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Introduction



The church of St Luke & St Andrew

From the *Imperial Gazetteer of England and Wales 1870-72* by John Marius Wilson:

PRISTON, a parish in Keynsham district, Somerset; 5 miles S W of Bath r. station. It contains Wilmington hamlet; and its post town is Bath. Acres, 1,850. Real property, £2,703. Pop., 292. Houses, 60. The property is divided between two. The living is a rectory in the diocese of Bath and Wells. Value, £384.* Patron, W. V. Jenkins, Esq. The church is ancient, was recently restored, and has two Norman arches and a tower.

From *The Church Rambler* by Harold Lewis (London, 1876) in a section on Priston:

The church is an ancient foundation as there are many proofs to show. It has preserved its original form and this and Englishcombe are the two churches in the district which suggest most clearly to the mind, as the Rev. Preb. Earle has said, what was the Norman Abbey of Bath, of which they were a miniature copy. It consists of a nave, with north and south entrance, a central tower and chancel. The south side is the usual position for the porch and the north doorway which generally shows that there has been a Norman church, is often walled up. Here however it has been preserved as an entrance to the vestry, a small modern addition. The tower had recently been rebuilt when Collinson wrote, and it is plain and uninteresting. It is a square tower in three stages surmounted by a very incongruous pierced stone parapet with finials. The nave was rebuilt in 1859 under the direction of Mr. C. E. Davis of Bath, by whom the handsomely ornamented Norman arches beneath the tower were inserted, according to the guidance afforded by a few fragments of the original bold and massive mouldings which were found walled up in the nave. The Norman windows under the tower are also remarkable for their fidelity to antiquity. The west window is a three light Perpendicular window, and there are also two small windows high up on the north side. On the exterior gable of the nave is surmounted by an old gargoyle used as a finial. The parapet on the south side is supported by Norman corbels under the leads. The chancel was restored in 1869 by the advice of Sir G. G. Scott. With the exception of the roof it is a beautiful specimen of the best style of geometrical Decorated.

From *Kelly's Directory of Somerset 1923*:

PRISTON is a parish and village, 2 miles north from Camerton station on a branch of the North Somerset section of the Great Western railway and 5 ½ south-west from Bath, in the Frome parliamentary division, hundred, petty sessional division and union of Keynsham, county court district of Bath, rural deanery of Bath (Bath district), archdeaconry of Bath and Wells. The church of St. Luke is an ancient edifice of stone, chiefly in the Early Decorated style, consisting of a chancel, nave and a central embattled tower containing a clock and 6 bells: the doorway is a fine example of Norman work, and there are several memorial windows: in the church is a shrine and a marble tablet, erected in memory of the men connected with the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18: the church has been restored, and affords sittings for 150 persons. The churchyard was enlarged in 1897. The register dates from 1723, but is imperfect. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £450, including 8 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of Capt. William Vaughan-Jenkins, and held since 1916 by the Rev. Robert Moore Peile Butler M.A., of Pembroke College, Cambridge. The charities amount to about £14 10s. yearly. Capt. William Vaughan-Jenkins, who is lord of the manor, and Earl Temple J.P. are the principal landowners. The soil is clay and stone brash; subsoil, stone. The chief crops are wheat, oats and barley, and about half the land is in pasture. The area is 1,864 acres; rateable value, £2,697; the population in 1911 was 267.

Wilmington is a hamlet, 2 miles north from the church, and by a circuitous road.

Sexton, James Parfitt.

Post Office.—Percy Long, sub-postmaster. Letters through Bath. The nearest money order & telegraph office is at Farmborough, 2 miles distant. Public Elementary School (mixed), erected in 1865, for 60 children; Mrs. Rosina Florence Richards, mistress.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 28 Jun 1860 p6 in an article by Charles E Davis on the Antiquities of The Neighbourhood of Bath in a description of South Wraxall Manor House:

“The arch to admit carriages is very depressed as is common to the style,; above which is a very pretty battlemented Oriel, the corbel supporting it bearing the arms of Long, and on one of the labels is the marshall’s lock, the badge of the family of Wayte, through whom the Longs obtained the Manor of Draycot, which was formerly held, according to Aubrey, by “*petit Sergeantie*,” viz., by being marshall at the king’s coronation, which was the reason the Cernes who held it prior to the Waytes, gave the marshall’s lock for their cognizance. (This badge is carved on the font of Priston Church, near Bath.)



