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Introduction



The Chew Magna Baptist church

From *The Western Daily Press* of Thu 4 Jul 1867 p3:

LAYING THE FOUNDATION STONE OF A BAPTIST CHAPEL AT CHEW MAGNA.

Yesterday afternoon the corner stone of a new Baptist chapel was laid at Chew Magna by the Right Worshipful the Mayor of Bristol (Mr E. S. Robinson). For nearly 40 years the Baptists of Chew Magna have "been under the necessity of worshipping in a room of anything but spacious dimensions. It was only capable of accommodating about eighty persons, and was consequently much too limited in extent to meet the growing necessities of the Baptist denomination in that village. Accordingly steps were taken to increase the facilities for holding public worship, and the result has been the foundation of the chapel to which we now make allusion. It is to be built at no great distance from the present meeting place.

A piece of land has been purchased near the turnpike gate, and the erection of the chapel has already been commenced. The contractors are Messrs F. King and S. Bozley, of Chew Magna. The new chapel, which, by the way, is the only *bona fide* chapel of which Chew Magna can boast—the so-called chapels of the present time being merely meeting rooms—is to be a plain, substantial building. It will be built local stone, with freestone dressings. The dimensions are 43 feet by 24 feet. Attached to the chapel is a schoolroom, from which a vestry may be partitioned off. The schoolroom is to be 24 feet by 11 feet inches. There are also commodious outbuildings adjoining. The chapel in the interior is to be about 20 feet high. It is to have a Roman tiled roof, with ornamental crease. The entrance is from the north aide. Light is to be obtained from six circular-headed windows. Accommodation will be afforded for about 200 persons. An aisle runs through the centre of the chapel. The seats (open ones) are to be of stained deal, and the reading-desk is also to be of stained deal. The interior fittings will include Communion rail, &c. The building will cost about £450, exclusive of the purchase of land, which will bring the price up to £600. The erection of the building is under the auspices of the Bristol Baptist Itinerant Society. The plans and specifications and the superintendence of the building are the gift of Mr H. Lee, of Clifton. About £400 has been subscribed and promised towards the building fund up to the present time.

Some hundreds of persons from Bristol journeyed to Chew Magna yesterday to

witness the ceremony of laying the corner-stone of the sacred edifice. They were conveyed thither in breaks belonging to Mr Brookman, who supplied two, Mr Halcomb, and Mrs Tucker. The ceremony commenced at half-past three o'clock, in the presence of large number of people. A hymn was sung, after which the Rev. C. Clark, offered prayer. Mr G. Drinkwater, of High Street, treasurer of the society, then placed in a cavity in the stone bottle containing certain coins of the realm, photographs of the Mayor and others, the preachers' plan, the Baptist Itinerant Society's report for last year, a copy of the hymns sung upon the occasion, copies of the three Bristol newspapers, and a paper containing the following particulars of the laying of the foundation stone:—"The foundation stone of this chapel, erected the committee of the Baptist Itinerant Society for the worship of the Triune God, was laid by the Right Worshipful the Mayor of Bristol, Elisha S. Robinson, Esq., on Wednesday, July 3rd, A.D. 1867, and the 30th year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria. George Drinkwater, treasurer; Francis Read, secretary (officers of the Baptist Itinerant Society); George M. Carlisle, school secretary; Henry Lee, architect; Messrs King and Bozley, builders.

His Worship then laid the corner stone in the usual manner, making use of the following words:—"I lay this foundation stone in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. I declare the stone of this chapel to be now laid."

His Worship then addressed those assembled. He said had just had the

pleasure, and he might say the privilege, of laying the foundation stone of house of God in that parish, a house where the truths of the Bible would be faithfully proclaimed, and where the doctrines and faith of Protestantism would be held forth with power and strength, and he hoped with great effect in the salvation of many souls. (Hear, hear.) He was always glad to be engaged in good work of this kind. He could but hope that in that place of worship they would hear the truths of the Bible read and expounded, that the worship of God in singing and praises would be carried forward, that the teaching of the children would go forward in that place, and that the Church of Christ would be established within its walls. Oliver Cromwell had said that the truest mode of Church extension, the highest kind of Church progress, was the procuring of men who were living, spiritual temples. (Hear, hear.) But then they must have a building wherein men might hold forth and proclaim the high truths and the doctrines of Christianity, and he conceived it not to be essential that the men should be specially educated or set apart, for he considered that there were some outside those who were specially set apart who had preached the Gospel with great power and effect. He certainly did believe that in this country it was necessary that a large number of men should be set apart exclusively for the preaching of the Gospel, whether it was Baptists, Methodists, Episcopalians, or other denominations. But when Oliver Cromwell spoke as he did he did not mean the men who were exclusively brought up to and followed the profession of preaching; but if Cromwell had been living, and had been present there, he

