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Introduction



The church of St Mary Magdalene from the south

From the *Imperial Gazetteer of England and Wales* 1870-72 by John Marius Wilson:

CHEWTON-MENDIP, a village in Wells district, and a parish in Wells and Clutton districts, Somerset. The village lies under the Mendip hills, 51/2 miles NNE of Wells r. station; has a post office under Bath; is a seat of petty sessions; was the Ciwtune of Alfred's will; and gives the title of Viscount to the Earl of Waldegrave. The parish includes also the tything of North Widcombe. Acres, 6,514. Real property, £7,709. Pop., 976. Houses, 217. The property is subdivided. Chewton Priory is a seat on the site of an ancient monastery. There are lead mines, lime works, and guarries. The living is a vicarage, united with the p. curacy of Emborough, in the diocese of Bath and Wells; and, till 1867, was united also with Farington-Gurney and Stone-Easton, Value, £420.* Patron, R. P. Philpott, Esq. The church is partly Norman, and has a very fine late English tower, 126 feet high. There are chapels for Wesleyans and U. Free Methodists. Charities, £31.

The History and Antiquities of the County of Somerset by Rev John Collinson vol 2 on pp115-120 has a description and history of Chewton Mendip. The relates that the manor was in the possession of Queen Editha wife of Edward the Confessor (and sister of King Harold), that in the time of Henry II (reigned 1154-1189) was in the hands of Geffrey Martel, and was granted to Sir Edward Waldegrave by Queen Mary in the first year of her reign (1553-54).

An account of a meeting of the Incorporated Church Building Society reported that a grant had been made "towards enlarging or otherwise increasing the accommodation in the parish church of Chewton Mendip, near Bath". (*Bath Chronicle* Thu 27 Apr 1865 p3). The plan was to add 101 seats, 92 being free. (*Bath Chronicle* Thu 28 Sep 1865 p3) and £1000 was raised through the church rates (*Bath Chronicle* 4 Oct 1865 p3).

From the *Shepton Mallet Journal* of Fri 28 Sep 1866 p3:

CHEWTON MENDIP.

Church Restoration. —On Tuesday, the 18th inst., a sale of work in aid of the parish church restoration and organ funds, took place in the Priory grounds, Chewton Mendip, by the kind permission and under the patronage of the Right Hon. the Countess of Waldegrave. The weather was very unpropitious, but a large number of persons defied its inclemency, and attended the sale. Preparations had been

going on for many months, and an immense assemblage was formed of useful and beautiful, or on some other ground desirable articles, of which a considerable share was furnished by zealous parishioners. Many of the ladies of Chewton had worked indefatigably in the cause. By the farmers offerings were made in live stock, dairy produce, &c. To this department were sent sheep, geese, ducks, chickens, rabbits, cheese, and butter. Captain Bray, of the East Harptree Lead Mining Co., brought an interesting group of mineralogical specimens. consisting of ore of various form and stages, collected in part on the Countess of Waldegraves' mine property on Mendip. This assortment was presented by Captain Bray for the benefit of the funds. The Art Department, under Mrs. Adlam, The Firs, Chew Magna, was especially rich, containing drawings and paintings by Miss Claxton, A. A. Clarke, Frank, and Welby Pugin; etchings by Ward, R. A.; a collection of studies, heraldic designs, and scraps by Cipriani R. A., tempore George III. The Floral Department, which was committed to Miss Phipps, of Whitstone, Shepton Mallet, was very elegant and attractive. The list of visitors included the Countess Waldegrave and the Right Hon Chichester Fortescue, Sir E. and Lady Strachey, Mrs. Neville Grenville, Mrs. Tudway, Captain Scobell, Mrs. Hippisley, Captain and Mrs. Ivan Hippisley, Mrs. Charles Phipps, Miss Phipps, Mrs. Adlam, and many of the gentry and clergy of the neighbourhood. The day having proved unfavourable, and a large quantity of work of every sort remaining on hand, including

church, art, fancy, and poor work, it was intended, we understood, shortly to reopen the sale, which would then be held in the parish schools, and would include interesting and valuable contributions which arrived too late for exhibition on the 18th. The Restoration and Organ Funds were profited by Tuesday's sale to the extent of £130. But there was a large deficiency to make up. which it was hoped the coming sale would considerably reduce. The band of the North Somerset Yeomanry Cavalry attended, and in spite of the discouraging weather, played the whole day with admirable energy and precision.

