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Introduction



The church of All Saints

The original Norman church was built about 1150. The door on the northern side of the church is Norman work. A plan in the church shows the phases of the development of the church over the centuries.

From the *Frome Times* of Wed 4 Feb 1863 p2:

RE-OPENING OF LULLINGTON CHURCH

The sequestered parish church of Lullington, after having undergone complete restoration and some extension, was re-opened on Monday last by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese. Students of archæology will find few more interesting ecclesiastical buildings in this neighbourhood than the little church of Lullington; and now that within and without its is restored and beautified, the visitor cannot fail to be gratified by its many peculiarities. The building consists of a nave, tower, and chancel, with chantry (a transept it is

called by the restoring architect) on the south side. All these parts give evidence of having been constructed in different ages: the nave being (originally) of the Norman period, the tower of the perpendicular, the chancel of the decorated, and the chantry or transept of the early English and early decorated - and thus embrace the architectural styles from the year 1200 to 1450. A detailed description of the sacred building would occupy more space than we can at present afford, and we shall only notice some of its more remarkable features. The visitor will, doubtless, be first struck by the exquisitely beautiful windows which adorn the church in its renovated state. That at the east end is a beautiful three-light one, and represents the Resurrection of our Lord. On either side the chancel is a window filled with the new figure-glass invented by the makers, Messrs. Lavers and Barraud, of London. The subjects of both these are the Miracles of our Saviour, suitable inscriptions being written beneath each illustration. The principal window was, we understand, chosen by Mrs. Duckworth. The window in the tower is a two-light one, and very appropriately filled with figures of S. Cecilia and King David. It is partly hidden by the organ, and is the gift of the architect. In the chantry or transept are two beautiful memorial windows to members of Mr. Duckworth's family, the subject of one being the "Doctors in The Temple," and of the other "The Good Centurion," and there are other minor lights in different parts of the building. The tower arches, which have been carefully restored (though, as we think, injudiciously coated with a stone-coloured lime-wash) are singular specimens of the transition periods. Perhaps the most noticeable portions of the building is, however, the north doorway, which an exceedingly curious specimen of Norman work, and is one of those figured in

"Britton's Architectural Antiquities." Over the doorway is a niche, in which is a figure of a Deity with a nimbus round the head, and with one hand held up as in the act of blessing those entering the edifice. The principal entrance is on the south side, where there is a porch of the late Perpendicular, with a small west window. The inner doorway is Norman, but quite plain. The arch is filled up with a flat stone, which had a circle in it. In this has now been placed a beautifully designed illuminated brass, which bears the following inscription:—

"Hæc Ecclesia

"Restorat et Extenso

A.D. W.D. 1863."

A doorway opening into the chantry was found during the restoration, and has been replaced. The Font, now placed in the nave, is very interesting. It is circular and of an early Norman date, and bears around it, in Roman letters, the inscription

"Hoc Fontis Sacro Pereunt Delicta Lavacro."

There is an inscription on the edge, but it is too much obliterated to decipher. Upon the edge also appear the marks of a cover hinge with a staple for fastening. During the repairs a stone coffin cover in an excellent state of preservation was discovered. An ornamental cross of great beauty is sculptured upon it, with an extended hand, two fingers of which rest on the upper part of the cross, as in the act of blessing. This has been placed in the wall of the vestry- a very injudicious situation, we think. A more appropriate place would be in the church itself, as it is not unlikely that the interesting relic covered the remains of the founder of the sacred edifice. The work of restoration has been carried out by Mr. Jones, of Bradford-on-Avon, in a very efficient manner. The west end has been lengthened, and the old decayed pews have given place to pen benches.