From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 26 Jul 1860 p6 in a continuation of the above article:

Priston Church, two miles from [Dunkerton Church] going south, is now under restoration. The decorated windows of the church possess considerable merit. The tower is in the centre, and though, unfortunately, it is exceedingly ugly on the exterior, having been rebuilt during the last century it was originally Norman, to which proper character it is now under process of restoration.

The tower being in the centre of the church is now a rarity for churches in the locality. Other than Priston, an example is Lullington which also has some surviving Norman features. Early Norman churches were cruciform with a central tower but later churches have the tower at the western end.

From the *Western Daily Press* of Sat 25 Jan 1896 p6:

CAFE CHANTANT.— On Thursday afternoon and evening a café chantant was held at the Corn Hall in aid of the fund for heating Priston Church. The affair was well patronised. An Excellent entertainment was provided, the performers including Mrs Ellett, Mrs Weston, Mr J. Adamthwaite, Misses Freake, Elliott, Martyn, Edwards, Gibbs, Cooper, Baker, and Jones, and Messrs Gouldsmith, D. Mildred, and E. C. Cripps.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Sat 9 May 1931 p8:
MANOR OF PRISTON

A faculty has been applied for to erect a memorial to “William Vaughan-Jenkins, Esqre, of Combe Grove, Lord of the Manor of Priston and Monkton Combe, who died September 23rd, 1876, aged 63.”

Mr. Vaughan-Jenkins, was well-known in Bath and the county, particularly in hunting and steeple-chasing circles. On the granting of the faculty, the memorial will be erected by Captain W. Vaughan-Jenkins and Col. W. H. M. Freestun, C.M.G., D.S.O. Many members of the Vaughan-Jenkins family lie buried in Priston Church, where

there is a family vault, and the church contains memorials to them dating back some hundreds of years.

Priston Colliery, now closed, was sunk and worked for some years by Capt. Vaughan-Jenkins.

From the *Bath Weekly Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 19 Sep 1936 p17:

A disgraceful outrage was found to have been perpetrated at Priston Church, on Friday.

When the caretaker, Mrs. Millen, entered the church she found that hassocks had been thrown all over the place, the organ had been opened and the organ stops pulled out, and the church plate, which is usually kept in a cupboard had been removed to another place, and a wreath which was on the little Ware Memorial shrine in the church had been torn down and placed in the porch.

In the course of an interview on Saturday, the Rector, the Rev. A. Barnes said, “I have not placed the matter in the hands of the Police. I regard it as the work of irresponsible youths. I am keeping the church locked up for the present.”



From *Good Morning* of Sun 14 Jun 1944 p2:

Some weathercocks though attached to sacred premises, have a history which is in strange contrast to their hallowed precincts.

When years ago, a well-wisher gave a sum of money for the erection of a clock on the tower of Priston Church, Somerset, the amount of the gift far exceeded the cost. With the surplus it was decided to fix a weathercock in addition. Accordingly, the Priston parishioners being proud-minded folk, a bird was ordered for “one of the highest spires in England.”

In due course, to the delight of the waiting parish, there arrived a weathercock large enough for a cathedral. Even then some funds remained; so the good folk determined to celebrate the occasion in the good old-fashioned way. Filling the hollow bird with as much beer as it would hold – and it was many gallons—the villagers demolished the contents, then hoisted the empty cock to the top of the tower. And there, for many years now, proudly erect on one leg, it has fulfilled its appointed function.