From the *Chepstow Mercury* of Sat 18 Apr 1874 p4:

The old bells of Chewton Mendip church, which were seldom rung, and always with danger both to the ringers and the tower, have been re-hung and fitted with new stocks, wheels, gudgeons, &c., as well as with the Rev. H. T. Ellacombe's chiming apparatus.

From the Bath Chronicle of Thu 30 Jan 1879 p5:

The very fine tower of Chewton Mendip church has been so much damaged by bell ringing that the Diocesan Architect (Mr. Ferrey) has recommended the suspension of the ringing, if not entirely, at least almost so, and the rebuilding of the bell turret.



From the *Frome Times* of Wed 30 Nov 1881 p3: CHEWTON MENDIP.

CHURCH IMPROVEMENT.—During the past few months the heating apparatus placed some 20 years ago in Chewton Mendip Church, has been completely renovated, under the superintendence of Mr. Kelway, of Wells, whom it was first fixed. The cost has been nearly £30, which amount has been raised by voluntary subscriptions among the parishioners. A further improvement has been effected in the church by a substitution of lamps for the candles hitherto in use.

From the *Bristol Times and Mirror* of Sat 2 Nov 1884 p9:

At Chewton Mendip church there is a gargoyle which shows a poor old medieval "party" suffering from a grievous toothache, supporting his cheek with his hand, whilst he ruefully gazes at you!

From the *Bristol Times and Mirror* of Tue 31 Mar 1891 p6:

CHEWTON MENDIP. —Church Tower Restoration. —This work, which has been in the hands of the contractors, Messrs. Merrick and Sons, Glastonbury, since July last, is now rapidly approaching completion. The whole of the masonry work is finished, and the erection of the new west doors is all that remains to be done of the original contract. Messrs. Llewellins and James, to whom the work of re-hanging the bells was entrusted by the architect, begin the fixing of the new bell-frame this week, so that it is hoped the whole of the work will be completed by Whitsuntide. Mr. Charles Morley has just sent a contribution of £10 to the restoration fund.

From the Wells Journal of Thu 22 Sep 1892 p4: CHEWTON MENDIP CHURCH

To the Editor of the Wells Journal. SIR: I read in your paper a short time ago of the lamentable state of affairs in connection with Chewton Mendip Church. I could not credit that things were as represented in the paragraph to which I refer, and had looked for a denial of the accuracy of the report, or least an explanation, from either the vicar or the churchwardens. None has appeared in your paper, and from personal enquiries I have since made I find that matters are even worse than represented. It appears to be a fact that the choir of this parish, once the pride and envy of the neighbourhood, has ceased to exist, and has been allowed to collapse without any effort being made to keep it together. I am told that when in Easter week several of the adult members tendered their resignation, this was accepted without the

expression of the slightest regret or recognition by the vicar or other church official. The apathy of those in authority has chilled the ardour of even the most earnest and energetic, and at the present time there is not even a boy left! But, sir, this appears to be the only one outward sign of the decadence of church work in this extensive parish. I can remember the time when it was a pleasure to visit this village, as one was certain to find at the least a daily evening service well rendered chorally; now one finds the church open, but may wait in vain for a service. From what I can learn there are now no daily services of any kind, and though notices are given of a service Saints' days one is rarely held, and no one answers the summons the bells. The church is always open for "private prayer," but the register of services, &c., which lies in the vestry reveals the fact that services and communicants are rapidly decreasing. And not only are the services neglected, but even the beautiful building itself is being subjected to treatment very little short of Vandalism. Those who know the church and who in this district does not know it ?—will be shocked to find that the tiles on the east wall of the chancel on either side of the fine stained window have recently been covered with common wall paper similar to that used for the walls of dwelling houses! Surely, sir, there is something radically wrong on the hill, and remedy for the existing state of affairs should be speedily found. That something may be done to stop further retrogression. and to improve church matters in this important parish is the earnest wish of one who has frequently enjoyed the beautiful services in the grand old church, and who is proud to subscribe himself

From the *Wells Journal* of Thu 14 Jan 1893 p5: CHEWTON MENDIP.