would have said that the men belonging to the Bristol Baptist Itinerant Society very properly came within that class where they preached the Gospel of Christ. His Worship went on to say that the Word of God had been promoted greatly in Chew Magna by the Bristol Baptist Itinerant Society, and he (the speaker) said that places like that in the neighbourhood of Bristol had great claims upon Bristol. It often happened that the best people gravitated about the neighbourhood of cities where there were the means of increasing the wealth and prosperity of these large towns, and he had no doubt that Chew Magna had to some extent assisted in promoting the wealth of Bristol. He had noticed that the Itinerant Society had been in existence for about 40 years. And he had been informed by Mr Drinkwater that the number of its missionaries was about 20. He knew their self-denying labours, and he was glad recognise them upon that occasion. (Hear, hear.) He had noticed, too, that country places were not increasing in population in proportion to the great centres of industry. Having quoted the returns the populations of Chew Magna and of Bristol in 1831 and 1861, which showed that whilst Bristol had increased 60 per cent. Chew Magna had stood still, if it had not actually decreased in population, his Worship said he was glad to see so many Bristol people there that day to support so great and good a cause with their countenance, as he had no doubt they would by their contributions. The speaker then drew attention to the manner in which commerce had progressed throughout the country, whilst agriculture had not progressed in proportion. He hoped, and indeed he ventured to predict,

that, a bright future was before England with regard to agriculture. He had no doubt that before long agricultural labourers would be getting much better wages than they were now, and that agriculture generally would progress. He thought that the Chew Magna people had been very patient and painstaking people, He was told that they had waited for 25 years before they could get a piece of ground to build their chapel upon. He was glad they had secured it now, and that they had paid it for although they had not altogether paid for the chapel. His Worship in conclusion paid a handsome tribute to the worth the late Revs. T. Winter and Probert, of Bristol, members of the Baptist body, and expressed a hope that the ladies of Chew Magna would exert themselves to clear off the debt still due upon the chapel. Her understood that they had already raised £100. He trusted the edifice would be raised without accident, and that when raised it would long be a spiritual temple to the living God. (Hear, hear.)

Another hymn having been sung, The Rev. J. PENNY, of Buckingham Chapel, Clifton then delivered an excellent address on the subject of the distinctive Principle of the Baptist body. The rev. gentleman's remarks were considerably curtailed in consequence of a heavy fall of rain, which set in just before her commenced, and lasted to the finish, and indeed several hours after. The rev. gentleman before concluding made an earnest appeal for donations, and it was liberally responded to. The Mayor set an example by placing upon the salver that was laid upon the stone to receive contributions a bank note.

Another hymn was then sung, after which the Rev. R. P. Macmaster, of Counterslip, pronounced the Benediction.

In the evening a tea meeting was held under a tent, in a field kindly lent by Messrs J. and K. Light, and was attended, notwithstanding the inclement state of the weather by about 600 persons. The tent was neatly decorated with mottoes, conspicuous among which was one which bid a hearty welcome to the Mayor, ministers, and friends. After tea the Mayor took the chair, and addressed the company, and Mr, Drinkwater, the Rev. T. A. Wheeler, C. Clark and other gentlemen, afterwards delivered addresses.

The 150th anniversary was celebrated in Nov 2017.

From the *London Evening Standard* of Sat 19 Jul 1873 p3 in a list of official announcements:

The following buildings have been duly registered for solemnising marriages therein, pursuant to the act of, 6th and 7th Wm. IV., cap &5 : – South Croydon Congregational Church, Aberdeen-rd. district of Croydon - Primitive Methodist Chapel, Back-lane. Hesketh-with-Beaconsail, district of Ormskirk– Chew Magna Baptist Chapel, Stone, district of Clutton.

From the *Somerset Standard* of Sat 26 May 1888 p8:

CHEW MAGNA. BAPTIST ANNIVERSARY.- The anniversary services in connection with the Baptist Chapel were held on Sunday, when two sermons were preached by Mr. E. Blewett. On Monday a public tea was held in the schoolroom adjoining the chapel, when over 100 partook of refreshment, after which there was a public meeting in the chapel, when addresses were delivered by Messrs. Wellings (chairman), Blewett, Tucker, Roberts, (Dundry), and Bodey. The balance showed an expenditure of £15 8s. 9d., receipts £23 6s 3d, leaving a balance of £7 17s 6d., as against £1 13s. 6d. last year. This result was due to the envelope system having been established during the past year. The collections during these services (£3 5s.) were in aid of the chapel renovation fund.



