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## Introduction

This volume contains transcriptions of inscriptions on memorials at the church of at Newton St Loe near Bath. It is based on carrying out a survey and reconciling the information on the memorials with the entries in the burial registers.

The original burial registers are held by Somerset Archive and Heritage Centre and are:

D:\new.s.\2\1\1	Baptisms, marriages and burials 1538-1719

The equivalent set of microfiches exist at Bath Record Office but end abruptly with entry 776 dated 25 Mar 1888, when typically registers have 400 entries or multiples thereof. The missing entries have been obtained from the Somerset Archive and Heritage Centre.

There is also a typewritten transcript for the period 1698-1843.

The burial registers from 1890 until present have been transcribed.

A curiosity is that there are some commentaries from someone's personal knowledge such as the burial of the rector John Wood on 19 Nov 1820 which has "The Funeral was very mean and shabby and was reported no shroud" and for James Mitchell, buried on 1 Mar 1827 "Run over by a coach. N.B. The Coach was driven by Thos Hawkins."

From the burial register in 1791 after the entry for the burial of Edward Ellicott on 13 Feb 1791: A Dispute having arisen between the Rector and Church Warden on Account of the Church Wardens demanding "2.2s in Consequence of an Order of Agreement of a Vestry held 13 years since, for the purpose of raising the old Fine of 6/8 for Breaking

the Ground, for burying Strangers in the Church, the Rector claiming £5.5s as his own Fee, deducting only 6/8 which would pay the Church Warden out of it as the old accustomed Fee on the Ground of the Church being his Freehold. WHEREUPON the Churchwarden on hearing the Mutes attending Mr Ellicott's corpse opening the Church Door, descended from the Gallery and told them to desist for that the Corps should not be brought into the Church for Burial till he had received the Two Guineas of Mr Plura or that he would promise Payment of it. The Rector (Sermon being concluded) went to the Church Warden and after much Altercation between him and the Church Warden and Pleura (the Undertaker) the Two Guineas was paid by the Undertaker to the Church Warden and the Corps was interred. The Rector was 11 minutes absent from his seat.

After the entries for Charles Combs, aged 76, a pauper, buried on 8 Mar 1792, and Alexander Cole, aged 68, on 11 Mar 1792: "He being at the Burial of the above Combs was asked to help carry the corps to the Grave, he replied, he could not for he was taken ill, and immediately became speech less and insensible, and continued to be so until it was out 12 o'clock at Night and then he died, not having token or shewn any signs of sensibility from the Time he was taken ill till he died.

Against the entry for Elizabeth Perry, relict of Richard, of Charlcombe, buried on 27 Jul 1792: "She was the last of the race of English Dames. The married women are all metamorphosed into Ladies and the Farmers' daughters into Misses."

The information from the memorials along with census entries have been used to supplement the information from the burial registers. For those entries for which an occupation has been found the following diagram shows the different categories.

