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## Introduction



From the *Imperial Gazetteer of England and Wales* 1870-72 by John Marius Wilson:

SWAINSWICK, a parish, with a village, in Bath district, Somerset; 3 miles NNE of Bath r. station. Post town, Bath. Acres, 845. Real property, £4,160. Pop., 632. Houses, 131. The property is subdivided. The manor-house was the birthplace of Prynne, whose ears were cut off by Laud. Solsbury British camp, 600 feet above sea-level, is near the village. The living is a rectory in the diocese of Bath and Wells. Value, £220\* Patron, Oriel College, Oxford. The church is Norman and good. There is a parochial school.

From *The Church Rambler* (1878 edition) on the section on Swainswick:

The church of Swainswick is a small and in part ancient building, and is in one or two respects very peculiar. Like most of the churches in the immediate neighbourhood of Bath it is of Norman foundation and preserves as relics of its first form a plain but substantial Norman

font and a Norman south doorway with chevron moulding. The tympanum of this doorway has disappeared and its place is supplied by a piece of wood. The church now consists of a western tower, nave with north aisle and south porch, and chancel with chantry chapel on the north side. The tower is peculiar, standing within the church. Its west wall is the west wall of the nave, and it open into the church with two bold Early English arches ornamented with corbels. It is evident that the north wall of the church once ran in a line with the north wall of the tower and that the aisle which is Perpendicular in character was built on later. The window also on the north side of the tower was evidently once an external one. The tower which has the saddle back roof of the neighbourhood was not part of the original church; hence the way in which it is built inside the nave. The plain chancel arch is Early English. Without capitals or shafts. It is cut away on one side where evidently the rood steps went, and in the opposite wall is a small window which probably lighted the rood loft. On the south side there is also a very good Decorated window and an apparently handsome benitier, which is unfortunately covered up by the high old-fashioned pews.

The north chapel is separated from the chancel by one of the late panelled arches which are not infrequent in this neighbourhood. We read theory of its original use in the high sill of the four-light Perpendicular east window, the bracket beside it on which once stood the figure of a saint and the piscine on the south side. It seems likely that they were fond of statues in this church for there are several rests on the arches of the nave that cannot been for any other purpose. On the north side of the chapel there is apparently one of those nameless arched recesses of which another may be seen in the church of S. Julian, Wellow, which seem to be made as memorials of the dead though not as tombs. I am sorry that this is entirely blocked up by seats-new ones. I would suggest that when the new seats are fitted in the nave that the benitier be left uncovered. . . . On the north side of the chapel there is a small doorway for the accommodation of the family of the manor and on the outside is a small holy water stoop. The original bot upon this door is still used-a substantial bar of oak which drops into hollows in the wall on either side.

The chancel was rebuilt about fifteen years since in a very substantial and satisfactory manner. It has a triple lancetheaded east window and a handsome stone reredos, though for my part I object to the introduction of granite columns into the fabric of country churches. The Laudian window on the south side was preserved in restoring the chancel to show that the chancel replaced was entirely of that period.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 22 Sep 1904 p2, in a report of a meeting of the board of the Bath Municipal Charities:

The Clerk read a letter from the Rev. James S. Wimbush, Rector of Swainswick, who called Attention to the fact that the roof of Swainswick Church was in great need restoration and sent a circular in which details were given. "The sum needed," said the Rector, "is quite beyond

