads erased argent.

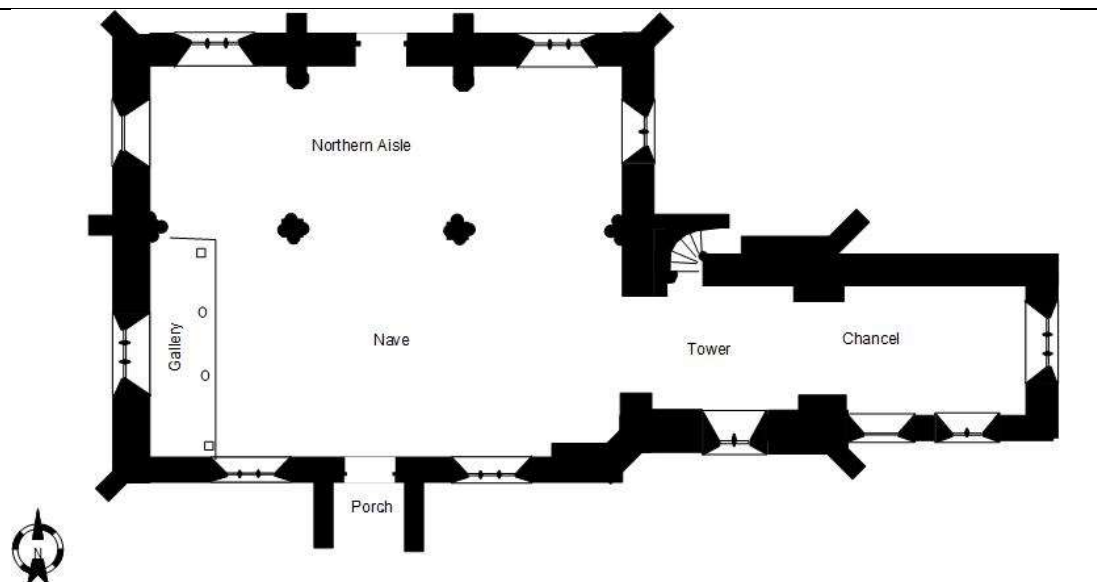
On the second mounment: - "Underneath lis the body of Mary the wife of Mr. Robert Hippisley, senr. She died March 4, 1714, aged 62. Also the body of Hannah Bendel, who died Feb. 12, 1731, aged 66. Robert Hippisley, son of Edward Hippisley, died Aug, 20, 1736, aged 85."

From John Collinson's *History and Antiquities of the County of Somerset*, 1791, vol 2, p 137:

On a flat stone in the north aile: - "Here lyeth the body of Tristram Lane, whi dyed March 6, 1606. Elinor the wife of Tristram Lane, died Aug. 14, A.D. 1642. Also here resteth the bify of Catherine Hippisley, widdow, daughter of Tristram Lane and Elinor his wife, whio died April 26, 1666."

On another stone:- "here lyeth the bidy of Theodore Hippisley, gent. Who died June 11, 1704."



The present state of the wall memorials is that while the black stone memorial is legible the group of three wall memorials on the western wall are in poor condition. At some points they have been covered with white paint as all colour mentioned by Collinson on one of them is missing.



A 19th century memorial has been added since Collinson's time and there is also a Roll of Honour with 17 names.



There are a number of floor memorials in various states of preservation.



The walls also have wooden plaques with 1) the creed 2) the Lord's prayer (This has 'John Bath, Thos Chard Churchwardens 1817') and on two plaques either side of the door 3) the ten commandments.

There is a royal coat of arms. This dates from the Hanoverian period as it has superimposed on the centre in miniature the arms of the Kingdom of Hanover.
