

Section C

Section C is made up of 6 rows which are to the west of the chapel and by the wall that separates the cemetery from Smallcombe Vale cemetery. The original plan of the area indicates that the rows are meant to be parallel but in practice some of the graves are offset and there is also a difference in alignment of the graves in some of the rows. As a result the positions given in the burial order book are approximate starting at 0 or 1 at the upper, southern side increasing going northwards.

There are 93 graves and 82 memorials. In addition on the western border by the wall are a series on infant and child burials without memorials.

In Row R there is a large cedar tree which has displaced the kerbstones of a grave and its lower branches cover some of the graves. On the western side, the graves in Row X have been overwhelmed by laurel bushes which are now 3m high and whose branches make access to this area difficult.