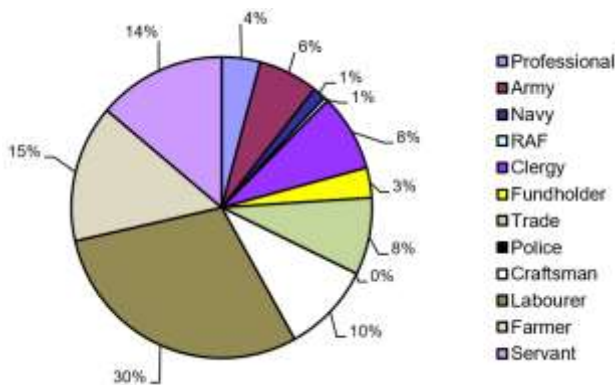
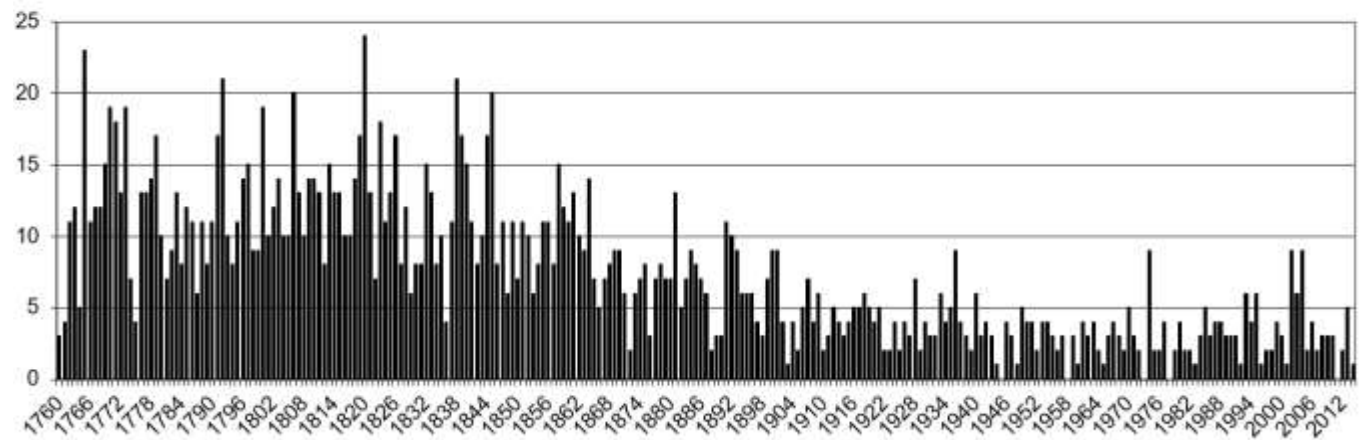

The number of burials per year, about 10 per year in the 1700s until the 1850s, is now less than 5 per year and mainly the burial of ashes.

## Maps

The graveyard is on all four sides of the church. The gate from Church Street leads to a path with, on this southern side, a series of memorials and the war memorial. At the western end are a group of cremation plaques. Past this is a gate into the adjacent field.

The western section is arranged in about six rows and has another section of cremation plaques close to the church.

The northern section is mostly under trees and, as elsewhere is the graveyard, the graves are orientated east-west. The northern part of this section has bushes which limit accessibility to some memorials. Some memorials are surrounded by metal railings which can also limit access.

The numbering system for the graves has used that based on the work carried out by Gerry Hines. His map is in the church.

The arrangement of the cremation plots are given in the relevant sections of the document.

