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Introduction

This document contains transcriptions of the memorials in the churchyard of St Thomas à Becket, Widcombe, Bath and memorials within the church.

Churchyard

The main burial ground for the parish of Widcombe was around three sides of the church. There were also burials in the vault under the church.

Old Burial Ground

The 'Old Burial Ground', the parish's second burial ground, is in Church Lane.

The land first appears as a 'Bowling Alley' in Thorp's survey of 1741. This showed Ralph Allen's landholdings in Widcombe. It had originally belonged to Bath Priory until the Dissolution when it was bought from the Crown by Edmund Colthurst. This mansion, the original Widcombe House, stood on the site of Widcombe Crescent. Alderman Chapman, Allen's executor, sold the land on behalf of Gertrude Tucker, Ralph Allen's wife's niece and heiress to all his property.

The land was purchased by the parish in 1782. An account in the parish archive shows that Messrs Kingston and Bayly were paid £35.15.7½ to adapt it from a bowling alley to a place of burial. In 1784 row letters and plot numbers were inscribed on the walls.

By 1825 the burial ground was full and was closed by the Bishop of Bath & Wells when he consecrated the new ground at Claverton Street next to the land on which St Mark's church was subsequently built in 1832. Despite this, it continued to function as a secondary place of burial (charging lower fees) as it remained a valuable

source of funds for the parish. The Burial Acts of 1856 eventually obliged the parish to lay out a properly-run cemetery which opened in 1861 on the Lower Bristol Road; now known as St James's Cemetery but correctly 'Lyncombe and Widcombe & St James' Cemetery'. The Old Burial Ground was then finally closed by an Order in Council in 1870.