Burial Register

The chapel has a single burial register. This has a note at the front dated March 1919 on the charges for burial. Otherwise, there is no indication when the burial ground was established because the first few dozen entries do not have dates of burial. The entries have preprinted numbers but a single entry may have multiple names. Based on the names and

declared ages, the years of year have been established where these are missing. This leaves a residue where there is insufficient information to establish dates.

The earliest entry found is for Edward Horton Kingston who died on 12 Feb 1877. This entry is numbered 24 and prior entries have dates after this.

The last entry is numbered 111 and is for a burial in 1998. Memorials have a further 20 names.

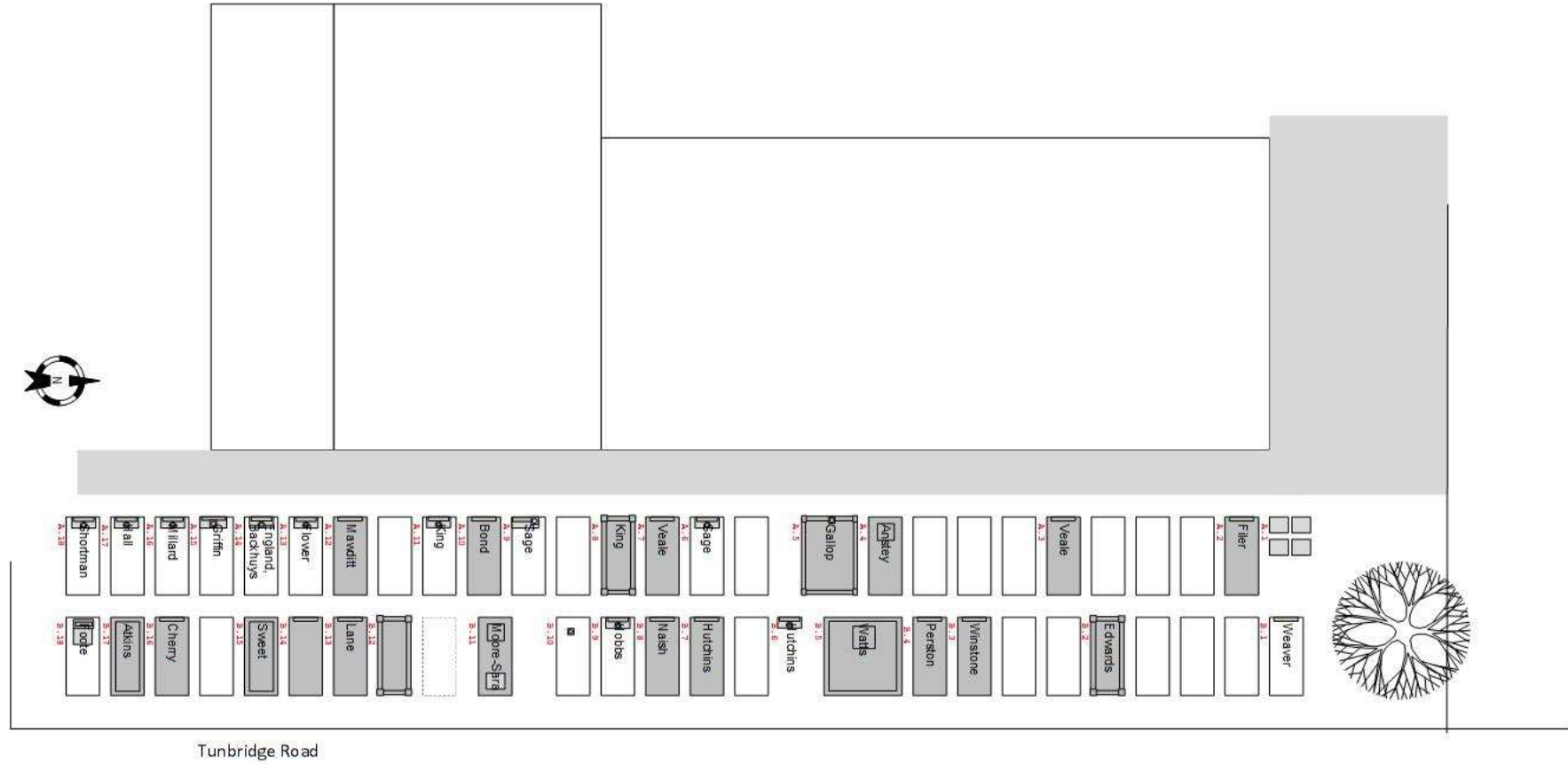
Previous Surveys

It would seem that in neither case has the burial register been used or the names checked against death registers etc. Thus a memorial with name 'Charles' is actually for 'Samuel Charles'. Another memorial has the forename 'Frederick' but the forenames in the burial register are 'Frederick William Innes'.