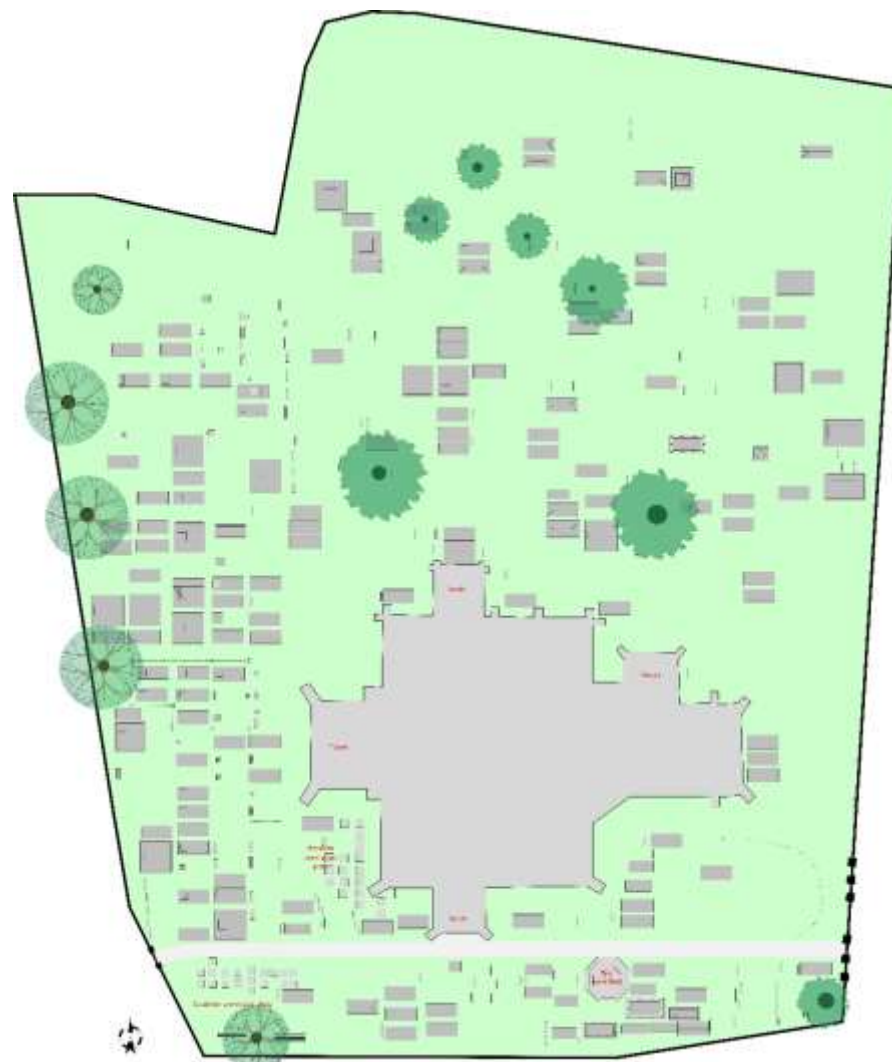