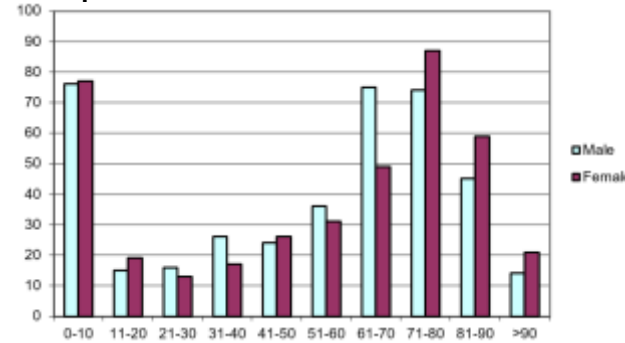

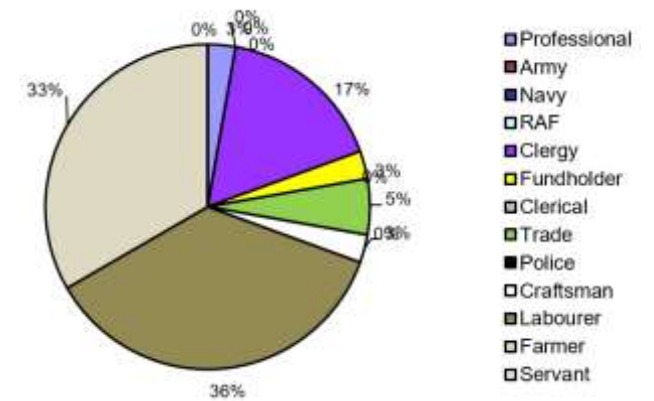

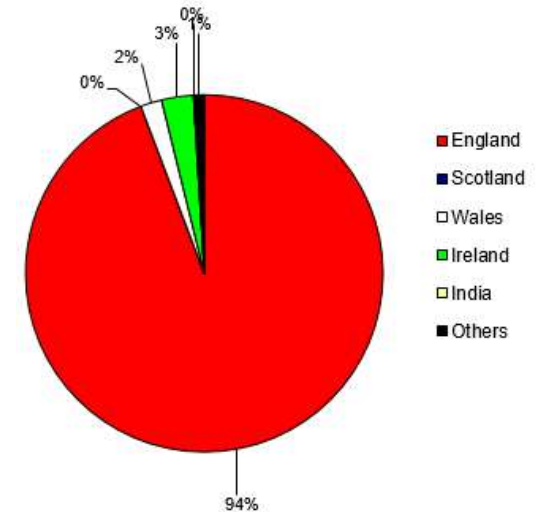
Occupants

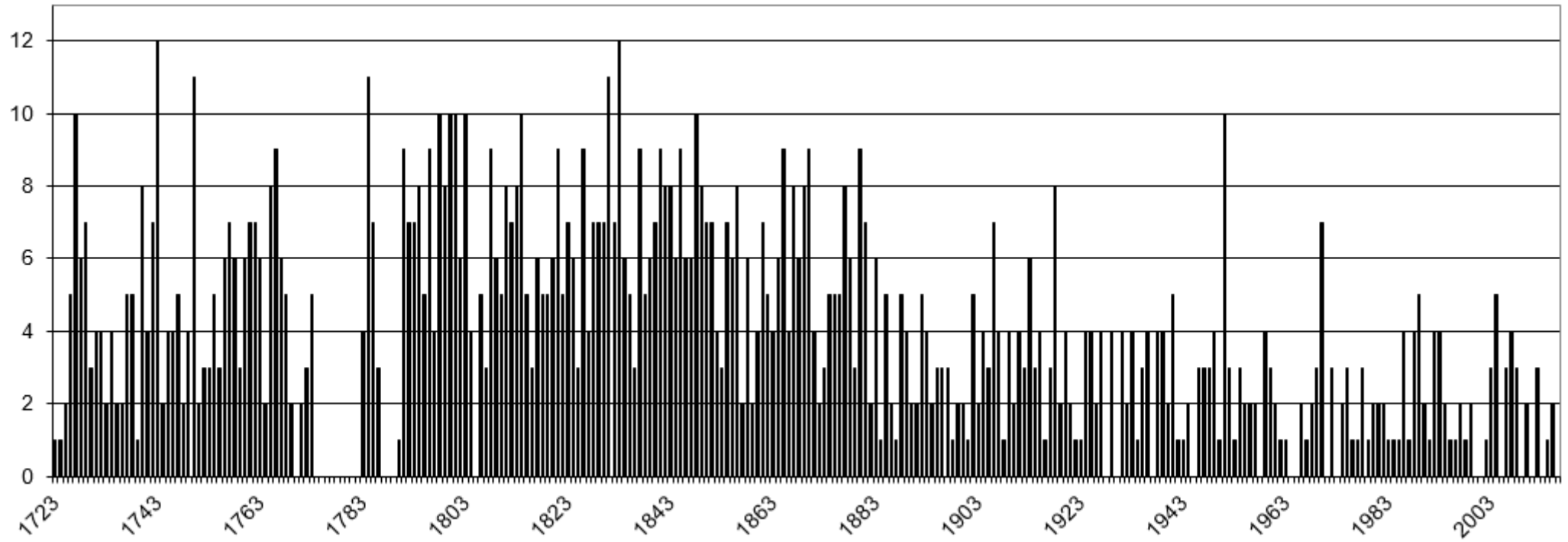

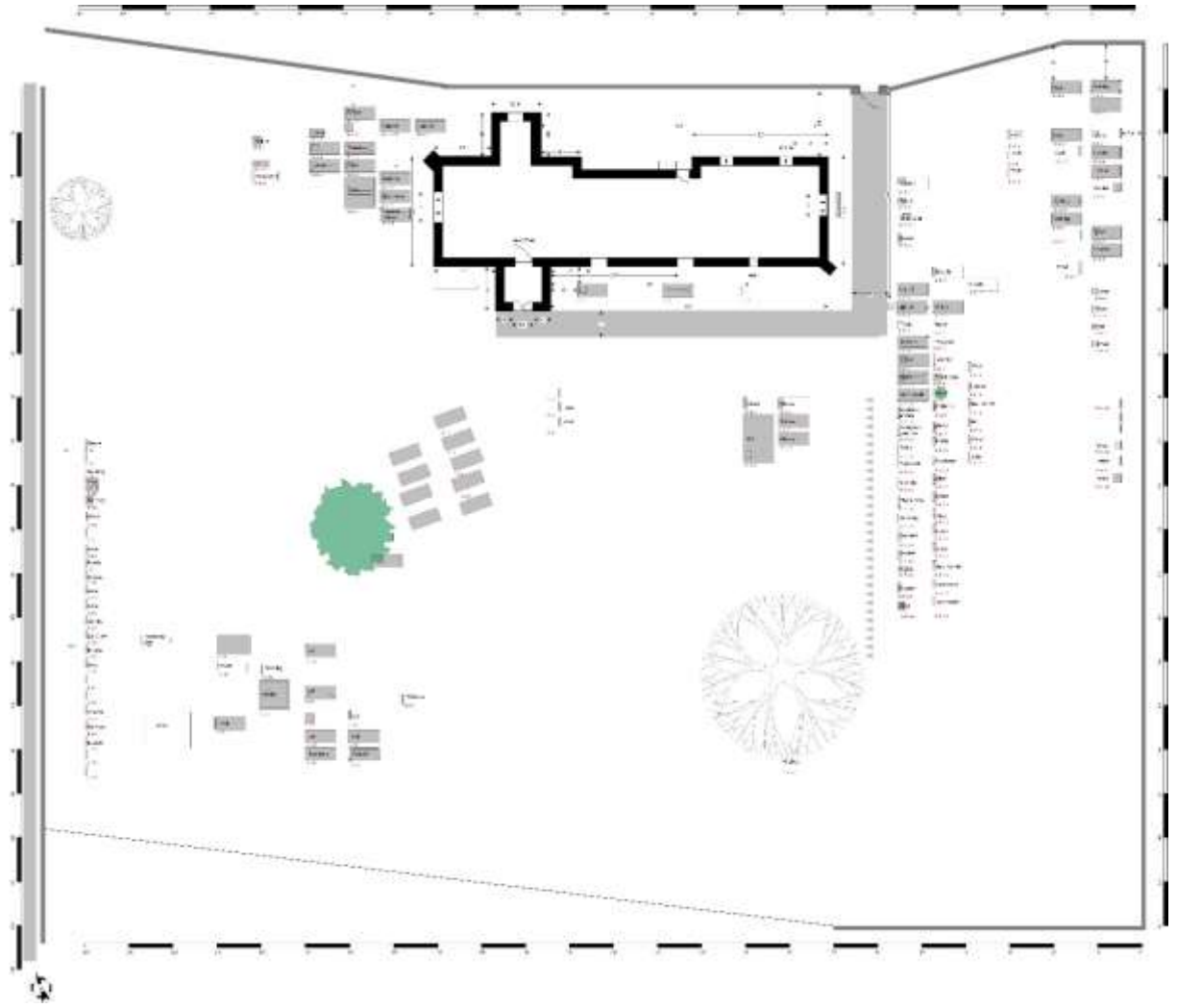