CHURCH OF ST. MARY MAGDALENE.—The sanctuary of this well-known church has been considerably enriched by the presentation of a new altar frontal, with superfrontal to match, and a new superaltar. These are the generous gifts of Major the Hon. E. J. Boyle (churchwarden), the Hon, Mrs. Boyle, and Miss Boyle. The frontal and super-frontal are of the richest white brocaded silk, elaborately embroidered with powderings of sprays of spikenard (the emblem of the patron St. Mary Magdalene) and Tudor roses. The whole is wrought with most costly materials, and the intrinsic value is still further enhanced by the fact that it is the loving work of the generous donors. The super-altar, which is the special gift of Major Boyle, is old oak (taken from the church tower during the recent restoration) which has been beautifully carved -after an old pattern preserved in the church —by Mr. Fredk. Curtis, who in this instance has more than sustained his reputation. These costly offerings have added greatly to the beauty of the sanctuary, and have been greatly admired. A new pulpit hanging of elegant design and choice workmanship has been also presented by the same kind donors, together with beautifully wrought chalice veil and burse, in harmony with the new altar frontal.

From the Wells Journal of Thu 23 Dec 1909 p3:

The committee of the Chewton Mendip Churchyard extension have made excellent progress in their efforts to raise the necessary funds to carry out their scheme, and towards the estimated cost of some £130 over £100 has already been subscribed. It is hoped to commence the work early in the new year.

From the Wells Journal of Thu 31 Mar 1910 p3: CHEWTON MENDIP

CHURCHYARD EXTENSION.—A committee meeting was held at the estate office, Chewton Mendip, to consider tenders received from Messrs. Gait and Son, of Stone Easton, Mr. C. W. Harris, of Chewton Mendip, and Mr. J. Flower, of West Harptree, for the carrying out of work required in the churchyard extension. On the proposition of Earl Waldegrave, seconded by Mr. W. B. Carter, the tender of Mr. John Flower, of West Harptree, was accepted, and the work is now in progress.

From the *Shepton Mallet Journal* of Fri 7 Nov 1919 p4:

CHEWTON MENDIP

At a committee meeting of the Rat and Sparrow Club at the Waldegrave Arms, on

Monday evening, the secretary reported that 443 rats, 18 jackdaws and 62 sparrows had been accounted for since May, and 2,500 rats since the formation of the Club some two years ago.

A MEMORIAL CROSS erected in Chewton Mendip Churchvard was dedicated on Saturday afternoon in the presence of a large congregation of parishioners, which included the Earl and Countess Waldegrave, Lord Chewton, and Ladv Strachie. The Bishop of the Diocese was to have dedicated the Memorial, but illness prevented his attendance, and the service was conducted by the vicar (the Rev. J. A. Beazley). The Church was crowded, the congregation including a large body of ex-Service men. The vicar gave a short and appropriate address. The total cost of the Memorial is £220, the whole of which has been raised, and it is intended later to place memorial brasses, containing the names of the fallen, in the Church and Wesleyan Chapel.

From *The Central Somerset Gazette* of Fri 9 Oct 1931 p6:

The following faculties have been applied for in the diocese of Bath and Wells:— . . . to instal electric light and erect a memorial tablet in Chewton Mendip Church; . . .

From The Wells Journal of Fri 8 Jan 1937 p13:

CHURCH, COUNTY AND VILLAGE PAY TRIBUTE

FUNERAL OF THE REV. EARL WALDEGRAVE

In pouring rain, the remains of Henry Noel, 11th Earl Waldegrave, were lowered into new grave in Chewton Mendip churchyard, on Saturday afternoon.

The Church, the county and the village united to pay tribute to the memory of the kindly man who was better known as a simple parish priest than as the holder of an illustrious title.

