

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
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Introduction



The church of St Lawrence, Stanton Prior

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 4 Mar 1869 p8:



From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 21 Oct 1869 p7:

On Sunday, Oct. 10, the church of St. Lawrence, Stanton Prior, was re-opened, after having been closed for four months, during which time it has been thoroughly

restored. At morning service there was a celebration of the Holy Communion, the sermon being preached by the Rector, the Rev. W. S. Browne. In the afternoon the Rev. J. Wood, Minister of Christ Church, Bath, delivered an impressive discourse to a full and attentive congregation. The collections in aid of the restoration fund amounted to £17 15s. The work has been carried out, under the supervision of Mr. C. E. Davis, by Messrs. R. Mann, Hunt, and Gregory. The church fitted with open sittings for 90 persons, which is ample accommodation for the small population. The chancel is handsomely paved with encaustic tiles, which form also the characteristic feature of the reredos. The five windows of the chancel are filled with stained glass by Messrs. Lavers and Barraud, that at the east end representing the Agony, Crucifixion, and Burial of our Lord. The west window has been restored in memory of the late Rector by members of his family, and will shortly be filled with stained glass by Hardman. On the following Wednesday the parishioners were regaled with a plentiful tea in a fine old barn, which was tastefully decorated for the occasion. The entertainment was graced by the presence of Mr. and Lady Anna Gore Langton and family, who, with the parishioners generally, made up a large and pleasant party. After tea Mr. Gore Langton congratulated the people upon the successful accomplishment of a work that had long been needed in their parish, and hoped that they would value more and more their beautiful church, and constantly resort to it. Having alluded in very kind terms to the Rector, he was followed by the Rev. W. S. Browne, who thanked his parishioners for so kindly coming with one accord to celebrate the event which he had been looking forward to ever since he came to Stanton Prior. He thanked their good Squire, who, with his well known liberality, had so substantially aided the work ; he thanked the poor for their offering of a new Bible for the church ; and he was glad to have the opportunity of thanking Mrs. Taylor (wife of the churchwarden) for having voluntarily collected amongst her friends and neighbours between and £60 towards the restoration fund. In short he desired to thank

all who had helped in any way, and especially to thank God that this good work had been brought to a successful completion. After some time spent in listening to good and pleasant words, and the interchange of friendly greetings, the party separated, apparently much pleased with the day, and glad of the joyful occasion which had called them together.

We have been furnished with the following architectural details :—The parish church at Stanton Prior consists of a western tower, nave, chancel, and north porch, which latter has every appearance from the thickness of the walls and other particulars, of formerly being the lower storey of an early tower. The porch is entered by unrecessed pointed arch springing from square impost, Norman Transition in style. During the restoration some black letter incised inscriptions were discovered, and in the eastern wall was also found recess with a stone slab, on which were similar inscriptions ; this recess was evidently built to receive bread dole, possibly the weekly gift of the former priors of Bath. Walled into the recess was an early benitia or stoup; this has been removed to the west wall. The doorway is plain, but above is a simple Perpendicular tabernacle, on which were found remnants of the original painting and which formerly enclosed figure, probably the patron saint, St. Lawrence. The door and tabernacle are somewhat singularly surmounted by a pointed arch comprising almost the whole wall. Within the eastern jamb of the door was discovered another holy water stoup, which has been retained. The architectural features of the interior were a Perpendicular western tower and plain arch with Perpendicular nave, lighted by square headed windows on the south side, and a good Perpendicular tabernacle in the centre. The chancel of far less elevation than the nave was divided from it by an opening in the wall of no particular form with the remnants of what appeared to be tie mullions of a screen. Four very small windows lighted the chancel with a very poor late decorated east window. The font is octagonal upon an earlier base. The restorations are—an entire recasing of the whole of the walls with the local lias stone

with bands of freestone, the erection of a new Norman Transition chancel arch, three-light Early English east window, and the restoration of the other windows of the chancel as well as those of the nave. In removing the wall work of the nave it was discovered that the walls were originally of the same height as the chancel, and as upon removing the chancel opening it was clear that the walls were plastered behind that work, it appears that the church had formerly no distinct marking of chancel, nave, &c. Might it not, therefore, have been the mere conventual church of the Priory rather than the parish church? In Perpendicular times the whole of the present windows of the nave were inserted, the walls raised and the open timber roof, now throw open, erected* the roof are two shields, one the arms of the Bath Abbey, the other those of Hungerford—the latter gives the date of the roof; this family formerly possessed this manor with that of Newton St. Loe adjoining. In removing the western wall of the chancel to enable the erection of the chancel arch, no trace of original arch was discovered, or any, except a few fragments, of the Perpendicular screen which has been preserved - but resting on this wall were the fillings of the panels of the roof, which from their decoration originally surmounted the rood. There could, therefore, have originally been no chancel arch, although there must have been some work to fill up the space between the difference of height between the chancel and nave - this may have been filled with shinglings to be substituted by more permanent work, which from circumstances was never commenced. In restoring chancel the jamb of one window was found to the portion of column, and in that of another a very small lancet was found, and Early Norman or ruder form of the Attic base out of which the head had been cut; this fragment has been preserved with much care *in situ*. Another very interesting fragment, a Norman piscina, found elsewhere, has been inserted in its proper place in the chancel. One or two other bits of architectural character have been found and preserved—A piece, possibly the base of a tabernacle, and radicular corbels evidently domestic work, possibly from the Prior's hall; remains of two very good ledger tombs with incised crosses were found and are now built the north wall of the chancel. The church has been restored without attempt