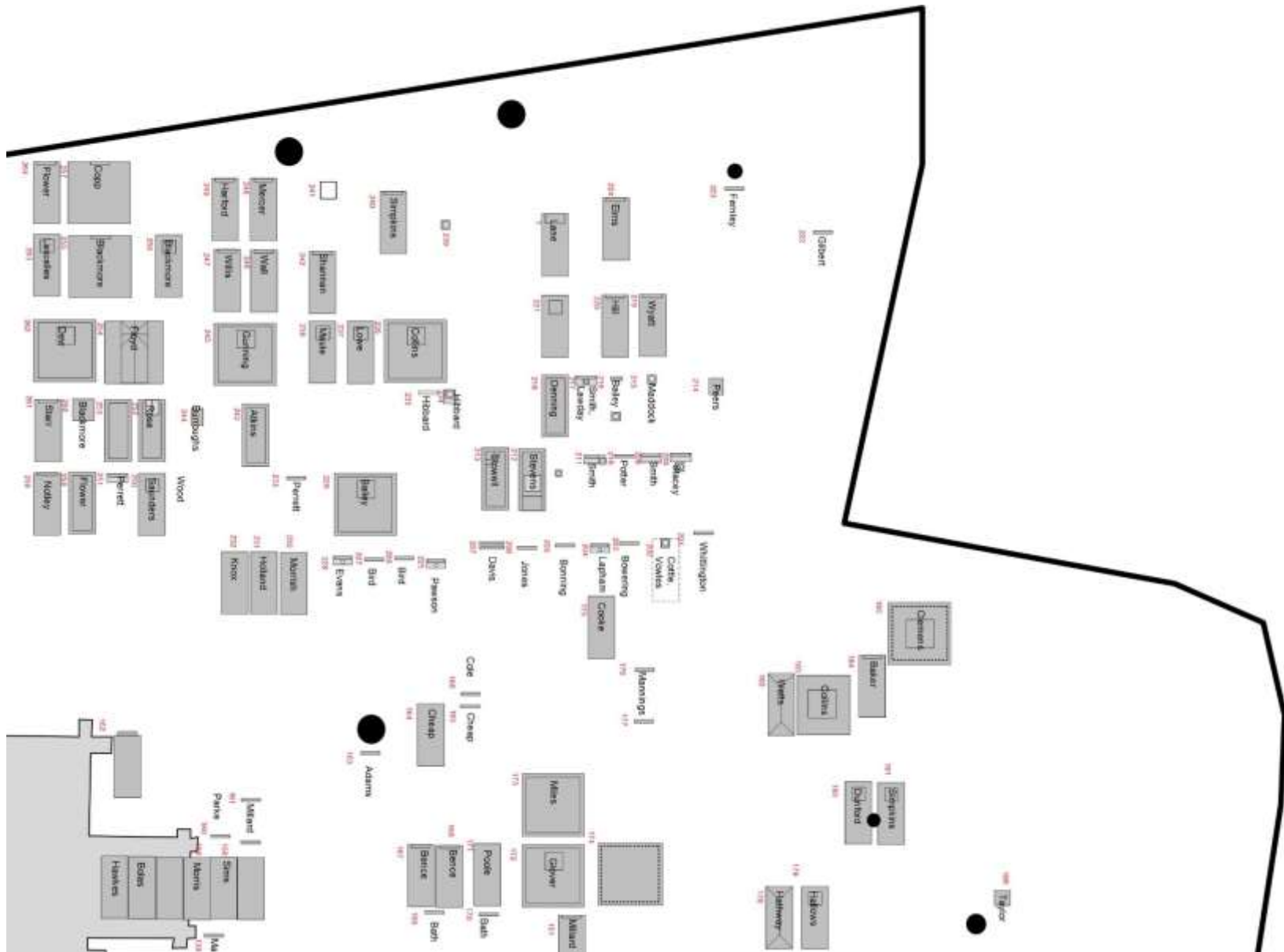