The warning apparatus is very complete. The architect of Mr. T. H. Wyatt, of Wilton, the Salisbury diocesan architect; and the entire expense has been defrayed by William Duckworth, Esq., of Orchard Leigh, the patron of the living. Even from our brief and imperfect description it will be seen that the work of restoration has been carefully performed, and the present beautiful appearance of the little church is worthy of the munificent expenditure which has been made. The organ, which is by Hill and Son, of London, and placed in the tower, is a very efficient instrument of the Scudamoe pattern.

Loligstone is mentioned in the Domesday Survey of Somerset, and was granted by the Norman invader to the Bishop of Coutances; afterwards the Manor with the advowson of the Church was conferred on the Priory of Longleat. At the dissolution of that Priory by Henry VIII, it was granted to John, Prior of a Carthusian Monastery, at Hinton, about ten miles off. The succeeding Prior ceded it to the King, who, in 1541 gave it to the Earl of Hertford; he sold it in 1542 with the Longleat estate to Sir John Thynne; it has now passed into the hands of William Duckworth, Esq., the proprietor of the neighbouring domain of Orchard Leigh.

After Divine service, the Bishop and Clergy proceeded to the burial-ground, to which an addition has been made. The consecration was made in the usual form by his Lordship. In the new ground is a spacious vault designed for the interment of the members of the Duckworth family.

Reports of the reopening also appeared in various other newspapers including the *Bristol Daily Post* of Fri 6 Feb 1863 p4.

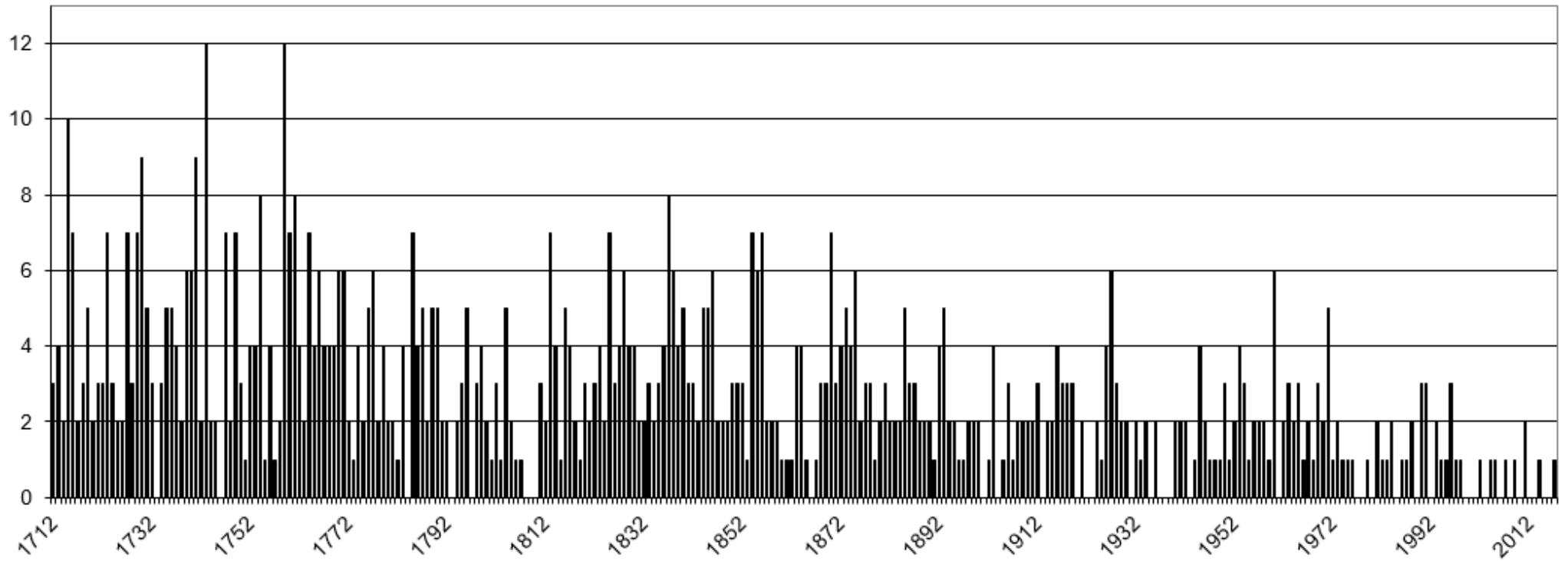
The register from 2005 is with the parish.