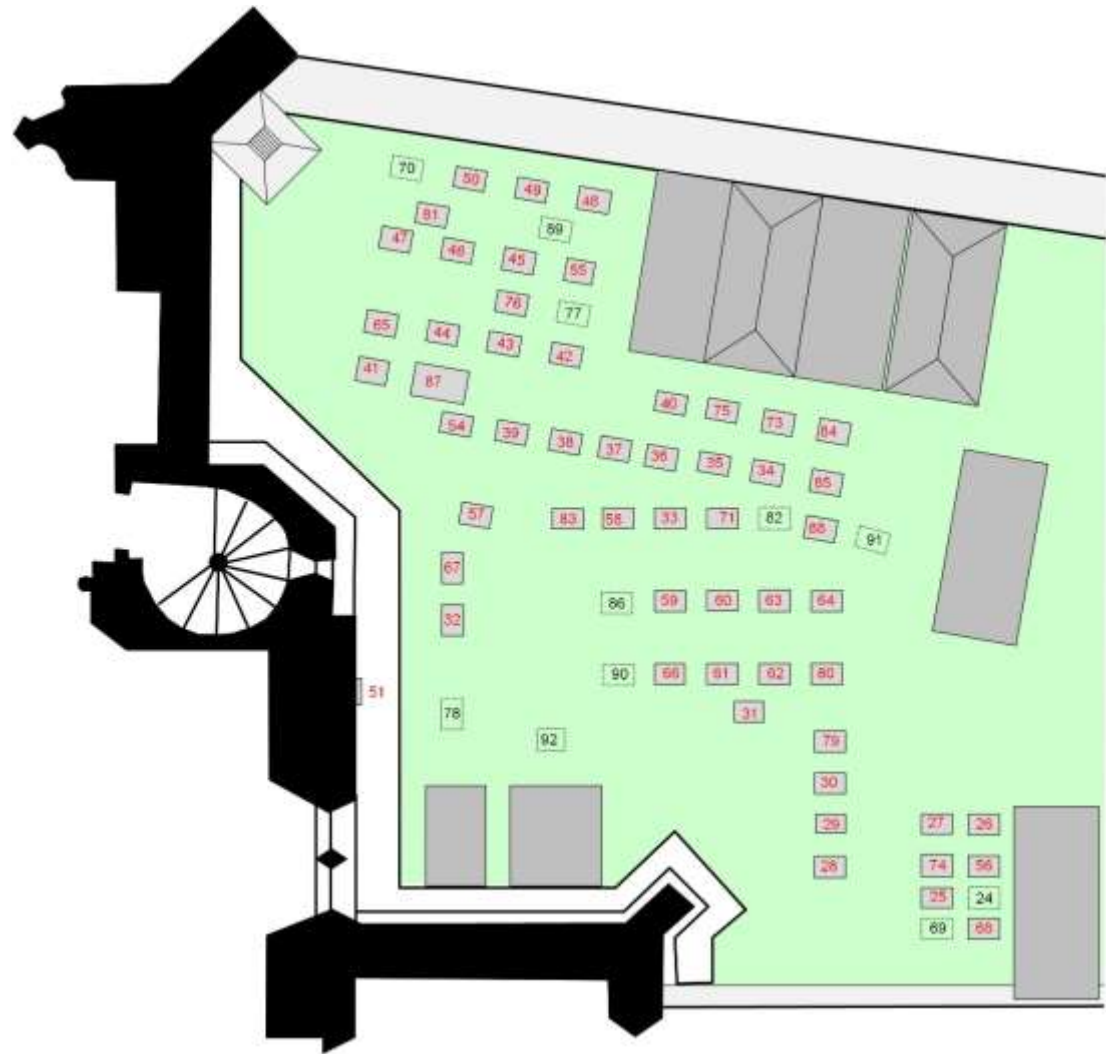



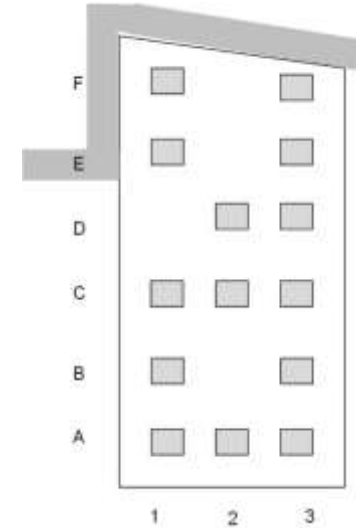

Old Burial Ground

The graveyard is arranged as 4 rows (A-D) numbered from 1 starting the southern end. The row indicators can be found on the coping stones at the northern end. The plot numbers have been inscribed on both the western and eastern walls and are very clear. Some of the stones with plot numbers, on the eastern wall, have fallen down. Here 'W' is used to indicate memorials or inscriptions which are by or on the eastern wall.

The hut for the gravedigger which appears on old maps no longer exists.