The coffin was borne by tenants through lines of other tenants and members of the Chewton Mendip branch of the British Legion, whose standard was dipped in salute

The coffin was met by the Vicar, the Rev. P. Cromwell Bush, and, preceded by the crossbearer, the full choir and many robed clergy, the coffin was borne to its place in the chancel. The officiating clergy were the Bishop of Bath and Wells, who read the prayers, Preb. Randolph, who read the Lesson from Revelations, Rev. P. C. Bush, and Preb. le G. Horton Starkie. who acted as Bishop's Chaplain. The 23rd Psalm was chanted by the choir and congregation and two of the late Earl's favourite hymns-"Through the night of doubt and sorrow'," and Blessed are the pure in heart were sung. The organist, Mr. G. Purnell, played "Marche Funebre," and the Nunc Dimittis was sung as the cortege left the church.

The grave was lined with evergreens and on the coffin rested a cross of red geraniums, lilies of the valley and lilies, from the Countess.

The mourners were the Countess Waldegrave (widow), the Viscount Chewton and Viscountess Chewton (son and daughter-in-law), the Lady Dorothy and Mr. Thomas Randolph (daughter and son-in-law), the Lady Elizabeth and Mr. George Randolph (daughter and son-in-

law), the Lady Sophia and Mr. John Schilizzi (daughter and son-in-law), the Lady Irene Waldegrave (daughter), Mr. Richard Randolph. Mr. Herbert Randolph (grandsons), the Lady Margaret Nicholson (niece), Mr. Reginald Nicholson. Mrs. Van Oss (great niece) and Mr. Tom Van Oss; Mrs. W. H. Tregening, Miss Florence Pastard and Miss Bridget Bastard (sistersin-law), the Viscount Wolmer (cousin), Mr. John Conran, Miss Frances Conran, Miss Joana Bastard arid the Rev. W. T. Trelawney Ross (nephews and nieces).

Those present in the church included the Marquis of Bath, Lady Hylton, Lord Strachie, Archdeacon of Bath (Ven. S. A. Boyd) . . .

The Chief Constable of Sometrset was represented by Supt. S. C. Edwards, who was accompanied by P.S. Coombs.

The bearers were Messrs. A. V. Purnell, J. Furze, R. Middle, W. Spencer, S. Middle and L. Parry.

The British Legion contingent was commanded by Admiral Ward.

The floral tributes included those from the Chewton Mendip Estate, farm tenants, estate office, repairing staff, woodsmen, keepers and gardeners, the indoor staff at Oddgest, the Church choir and others.


From The Somerset Guardian of Fri 3 Nov 1939 p16:

A faculty has been sought to enclose a portion of the churchyard at Chewton Mendip for the burial of members of the Waldegrave family, and to erect a tomb over the grave of Henry Noel, 11th Earl Waldegrave, priest.


The church was in a benefice with Emborough but Emborough church was declared redundant and passed to the Church Conservation Trust and is used for 'champing'. In 2022 it was described as being part of benefice of 'Chewton Mendip w Ston Easton Litton etc' but all contacts lead to the parish office of St Thomas, Wells.

Occupants

In the period 1813-1912 the vast majority of those buried were from the parish with only small numbers from neighbouring parishes. There were only about 1% who were in a workhouse, some at Wells and some at Clutton.




For the period from 1813, the age profile has 19% aged under 11 and 40 % aged over 70.



The occupations have been determined for about 100 individuals and for these about a half were labourers and about a quarter were farmers.

As would be expected for a rural community the vast majority (95%) of those buried were born in England,

For the period 1780 to present, of the approximately 3,000 burial entries, about 20% have their names on a memorial.



There is a peak in the number of burials in 1837 - with 39 instead of the more typical 25 per year - when there was an influenza epidemic.

Previous Surveys

The Gravestone Photographic Resource has 322 grave and 636 person records with thumbnail images of memorials and date from early 2020. The list is split into two sections with further parts for internal memorials, roll of honour and cremations. The names are those from the memorials and not

necessarily the full names as they appear in the burial register. There are various names which have no corresponding entry in the burial register and conversely omission of some memorials. There is some overlap between the two lists for the churchyard.

