From the Bath Chronicle of Thu 6 March 1902 p7: DEATH OF PASTOR JOHN HUNTLEY We regret to announce the death of Pastor John Huntley, which occurred at his residence, Shunem Villa, Widcombe Hill, early on Saturday. Mr. Huntley was a very old inhabitant of Bath, coming from his native place, Limpley Stoke, early in life. He will be best remembered as Pastor of Ebenezer Chapel, Widcombe, where for 45 years he faithfully ministered. When he came to Bath first he carried on business as a manufacturing cabinet-maker, and at the same time filled the pastorate at Widcombe Chapel. He retired from business about sixteen years ago. Last September Mr. Huntley celebrated his forty-fifth anniversary of his pastorate, but since that time his health has been gradually failing, and he had only been able to preach on two occasions since that time—early in January of this year—so that his ministry might be stated to have practically concluded in September. Some of our older readers may remembet that in the 60's deceased conducted public baptismal services in the river Avon, at the rear of Messrs. Stothert and Pitt's Works. One some occasions as many as three or four thousand specttators would assemble at the spot on Sunday mornings, and Mr. Huntley having a clear and strong voice, the crowd could distinctly hear the "Glad Tidings" which he preached, and which was the message of his whole life. He was the oldest Nonconformist

			Mr. Huntley was a man who never hesitated to raise his voice or wield his pen against what he considered wrong and contrary to the publice weal.
			Mr. Huntley was the eledest son of Mr. John Hunley, who died in 1902 after being for 42 years Pastor of Widcombe Bapstist Church. Mr. J. R. Huntley, who succeeded him in the pastorate, was the third generation to exercise the office, his grandfather being Mr. William Huntley, who for 64 years was Baptist minister at Limpley Stoke.  The interment took place at the Abbey Cemetery.  Buried in the Abbey Cemetery - grave 2.NS.11 (MI) - with his wife Annie Angus Huntley (1865-1945).

## Crypt

The memorials in the crypt date from the periods when the chapel was used by the Congregationalists (1820-1834) and then Methodists (1834-1838). The numbers given to the graves indicate that there were 6 rows and the highest plot number found is 20.