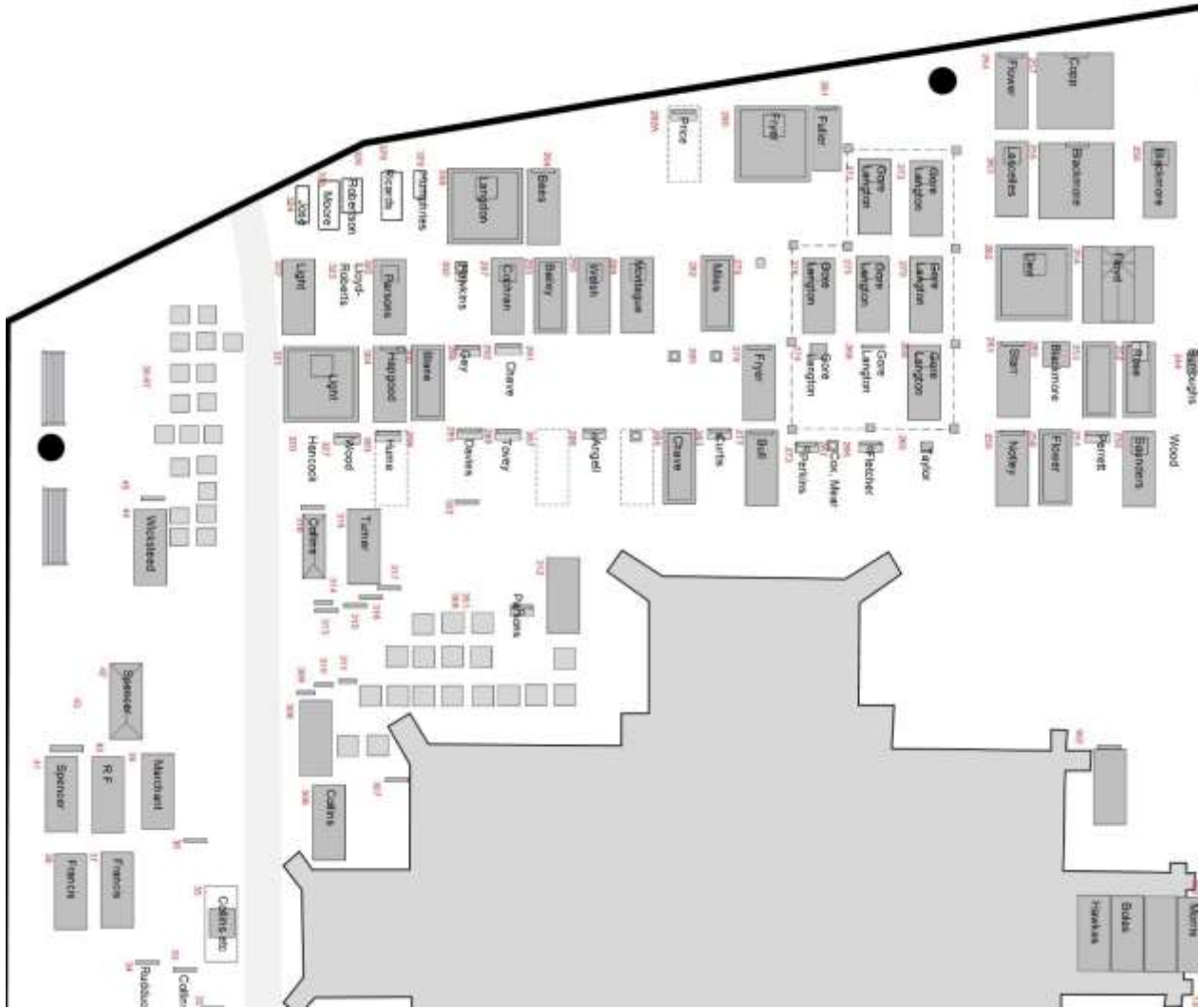
Figure 5 Overall layout.