Layout

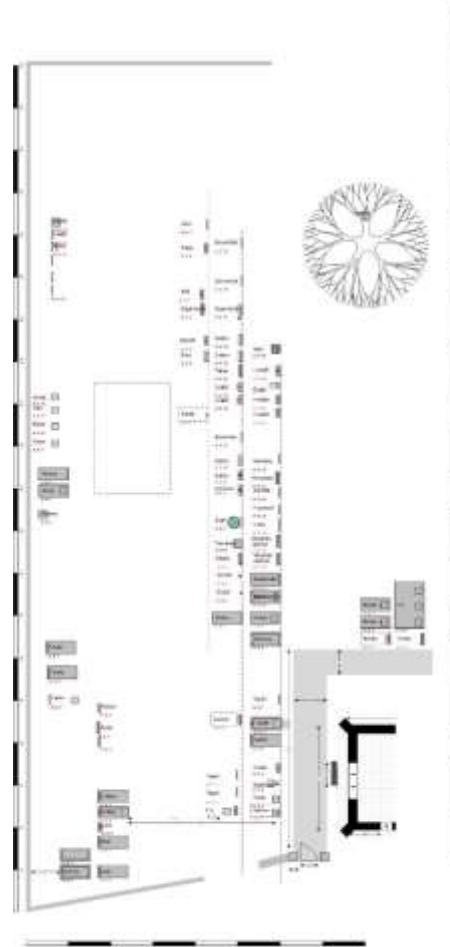


Churchyard

Eastern Section

The section is arranged in a sparse grid with a series of rows running north-south. The numbering scheme adopted is to assign a letter to each row or grouping and then a sequence number for each surviving memorial starting at the northern end.

The eastern boundary is a stone wall 200 feet (61m) long. The southern boundary is stone wall.