at display or extravagance, and is good keeping with the simplicity of the original edifice and the requirements of the proper celebration of our services. A simple stone pulpit is the nave of similar character, with an oak lectern. The seats are open and the font is raised upon steps at the entrance.

The earliest register dates from 1572. On the first page is written:

Stanton Prior
Regyster Booke
Anno dni 1572, tempore Johannes
Prymer Rectoris ibidem

At the end of this register under a title 'Briefes' is a list of collections for various causes. One dated 10 Aug 1670 was for 'captured seamen by the Turkes' with 10s. 5d. collected. Raids by Barbary pirates on the southern coast of England to capture slaves was prevalent in the mid-1600s. A petition to King Charles I in 1641 referred to 'the violence of the Turkish pirates . . . thousands of His Majesty's subjects have been taken by them, and do still remain in miserable slavery'. Despite various treaties, it was only in 1816 that an attack by the Dutch and British on Algiers led to the freeing of 3,000 Christian slaves and the reduction in this activity.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 8 Oct 1863 p3:

A new chapel has just been opened at Stanton Prior, near Bath, principally for the accommodation of the Primitive Methodists who have for some time past worshipped in a cottage, but it is stated that it will be open for Christians of all denominations to preach in. The chapel is built of white lias stone with Bath stone facings, is capable of seating 100 persons, and has been erected at the sole cost of W. M. Hooper, Esq.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Sat 23 Jul 1932 p21:

The hope that Stanton Prior would be allowed to preserve its ancient name, and that the suggestion of the County Council that it should in future be known as Lower Marksbury "or some equally inappropriate term," would never come to pass, was expressed by Countess Temple in opening a garden fete at Stanton Prior Rectory on July 16th in aid of the Church Repair Fund.

The Rector (the Rev. F. W. Cresswell) explained the object of the fund which was to defray the cost of urgent repairs to the church.

Stanton Prior Church, he said, was an ancient and beautiful building, but like others of similar age was in constant need of repairs. During the last year the church had had to be completely re-floored, and now they were faced with the need of considerable repairs to the fabric.

. . .

From *Primitive Sun Dials or Scratch Dials — Containing a list of those in Somerset* by Dom Ethelbert Horne (1858-1952), (The Wessex Press, Taunton 1917) p52:

STANTON PRIOR CHURCH

66. This dial is on the first buttress from the W. end, on the S. side. It is 5 feet above the ground. The diameter of the outer circle is $7\frac{3}{4}$ inches, the next circle $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch less. Inside this, a circle of $\frac{5}{8}$ of an inch less, and the innermost one $\frac{5}{16}$ of an inch less. The stylehole is $1\frac{3}{4}$ inches deep, and a portion of the style seems to be remaining in it. The aspect is S. by 10° E. Type 8. September 11th, 1911.

This is one of the most beautiful dials in the county. Unfortunately the lower edge is broken away and roughly repaired with mortar, and the ivy growing over it is doing further damage. The diameter of the outer circle is the same as that of the dial at Newton St. Loe— $7\frac{3}{4}$ inches. Both dials appear to be the work of the same hand, but the dial in question is much more highly finished than its neighbour.

A Type 8 is defined as *The stylehole made in a stone, with a perpendicular and horizontal line cutting*

across it. In one or more of the four right angles thus formed, one of more radiating lines, the whole contained in a circle.



A letter to the *Bath Chronicle* which appeared in the edition of Thu 23 Aug 1888 p3 from W S Browne (the Rector) noted the existence of the sundial on the southern side of the church.

The parish is part of the benefice of Farmborough, Marksbury and Stanton Prior within the archdeaconry of Bath.



From 1572, there have been at least 559 burials.

It is evident from some of the memorials that the register wasn't being kept faithfully in the early 1700s. For example two plaques embedded in the


outside wall of the porch have no corresponding entries in the register. Also there is a memorial in the church to Samuel Parlivent (1709-1775) stating that he was buried in the church but there is no entry in the burial register.

From the graph of the number of burial per year it is evident there are gaps for the periods 1718-1734 and 1754-1776.



Memorial Inscription Documentation

The inscriptions were recorded at the end in the burial register for the period 1764-1812 by the Rector W S Browne in 1866 and in 1879. For example:



The numbering scheme adopted is that from a previous survey which produced a map showing the arrangement of the memorials.