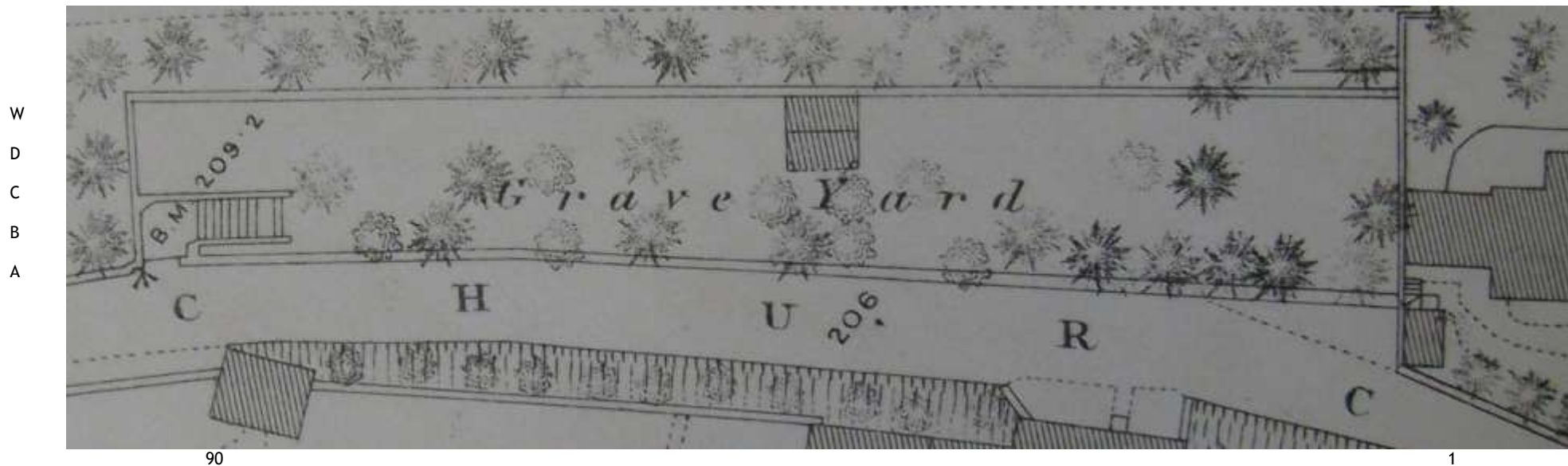


Figure 8 Old Burial Ground - Overall layout of the graveyard

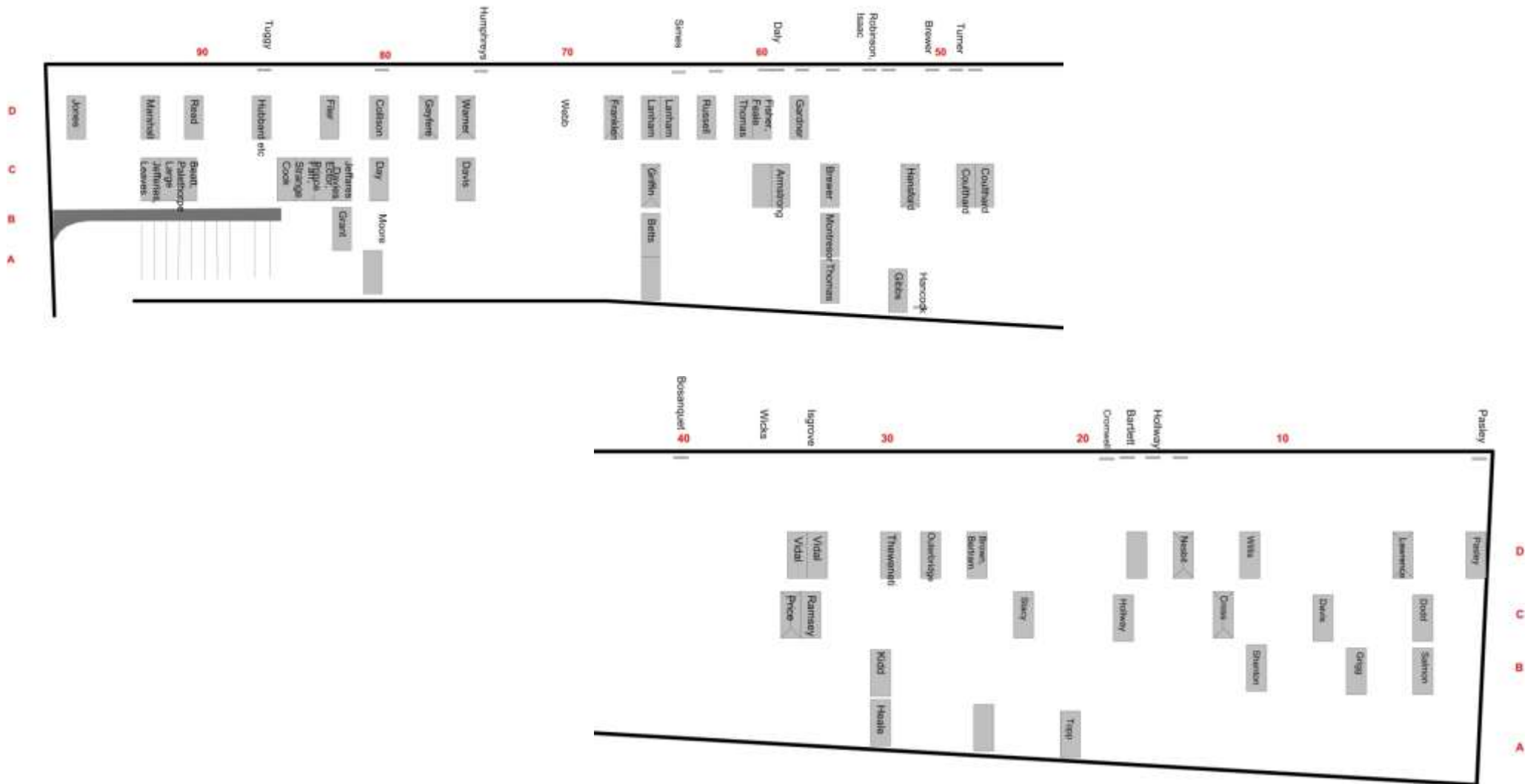









Figure 9 Old Burial Ground - Arrangement of surviving memorials

WIDCOMBE'S FALLEN HEROES

— AN IONIC CROSS FOR REMEMBRANCE —

The purpose of a public meeting called at Widcombe Church Institute on Monday night was to discuss the question of a war memorial for the parish. Some sixty men of the locality have fallen in the recent war, and the idea was to perpetuate their names and the sacrifice they had paid in order to maintain the country's integrity and honour, and to uphold right against wrong. The chair was occupied by the vicar (the Rev. W. D. Graham), who was supported by Mr. Tom Wills (secretary, pro. tem), Mr. J. R. Huntley, Mr. W. H. Devenish, Councillor J. W. Crook, and other local gentlemen. There was a very fair attendance among those present being a number of ladies.

The Chairman said he had been approached by a number of gentlemen who asked if it was not time for them to have some memorial put up for the men who had made such a great sacrifice for them. He and several others had met in an informal manner at the Vicarage, and they were unanimous that a memorial should be put up in the parish of such a characters that would keep green the memories of those men. They had come to the conclusion that that it would be best to have an Ionic cross. After that the question of a site was discussed, and it was thought that one on the green outside the Parish Church would be suitable. It was not in the parish church, nor a part of it - it was that piece of green that ran down from the drive into Church Street. The first thing then for the meeting to consider was whether a memorial should be erected or not.

Miss Maitland suggested a replica of the cenotaph at Whitehall — they could not have a higher model. She thought the suggested site would be too much out of the way for such a memorial as that she had mentioned.

Mr. W. H. Devenish moved "that it was considered desirable to erect a memorial in Widcombe to those that had fallen in the war." He thought they should put up a memorial of their own to those of their men who had lost their lives in the war, and not one to all men who had died through the war (applause). In his opinion a Christian Cross was the finest monument they could have for Christian men. Mr Stanley Taylor seconded, and the resolution was carried.