Southern Section

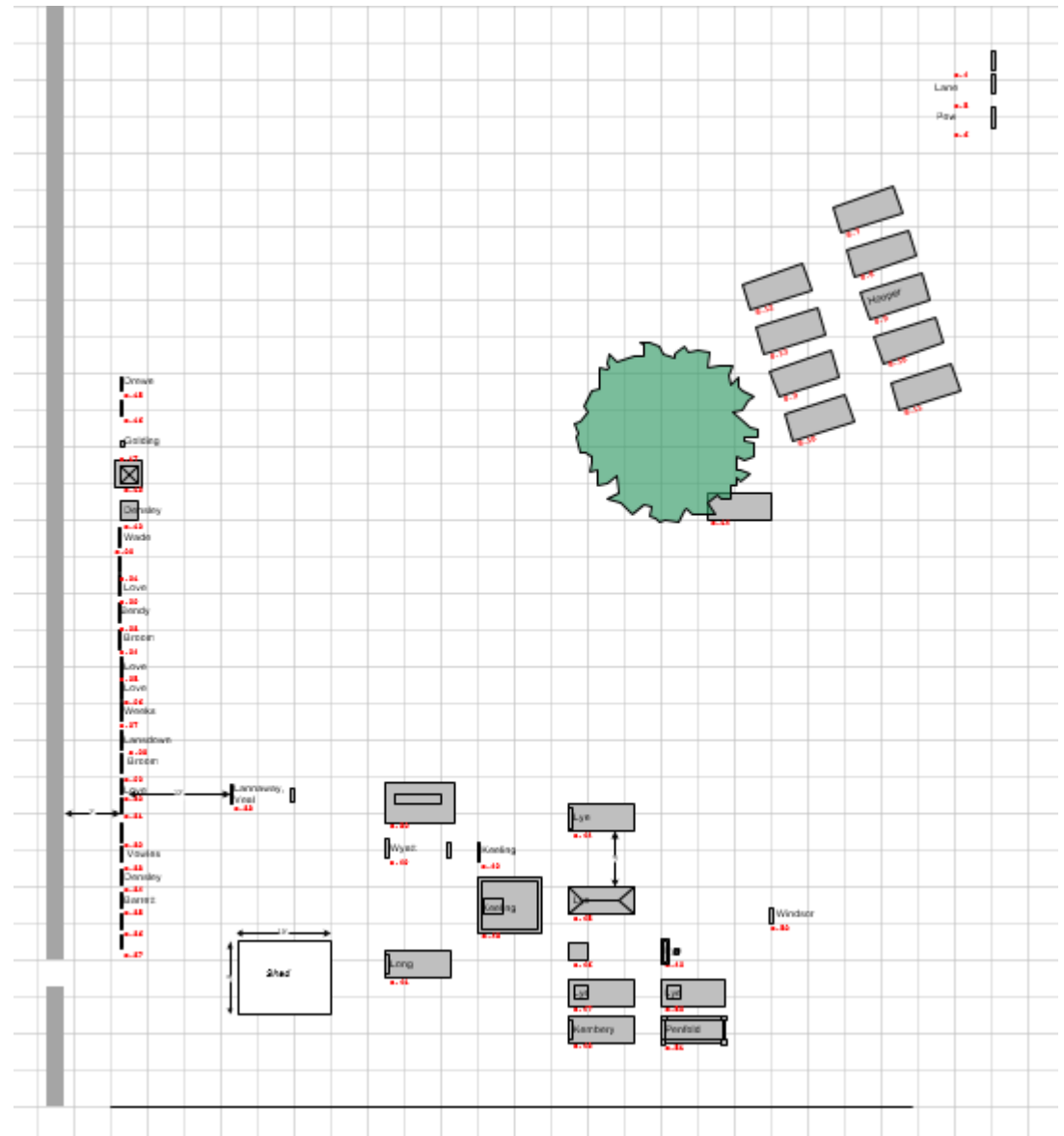
The memorials on the southern side of the church are in distinct groups.



- Three memorials immediately south of the church aligned with the church
- Three headstones and a group of altar/chest tombs
- A line of mainly headstones parallel to the eastern boundary
- A grid arrangement of 20th-century memorials

The line of memorials parallel to the eastern wall seem to have been moved from elsewhere in the churchyard as they are arranged closer together than is usual and in one case there is both a headstone and its associated footstone arranged in the same line but separated.

The altar/chest tombs are of a style from the 1700s and early 1800s. For the most part any inscriptions have been lost through weathering.

The southern boundary is shaded by large trees from an adjacent property.