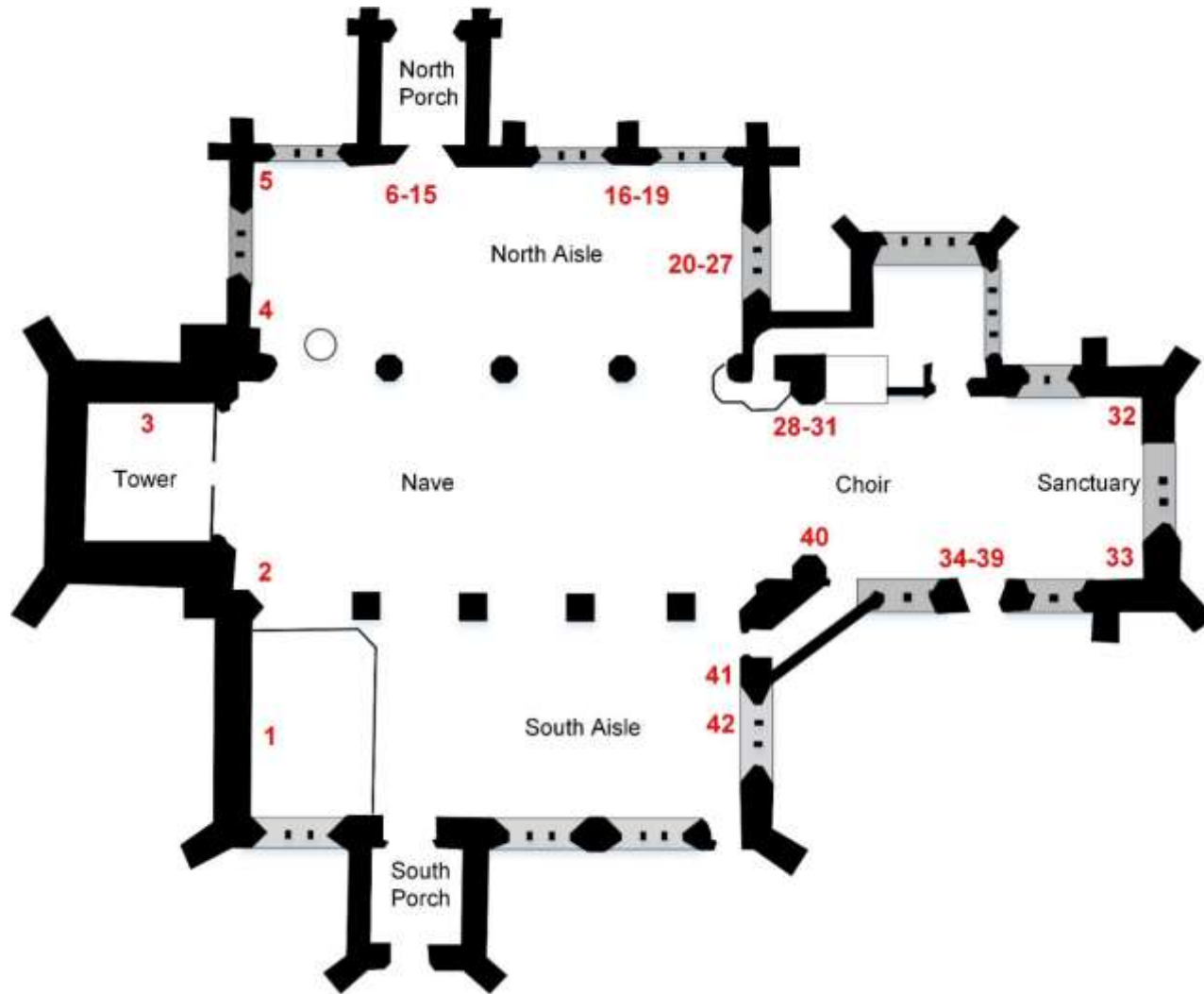

