The following regulations are made by The Parish Authorities for the management of the Procession on the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of May by order of a Vestry held the 16<sup>th</sup> day of May 1832.

The Vestry to assemble at Sydney Gardens at half past nine o'clock in the morning. Six pieces of cannon to be fired on the signal being given for moving. The Procession according to the Plan laid down, to move up Pulteney St., Laura Place, Argyle St. to the centre of Pulteney Bridge and return down Grove St. through Mr Hunts Garden and to embark in the Boats according to the plan laid down by Tickets only. (No Children on any account to be allowed to enter the Boats.) 28 Pieces of Cannon to be fired on embarking and the procession to move up the water and land at the Folly under a salute of 21 Pieces of Cannon, then to proceed along the boundaries of the Parish to Sham Castle where refreshments will be provided and 21 Pieces of Cannon will be fired, then to proceed along the boundaries to the Howard Field where 21 Pieces of Cannon will be fired, the Procession then to move down to the river side opposite to the South Parade where the Fisherman will be ready with his Boat to take Two Officers from thence up to the wears [weirs] and cross over to the place whence the procession embarked. The procession to move along the water side to Mr Hunts Garden there to witness the fisherman and officers landing. The Procession then to form in the same order as at the commencement and to return by the same route to Sydney Gardens, where it will be received with a Salute of Six Pieces of Cannon.

The arrangement of this Procession being confided to the Parish Authorities, it is particularly requested that every person forming a part of the procession will com[ply] to the regulations laid down.