Mr. J. R. Huntley then proposed "that the memorial should take the form of an Ionic Cross of Cornish granite, to be erected in the space outside the Old Widcombe Church, with the names of the fallen suitable engraved thereon." This, he said, resolved itself into two parts — the nature of the memorial and then the site for the same. He had thought it would be well to put up a fountain at the bottom of Widcombe Hill in place of the one already there. He had to drop the ideas, however, on account of expense. The site suggested outside the old ivy church met with his approval, but he would have preferred a more prominent and central site if one had been available.

Councillor Crook seconded, but after protracted discussion on various suggestions, the Vicar proposed the splitting of the resolution into two parts.

It was then moved and seconded that the memorial should take the form of an Ionic Cross of Cornish granite, with the names of the fallen suitably engraved thereon. This was then put and carried.

The discussion of the site was the cause of some difference of opinion. The proposal of the old parish

church site was favoured by a number of Speakers on the grounds of sentiment suitability. Others thought that a more public place would better answer the purpose in view. Mr. Perrin thought a spot near the toll bridge would be the best place, and Mr. Mould favoured the Shrubbery. Mr. Huntley suggested that the question of deciding the site be deferred, and this was agreed to, the hope being expressed that they would arrive at some conclusion which all could work unanimously in carrying out.

A comprehensive committee was elected as follows: The Rev. W. D. Graham, Mr. J. R. Huntley, Councillor Crook, Councillor Turvey, Mr. Thomas Wills, Mr. W. H. Devenish, Mr. Warren, Mr. Evans, Mr. Fred Bladwell, Dr. Hardyman, Mr. W. C. Richards, Mr. Drew (representing the Discharged Sailors and Soldiers), Mr. Perrin, Mr. Mould, and Miss Planiger. The duty of the committee is to consider the question of a suitable site and to report the same to a general meeting to be held at a later date.

Dr. Hardyman, on behalf of the relatives of the fallen, thanked the promoters of the proposed memorial for the action they had taken with a view to keeping green the memory of those who had lost their lives in the great war.

A vote of thanks to the Chairman concluded the meeting.