In the 1760s the clerk clearly had a problem spelling so 'Alice' appears as 'Ales', 'Grace' as 'Gras' and 'Yerbury' as 'Yarbury'. Prior to 1813 ages are only present for a few (9) entries, usually when greater than 70.



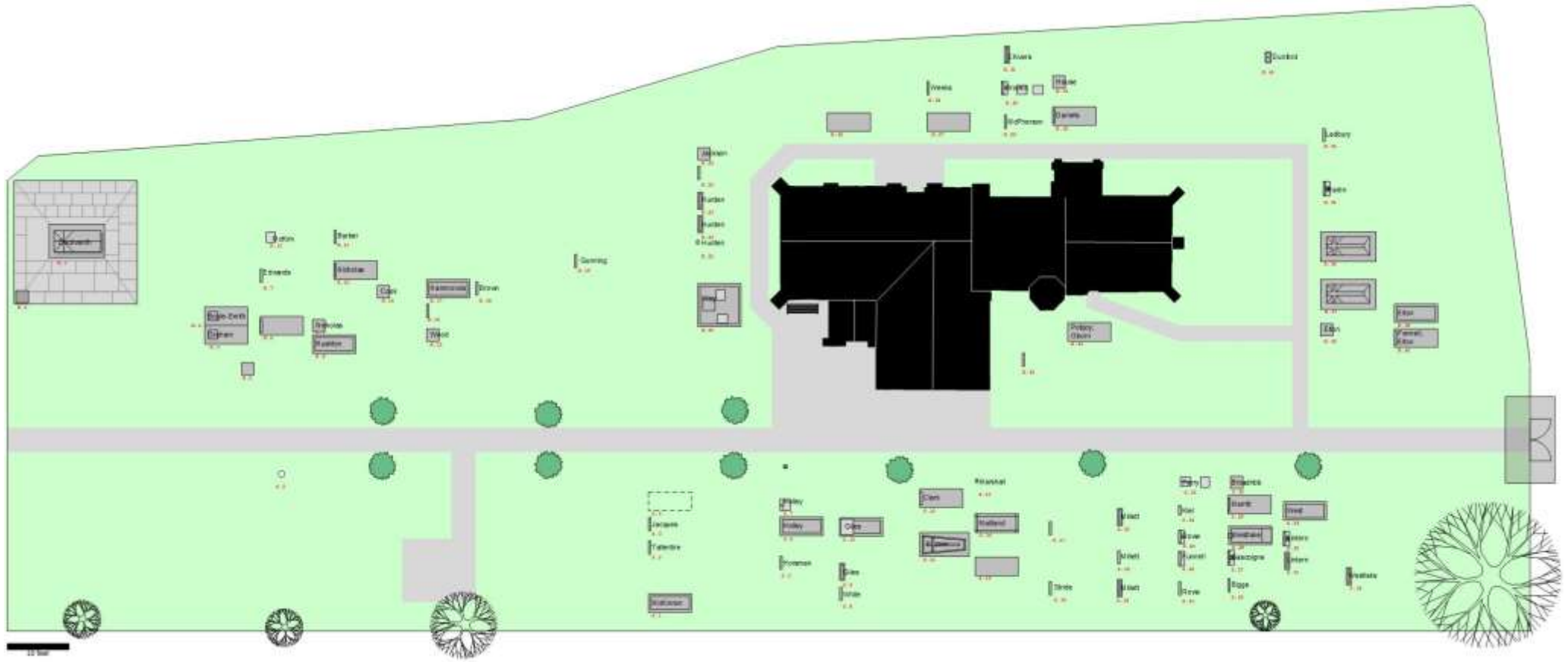

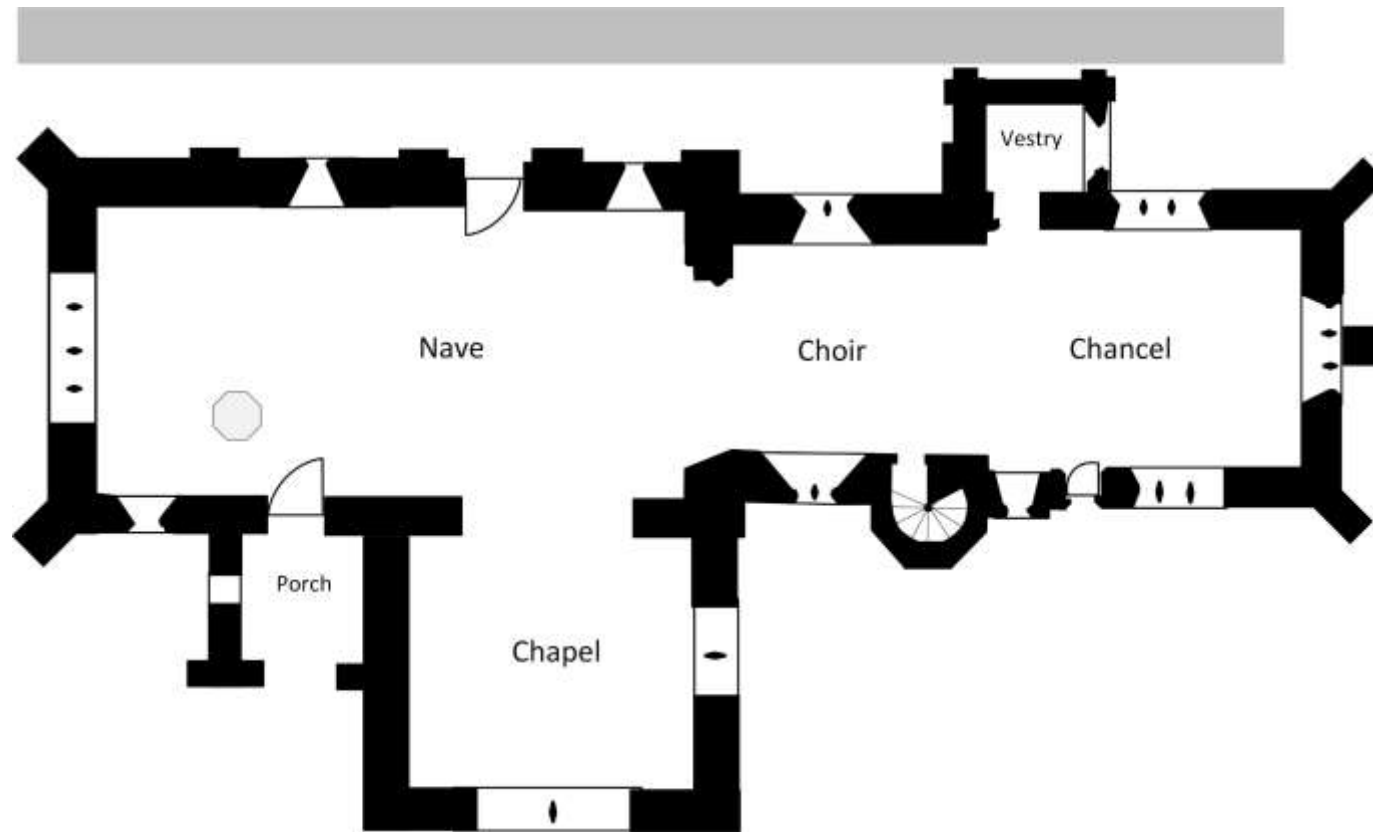