Numbering Scheme

The burial register gives the plot designation for only a limited number of entries. From the survey it transpires that those which exist are mostly limited to the eastern part of the new section. For other areas a numbering scheme has had to be devised. The areas are split into sections A - C.

For the 'old' section, the plots are not organised into a grid so a section letter is used followed by an arbitrary memorial number.

For the 'new' part (section D and E), the burial register specifies a row number and plot letter, but this is confined to the eastern part. The rows are labelled 1-16 and the plots A-S within each row. For the western part a similar scheme has been used. There are a couple of memorials in the western section where the burial register specifies the plot. However these duplicate plots in the eastern part and have been adjusted by designating the two parts as sections D and E.

The post-1992 register is with the parish and in early 2020 had 126 entries.

In the register for 1783-1812, some entries indicate that the individual was 'buried by the parish'. Other parishes just put 'poor' or 'pauper'. This was at a time when there was a tax on all register entries, with those for the poor being exempt.

Some parishes have some unusual forenames such as 'Farnham', 'Seward' and 'Worthy' which are limited to that parish. For Chewton Mendip there are occurrences of 'Angelo', 'Lamrock', 'Lessiter', 'Lias' as well as 'Farnham' and 'Seward'. The post-Reformation emphasis on the Old Testament led, as elsewhere, to some forenames being taken from those of characters found there such as Hezekiah, Enoch, Jehu and Elijah. For Chewton Mendip this fashion is less marked than neighbouring parishes.

The threat of removing the clergy's monopoly on registering life events by the introduction of civil registration led to some parish records being improved. For Chewton Mendip, the ages at death were added from 1810. Prior to that they are absent.

The locations of the graves have been added at some time against some burial entries. These take the form of a letter and a number. This practice started in 1958. Not all entries have such an annotation.

Of Note

The new section of the graveyard contains a massive slab set within kerbstones. This is inscribed with 'Farnham Budgett 1845 - 1914'. This refers to a tea merchant born at Bath who died aged 68 on 30 Jun 1914 at Bristol. A press report refers to him as 'a Bristol grocer'. There is no entry on the Chewton Mendip burial register and the *Western Daily Press* of Sat 4 Jul 1914 p12 states that the service would be at Stoke Bishop Church with interment at Canford Cemetery. Subsequently a number of relatives were buried in this grave.

There a couple of dozen names on memorials which do not have a corresponding entry in the burial register. This occurs when there is a reference to, usually, a pre-deceased spouse buried elsewhere. There are a few where the memorial is for an individual and no such explanation is appropriate (Edmund Alfred Church (1886-1971), Royston Edward Uphill (1939-2002) and Dorothy Ethel M Green (1888-1974).).

The Garden of Remembrance in the south-eastern corner of the churchyard has a flagpole and two


large wall plaques with names and dates for several dozen individuals. This area is for the depositing of ashes without a formal memorial other than the list of names. The parish's map of the area shows that some parts are the designated places for the burial of ashes. Other than the wall plaques, there are only two memorials in the area: a plaque for a former vicar and a square vase for someone named on a wall plaque. The burial register has nine entries which specify a burial of ashes in this area.

There are discrepancies between the memorials found in 2020 and those found in 2022. Some have different shapes, possibly because they have been replaced. A wooden cross by a tree at E.8.S is now a small headstone, the adjacent memorial of a cross on plinths in now a plaque and there is no tree.


A metal cross with an inscription states that there were some reburials in 1910, presumably this occurring when the southern extension was made.

Number of burials per year


Layout

For the purpose of identifying the surviving memorials, the churchyard has been divided into a series of sections A-E. For sections A-C the memorials are numbered sequentially as <section>.<number>. Sections D and E are a southern extension which have been laid out in a grid. For Section E the burial register gives the locations as <row-number>.<plot-letter>. The burial register gives the locations of two graves in Section D using the same scheme as Section E and this has been applied to the whole of the section as <section>.<row-number>.<row-letter>.