No press report has been found for the dedication of the Widcombe memorial, only that of Lyncombe.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of 24 Jul 1920 p22:

The Rev. L. R. Hancock, Vicar of Holy Trinity, Richmond, and a former vicar of St. Mark's, Lyncombe, who preached a sermon at the dedication of the parochial war memorial on Wednesday evening, mentioned that the late Admiral Lord Fisher was frequently a member of his congregation, and always followed the sermon very closely. The late Admiral had, indeed, a well-established reputation as a critic of sermons, and the “Church Family Newspaper” recently described him as “an inveterate sermon-taster.

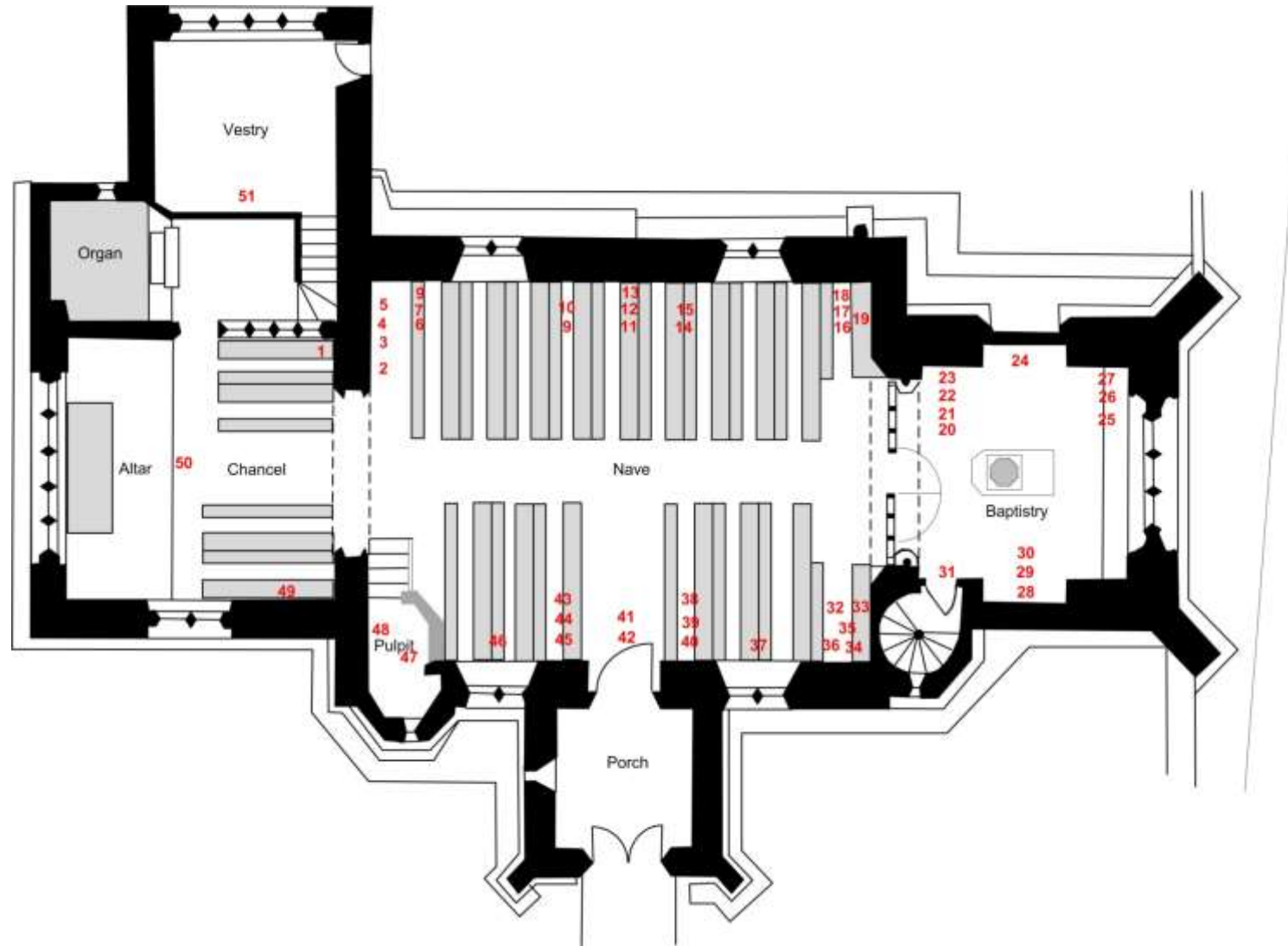



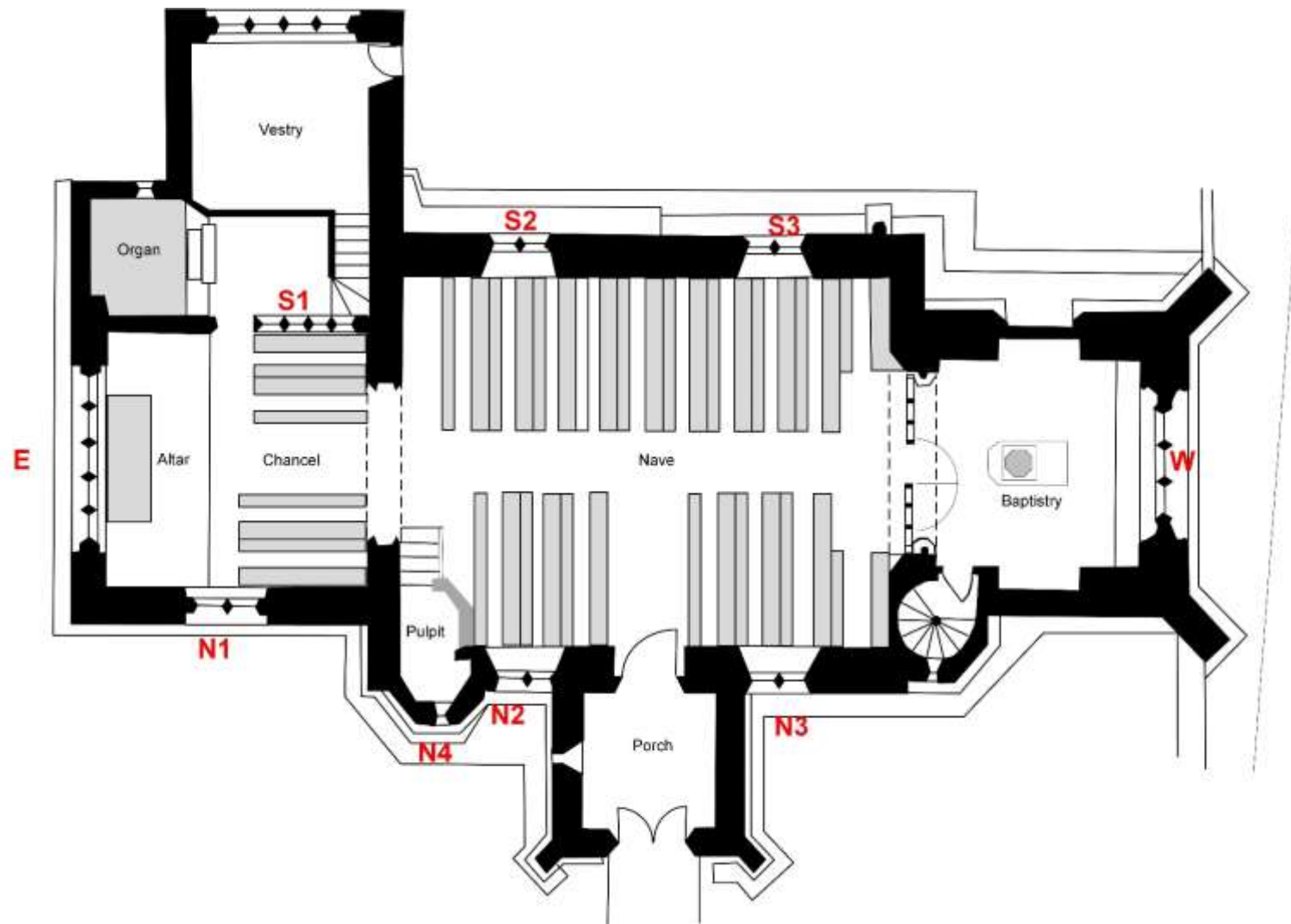
