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#### Introduction



The church of St Michael, Twerton

There were 4,667 burials in the period 1750-1920, between 10 and 20 per year in the 18th century rising to 40 and 60 a year in the 19th century, with peaks in 1832 and 1849 due to cholera. There where epidemics of influenza and typhoid in 1837 and 1838. After the opening of the Twerton Municipal Cemetery in 1881 (see separate description), there were only a few further burials, the last one being in 1920.

# From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 21 Jan 1886: TWERTON NEW PARISH CHURCH

To-day (Thursday) the lately rebuilt parish church of St Michael, Twerton-on-Avon will be consecrated by the Bishop of Bath and Wells. The new church, as our readers are aware, has been erected by the Messrs. Carr as a memorial to their father, the late Mr. Isaac Carr, and certainly no more noble or suitable monument could have been placed in the parish with which

he was so long associated. With the present work it has been the fortune of the parish church to be twice re-erected within half-acentury.

. . .

Sitting accommodation is provided for rather over 400 adults, whilst there is room for 100 chairs besides without in any wat interfering with the gangways. . . . The churchyard has also undergone some changes. The steps at the north-eat corner have been made easier and a new gateway built; a pathway has been formed along the northern boundary from this gate to another now introduced at the north-west corner, and from the middle of the length of this path a wide branch leads up direct to the north porch.

The contractor, Mr. Jacob Long, has done the whole of his work in a thoroughly substantial manner. Besides building the carcase he has supplied the internal oakwork with the exception of the pulpit, which is made by Mr. A. Robinson, of Bloomsbury. The windows are by Messrs. Clayton and Bell; the bells have been re-hung by Messrs. J. Taylor and Co., of Loughborough.

The article explains that the previous church had been re-opened on 31 Oct 1839, was larger than the previous one and that enlargement of the church had occurred in 1816 and 1824.



A plaque in the church records that the church, except for the tower, was rebuilt and refitted, being re-consecrated on 21 Jan 1886.

The patronage was, from 1180, with the prioress and nuns of the nunnery at Kingston St Michael, near Chippenham, but, after the suppression of the nunnery by Henry VIII in 1536, it passed to the Provost and Fellows of Oriel College, Oxford.

#### The register has:

By Order of Her Majesty in Privy Council held on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1881 at Windsor, Burials are ordered to be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Twerton on Avon in the county of Somerset after the 1<sup>st</sup> of Decr 1881 & also in the churchyard except as follows: In such Vaults and Walled Graves as are now existing in the <u>Churchyard</u> burials may be allowed, on condition that any coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stone work or brick work

properly cemented." Extension of time has ... twice granted & lastly postponed, —

"In the Parish Church-yard of Twerton on Avon in the County of Somerset to the 1st day of September 1882."

A portion of the Cemetery was duly consecrated by the Bp of B & W August 20<sup>th</sup> 1882.



Burials in the churchyard almost completely ceased when the ward-based cemetery in Bellotts Road was opened in 1882.




Transcript of the Register of the Parish of Twerton, Avon (formerly Somerset), 1813-1840, E S Jenkins (1975). Includes burials 1841-1891, 1920. Surname indexes. A limitation of the transcripts of 19th-century entries is that, for the most part, the abode is missing and the burial register numbers (from 1813) are absent.

There is a volume entitled Inscriptions on the Gravestones and Monuments at Twerton-on-Avon, Combe Hay, Dunkerton, South Stoke & Langridge. The typewritten document with handwritten corrections has no author but was presented to Bath Reference Library by 'the Misses Shickle' and may have been compiled by Rev Charles William Shickle (1841-1927), the curate of Twerton (1865-69), assistant master of Bath Proprietary College and rector of Langridge (1885-99).

In the intervening century some of the memorials have degraded and this volume has been used to reconstitute the text, such text being shown in grey.