the means the ordinary worshippers in the church. Under these circumstances I appealing to the larger land and householders in the parish for assistance, and I trust that you may able to give us your assistance, in view of the property you hold in the parish." The Rector mentioned that he himself raised £12 a vear for the rent, etc., of a mission room in Lower Swainswick, where Sunday Schools, Mothers' Meetings, Parish Library and (in the winter) week-day services were held for the benefit of the people living at that end of the parish.—The roof of the church, according to the circular mentioned above, is in need of thorough repair. It has been examined by Mr. Arthur Dixon, M.A., of Birmingham, and his report is that a large proportion of the timber of the roof is seriously decayed: that the decay is steadily spreading; and that, in order to preserve such of the timbers as are not yet attacked, the repair of the roof should be at once taken in hand. The heavy covering of stone tiles will have to be taken off and the decayed timber removed and replaced by sound English oak. The Architect fears that it will be necessary to replace nearly half of the existing timbers. The stone tiles must then be replaced, new ones being used where necessary. It is estimated that the cost of this work will about £400. --Mr. Rooke said that he considered that, as a matter of principle, the Trustees would not be justified in giving a donation. He would, personally, be very much in favour of rendering assistance, but did not know if they, as a charity, could be justified in making a grant out of the funds for a purpose of that kind. Mr Rooke asked whether they would be right in giving their aid to a Nonconformist place of worship, supposing such a place applied for it. -Achapel, in the opinion of the Chairman.

would have an equal claim with that of the church.-Answering Mr. Cox, the Clerk said that there was precedent for a similar grant, but mentioned that the Trustees subscribed to the schools, because it was felt it would be more advantageous to the Trustees than a board school and would not cost so much.-The Chairman observed that they were only a small board that morning and it was only right that other members should be given an opportunity of expressing their opinions.- The question was accordingly deferred until the next meeting and in the meantime the Clerk was, on the suggestion of Mr. Bagshawe, instructed to write to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for their opinion.



From the Western Daily Press of Wed 11 Jun 1924 p5: A PRIEST'S HOUSE. USED IN MEDIÆVAL' TIMES. Discovery at Swainswick Church. The vestry of the ancient Church of St. Mary, Swainswick, has, in consequence recent discoveries, been identified as a mediæval priest's house. Swainswick is a large village, three miles north-east of Bath, and is known to history chiefly as the birthplace of William Prynne, the notorious politician and pamphleteer in the reign of Charles I. and during the Commonwealth.

St. Mary's is a building of considerable interest. The original structure, corresponding with the present nave, was erected in Norman times, but in the Early English period a south aisle was 'added, running from the tower, on the west, to a point where the old chancel ended before its extension in the rectorship of Prebendary Earle. That this is so is evident from the fact that the string course of the tower can be seen inside the vestry. A part of the aisle to the north was screened off as a chapel: at the tower end was placed a little chamber which, previous to its present use as a vestry, contained a gallery in which the village children were ensconced, to be seen and not heard during the service.

The original purpose of the little chamber adjoining the tower at the west end was unknown until, at the beginning last month, Mr W. D. Caröe, architect the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, undertook some renovations to its north wall. He uncovered two square windows, one above the other, which, although embedded in plaster, could be seen from the exterior of the church: the highest stands about 12ft. above the floor. The position of these windows suggested to him that the chamber was originally in two storeys, each of which was lighted by one of these windows, and his conjecture was confirmed by the presence of another little window high up in the west wall, and a groove running along north wall, clearly intended to support a floor. Some big stones found at the east end of the vestry were, no doubt, the foundation stones of the fourth wall.

The chamber, with its two storeys, was therefore dwelling-house in miniature. It

was, in the opinion of the rector, the Rev. H. Freeman, used as a sleeping-house for the priest who served the church in mediæval times. He probably came from Bath, and had to attend to number of churches the district, and in those days limited travelling preferred to pass the night in this diminutive building.



From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 19 Sep 1925 p15 in a report of an excursion by the Bath branch of the Somerset Archæological Society:

. . . The Swainswick visit had a special significance, for it was the first time that a lady member of the Society acted as lecturer. Miss Watson, of the Cottage, Swainswick, told the Society all about the church, and was cordially thanked Mr. Gerald Grey, whose services in promoting the excursion were acknowledged the Rev. J. Byrchmore. The party was conveyed two Bristol Blue charabancs. SWAINSWICK CHURCH.

Miss Watson gave a very lucid account of the history and architectural features the church of St. Mary, Swainswick —an apology for the absence of the Rector (the Rev. Harry Freeman) was read.