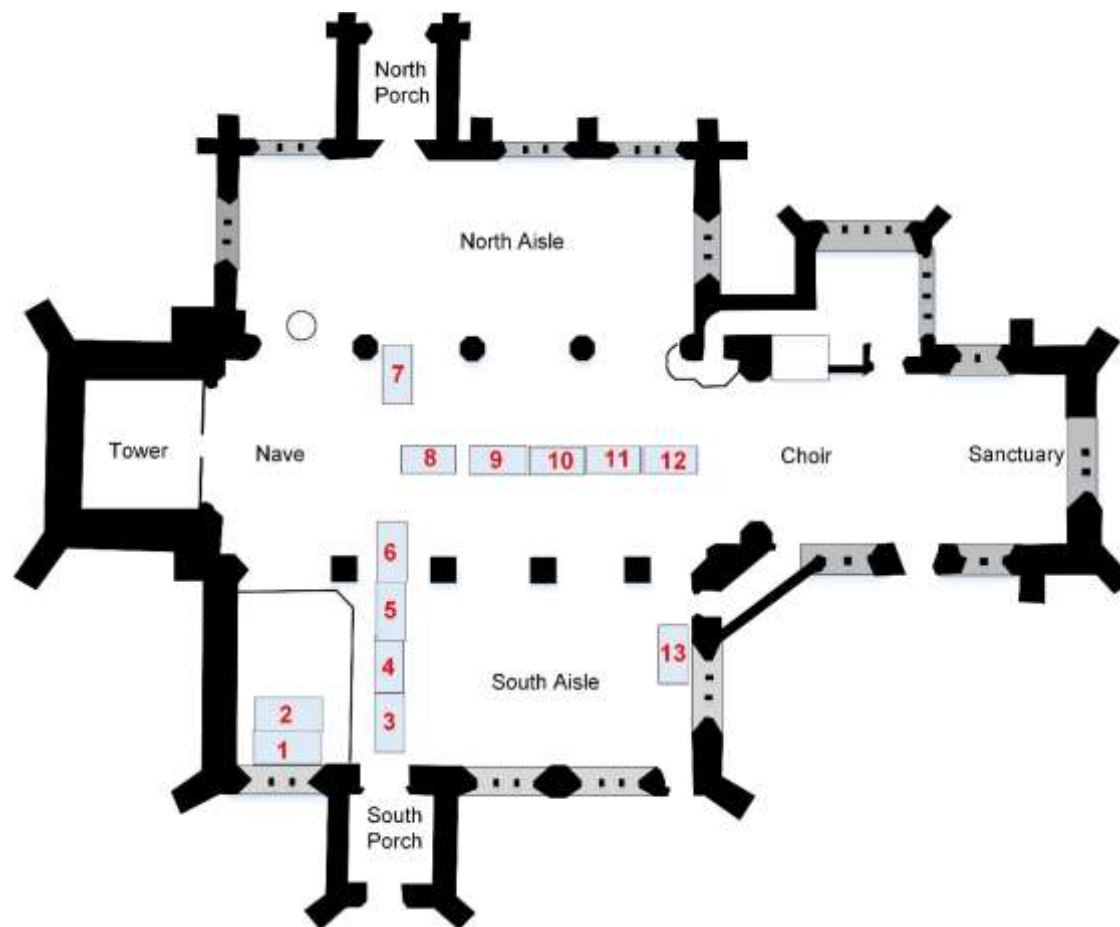

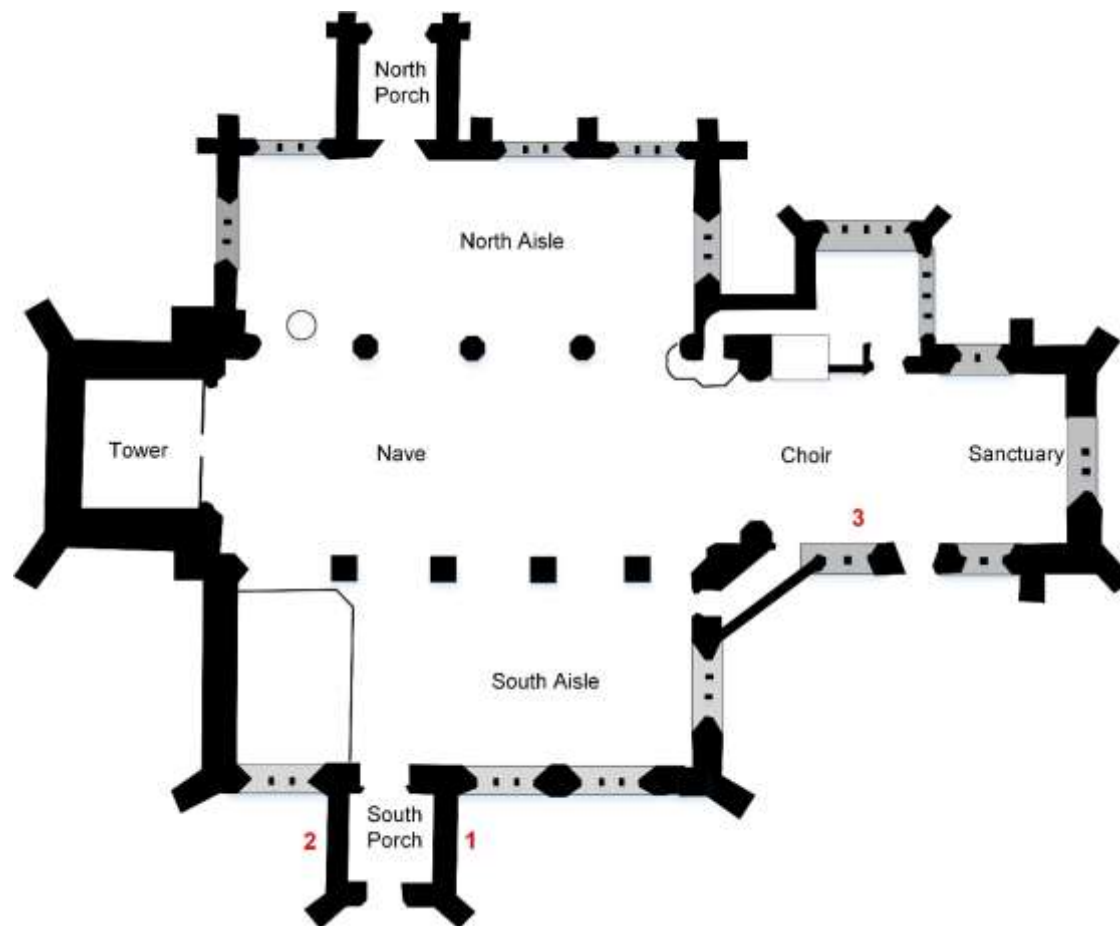