Chichester Samuel Parkinson-Fortescue, first Baron Carlingford, and second Baron Clermont, was a son of the late Lieutenant-Colonel Chichester-Fortescue, of Dromisken, County Louth. He was born on January 18, 1823 and took a first class in Classics at Christ Church, Oxford in 1844. Four years later he was elected member for his native county, which he represented till 1874, when he was defeated. He held successively the offices of Lord of the Treasury, Under-Secretary for the Colonies, Chief Secretary for Ireland, President of the Board of Trade, Lord Privy Seal, and Lord President of the Board of Trade, Lord Privy Seal, and Lord President of the Council. In 1874 he was created Baron Carlingford, and succeeded under second remainder as second Baron Clermont in 1887. In 1863 he married Frances Elizabeth Anne, daughter of Mr. John Braham, and widow of the seventh Earl of Waldegrave. Mr. Chichester Fortescue, by which name he will always 'be best remembered, was a Whig of the Whigs, an aristocrat of aristocrats, and an idol of ladies in society. During his wife's lifetime no parties were so select, and
		nowhere were invitations more eagerly sought for. Both in Somersetshire and Essex, of which latter county he was Lord Lieutenant from 1873-92, he gathered round him hosts of friends fond of country life and sports, and







Section E

This section is the eastern part of the churchyard's extension created in 1910. It currently has 16 rows with plots given letters A-S and towards the eastern end K-T.

From 1957, the burial registers have annotations which specify burial locations in this area. The burials in the section are mainly from 1937 with only two prior to this. The parish has a schematic map for this section which has been annotated with the names of those buried against each plot.

There is an area set aside for burials for member of the Waldegrave family. This along with the Garden of Remembrance are treated in separate subsections of this document.







		This Tomb with its super recumbent figures is popularly known as "The Bonville Monument," The Strachey MSS. (page 11) say "Birth Lord Bonville and his lady are interred in the Chancel."
		The architecture of the Tomb agrees with the date of the death of William, Lord Bonville, son of Sir William Bonville of Chute in Devon—viz: 1461; William, Lord Bonville inherited the Manor of Chewton from his mother Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of Sir Henry Fitzroger. The dress and armorial bearing show that the effigies are not those of Bonville or any member of his family on the male side. The arms of the Bonville's are bands and mulets: those on the jupon of the male figure are three lions rampant, two and one. On the camail there is a small shield charged with the arms of St. George. These insignia seem to identify the effigies as those of Sir Henry Fitzroger and Dame Elizabeth his wife. In the Inquisitions there is the following: "Henricus Fitzroger pro ordine fratrum sanctæ crucis juxta turrim London, Chew Manor 3 acres terra Somer." This explains the Cross on the small shield.
		In Berry's Dictionary of Heraldry there is found among the Fizrogers one who bore for his arms "gules, three lions rampant or."
		There is no colour now visible on the shield of the effigy.
		This Fitzroger died in 1350. His wife died in 1388. The Inquisition take at the time of his death runs "Elizabeth uxor Henrici Fitzroger militis Chewton Manor et hund: Somerset." The dress of the two figures agrees with the date of the death of the wife i.e. 1388. Probably these effigies were sculptured in the dress of the period at which the survivor of the persons represented and were placed on a tomb in the style of architect their grandson Willam, Lord Bonneville. This would explain the incongruity between the tombs and its effigies.
		The 'inquisition' referred to is the inquiry into a death. 'Inquisitiones Pro Mortem' was the name given into investigations into deaths usually performed by justices of the peace.

There are various accounts of the life of John Braham (1774-1856) who was a noted English tenor opera singer.

The death of this eminent vocalist on Sunday morning last, though from his advanced age not taking the public by surprise, has still been an unexpected announcement to many of his brother professionals who had but recently met him in his accustomed haunts, looking as well as he had done for the last ten years, and conversing with his customary liveliness and good humour. One whose name has been before the theatrical and musical world for three-quarters of a century can certainly claim a page in the future biography of celebrities that every year is blotting out from the records of the present. The various errors that have appeared in the different dates furnished by some of our contemporaries have induced us to supply an original memoir, the materials for which have been derived from the best sources, and we