Swainswick's chief claim to fame was the fact that it was the birthplace of William Prynne, whose ears were cut off for denouncing the follies of the Court of King Charles I. He was born at Hill House, a charming old house at the top of the Church Hill, where the villagers said he was walled up now, as there was a window with no corresponding room there. The church was dedicated to St. Marv. and consisted of chancel, nave, western tower, southern porch, north aisle, and lady or chantry chapel. Mr. Caroe stated that the architectural history was unusually complicated and curious. The south and west walls of the nave and the lower north wall of the tower were Norman to within a few courses of the eaves. They had noticed the beautiful Norman arch as they entered the church by the south-west, door, and other Norman features were two small squareheaded loops (behind the organ) and one opposite in the now north wall of the tower, looking into the north aisle. There was probably a Norman west window originally, he Norman work dated from about 1100.

The next works of importance were in the middle of the 14th century, when the tower was inserted into the Norman nave, and the two Decorated windows in the south wall either side of the Norman door. The arch from the north aisle into the lady chapel came next in point of date, that was about 1860.

#### FINGER MOULDING.

The chancel arch followed next in order of date; it probably replaced a Norman one. Then followed in Henry VII.'s time the two moulded arches and piers of the north arcade, and contemporary with them were the two north windows of the aisle. These answered to those in the south wall; the later builders were evidently influenced by their 14th century predecessors. About 1500 the north-east chapel was erected, clearly a chantry of some family of sufficient importance to impose their armorial bearings on it. There were six shields—and over the recess the north wall, probably Easter sepulchre, were two more. The moulding above was of a very unusual type, called finger moulding.

In Elizabeth's time a four-light east window with elliptical heads was placed in the wall of the chancel—which could be seen from the photograph taken in 1855, before Professor Earle's restorations. At the same time three-light windows of similar design were placed in the south wall of chancel and west wall the north aisle, while a small two-light window occurred high up near the east end of the south nave wall. To the same period (to Charles I.) might be allotted the small circular arch of the nave arcade.

In the Beckford, or Strawberry Hill style of Gothic the south-east Decorated window of the nave was restored and the porch built. Then they came to the Victorian efforts. The whole east wall was pulled down, chancel lengthened, and the reading desk and pulpit inserted. They had fund for re-building the east wall as it was.

JOHN WOOD'S TOMB.

In 1922, when the old pitch-pine pews were removed from the chapel, the floor had to repaired, and underneath was found a web-built vault, and inside the remains a wood coffin with lead lining and a partly obliterated name plate, bearing the date 1840, and the name of Mrs. Janey Wood. Other burials had evidently been made underneath, so there could be little doubt that the tombstone was its original position, and that the tomb was that of John Wood, the architect, as stated upon it (Joanis Wood armigeri sepulchrum).



From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 18 Aug 1928 p14:

The chancel of Swainswick Church is, I understand, shortly to enriched by a new set of oak choir stalls, one of which is to be in the nature of memorial gift, and the others are to provided to match. The total cost will be somewhere in the region of £200.

From *The Western Daily Press* of Mon 13 May 1929 p11:

Choir stalls at Swainswick Church were dedicated on Saturday afternoon in memory of Mrs Watson, of Swainswick Cottage, and members of the Sainsbury family, of Beech House.

From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 18 Aug 1928 p14:

#### SWAINSWICK CHURCH Repair of Organ to be Undertaken

"The principal event in the past year," said the Rev. W. F. Sorsbie (Rector of Swainswick), in reading his report at the Swainswick annual parochial church meeting on Tuesday evening, has been the installation of electric light in the church, which was paid for out the balance of the Walter Miles legacy, and which is generally considered very satisfactory."


The organ had been recently examined by Messrs. Griffen and Stroud, and their report revealed a serious condition of the instrument, which is extraordinarily dirty, worn in parts, and partially out of order in its mechanism.