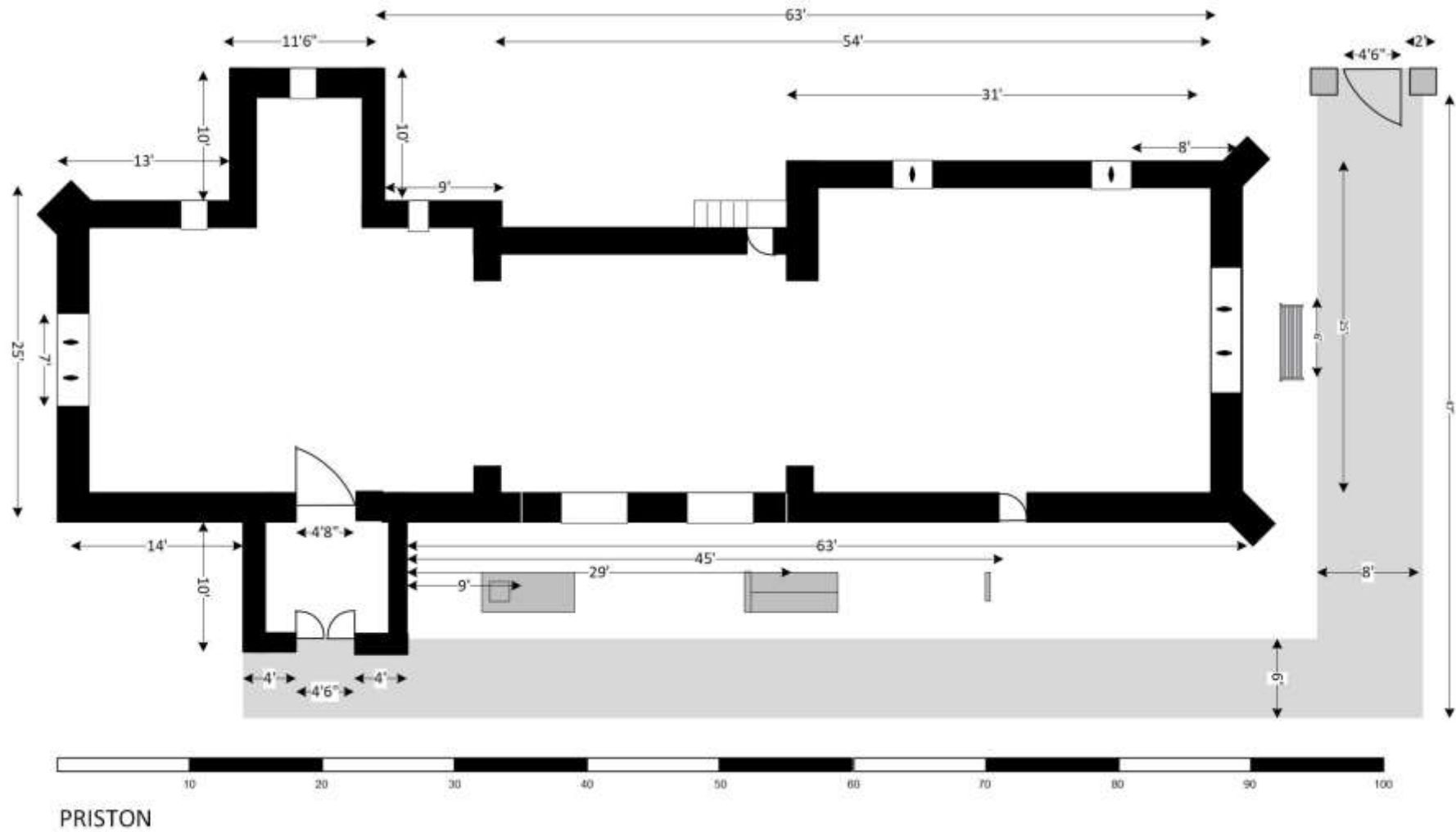