The firm's estimate of £23 10s. 6d. for putting it in order was accepted. Towards this amount there was a sum of £2 17s. 6d. hand.


The number of communicants was more than maintained: 151 persons communicated on Easter Day last year and 162 this year.

From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 19 Oct 1940 p11 in a report on the visit to Swainswick of the Bishop of Bath & Wells:


. . . "Bladud's Sword," the massive twohanded weapon which seems best fitted for the arming of a pantomime giant, was discovered some 40 years ago during repairs to the thatched roof of Swainswick manor house. The sword was dated 1423. so that the bestowal of the title "Bladud" on this ancient relic lacks the authority of either history or tradition. The original sword is now in the possession of Oriel College, and the replica which for the past 40 years has been carried by the City Sword-bearer in Bath civic processions, was presented to the Corporation by Mr. R. E. Dickinson, who was Mayor of the city in 1899. . . .




From the burial register entries from 1813, 23% were aged under 11 and 38% aged over 70.



As would be expected for the village, occupations are dominated by farmers and labourers.



In the period 1813-1912 72% of those buried were from Swainswick (including Tadwick) with a further 15% from Bath, mainly Walcot.



As would expected with a rural parish the vast majority were born in England. There are nonetheless 2 born in India and one in the USA.

From Primitive Sun Dials or Scratch Dials -Containing a list of those in Somerset by Dom Ethelbert Horne (Taunton, 1917): SWAINSWICK CHURCH 25. This dial in on a quoin stone at the E. end of the nave. It is 5 feet 6 inches above the ground, the noonline is  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches in length, the stylehole is 1 inch deep and  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an inch in diameter, and the aspect is S. by  $10^{\circ}$ E. Type 6. June 11th, 1915

The shank of the style is probably still embedded in the dial. At the churches at Tintinhull (224) and at Martock (201) are other dials of this curious pattern. They are the only three of this type in the county.



There are two further possible scratchdials on the quoin stones of the porch.

#### **Notable People**

## John Wood the Elder (1704-1754) and John Wood the Younger (1728-1782)

Noted architects responsible for much of the design of Georgian Bath.

#### Randle Gauton (1721-1784)

Up-market grocer and tea-dealer in Bath. When the partnership of Messrs Randle & George Gauton of Queen Street, Bath dissolved in 1780 and the stock-in-trade was auctioned, the list of products included a long list of teas and spices.

#### Col John Whaley Watson (1838-1889)

In the Bombay Army 1854-89. A museum at Rajkot was named 'in fond memory of Colonel John Watson in 1888 who was a British political agent of Kathiawar Agency from 1881 to 1889'. Died in India but he, along with members of his family, are commemorated here.

#### **Burial Registers**


In the register for 1557-1783 there is gap in the entries from 1640 to 1653. The English Civil wars occurred from 1642-1646 and 1648-1651. With the establishment of the Commonwealth in 1653, registration of birth, marriages and deaths was administered by magistrates. In the register around that time are just a few baptisms (1653, 1661, 1663) before a jump to 1672.

There are lapses in the register in the 1780s as there are internal memorials stating a burial without a corresponding entry in the burial register.

The locations of the graves have been added in the 1889-1978 register. For the old churchyard these are given as row letter and plot number. However only a few entries have this. For the new churchyard two conventions are used: a plot number written in red against the register entry number and, possibly a later addition, a row number plus plot number in the margin.

The register from 1979 is with the parish.


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



### Layout

The lower burial ground by the church has graves arranged east to west. From the level ground by the church the ground rises eastwards to a boundary wall. Some graves in the upper area are behind a large clump of brambles. An area on the slope has been designed as a 'conservation area'.

The upper burial ground is on a slope and the graves are aligned north-east to south-west in a grid. The memorials in the lower part are conventional headstones and kerbstones while in the higher part the memorials are mainly small headstones on bases and some cremation plaques.








## Graveyard

Nonetheless, they have been useful for those memorials which are now partially illegible and the missing characters from this source are given here in grey.




