## Introduction

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 31 May 1849:

A large quantity of lead was removed, by thieves, from the roof of Claverton Church, on or before the night of Friday last. We understand that similar depredations have been lately committed in other places in this neighbourhood.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 15 Jul 1858:

CLAVERTON CHURCH.—During the progress of the alterations now being made at Claverton Church, there has been discovered a fresco of remarkable beauty, the main feature of which represents the Archangel Michael, grand in manner and bold in execution. There are, or were—for the wall on which it was painted is now demolished—other figures and many beautiful borders. An effort was made to arrest the progress of demolition until next week, when the Archæological Institute will meet in our city, but it was found impossible to keep the wall standing so long. This painting was most likely the original decoration when this interesting church was built. Beneath the plain white-wash, which for years was at intervals given to the interior of the church, texts of Scripture had been written. The family of the Rector, who are expert artists, have made clever drawings of the principal figures.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 15 Jul 1858 p8 in a letter from Sidney H Widdrington:

The argument before the Vestry was the consideration of what protection a parish might have against its burial ground being appropriated by neighbouring parishes, and it was thought that the only remedy was the imposition of a fee that would, in amount, be almost prohibitory. At this moment a conversation I have had many years ago rushed into my mind, wherein one told me that, so beautifully secluded was Claverton Church, that the only way to prevent it being filled up with interments was to fix a prohibitory fee, and that fee was £300. The time alluded to was in the incumbency of the Rev. Harvey Marriott. I have written to him on the subject within these few days, and he tells me, in reply, that I was mistaken in the

amount of the fee being £300 in his incumbency, that it was really only £50; still, though I was misinformed as to the amount of the fee, yet the latter sum is sufficient to sustain my argument that the fee was an amount almost prohibitory.

(In the 19th century a skilled workman could expect to earn £1 a week and the annual rent for a house was between of the order of £15.)

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 11 Nov 1858 p8:

CLAVERTON CHURCH.

THE RECTOR of CLAVERTON, while returning his grateful acknowledgements to those Friends who have already so kindly and liberally assisted him in Restoring and somewhat Enlarging the Parish Church, takes this opportunity of making it known that, as the work has proceeded, unexpected defects in the old structure have become apparent, so that it has been found necessary to rebuild nearly the whole Church, including the Tower.

These additions to the original estimate are, as may be supposed, considerable, and towards defraying the cost of them, the fund already provided fall far short of what is required.

Under these circumstances the Rector feels reluctantly obliged to make an Appeal to his Friends and the Public for further aid to his endeavours to restore, and, it is hoped, improve, the Church of Claverton, which, with its quiet and sequestered Burial Ground, has so long been an object of attraction to the Visitors of Bath, and is likewise associated in the minds of many of its Residents with hallowed feelings, the remains of those dear to them having found a resting place within its sacred precincts.

Contributions will be thankfully received at the Rectory; or at the Bank of Messrs. TUGWELL and Co., where a Book is open for that purpose.

A new organ was added in 1882 (*Bath Chronicle* Thu 4 May 1882 p7).



From *Primitive Sun Dials or scratch Dials Containing a List for Somerset* by Dom Ethelbert Horne (Taunton, 1917):

CLAVERTON CHURCH

19. This dial when first seen on July 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1913, was on a quoin, upside down in the foundations of the s. porch, on the eastern side. In 1914 it was removed to the face of the S. Porch, on the E. side of the doorway. When in its original position it was 16 inches above the ground, it is now about 7 feet. The noonline is 4 inches in length, the stylehole  $3\frac{3}{8}$  inches in depth by  $\frac{7}{8}$  of an inch in diameter, its original aspect was due E. and is now S. Type 5c. July 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1913.

The discovery of this dial led to its being removed from its ignominious position, and to its being placed where it probably was originally, before some fairly late “restoration” of the porch had it consigned to the foundations.

A report of a lecture by the book’s author to the Somerset Archæological Society in the *Bath Chronicle* of Sat 17 Jan 1914 p8 states that the repositioning of the scratch dial at Claverton was



“thanks to the interest and co-operation of Mr. Gerald Grey”.



In June 1914 a new chiming clock was dedicated by the Archdeacon of Bath (*The Bath Chronicle* Sat 6 Jun 1914 p3).



The *Bath Weekly Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 28 Mar 1936 p26 has an article referring to the ‘bent final on the gable of the south porch of Claverton church similar in design to the twisted finial on the east end of the chancel at Bathampton.’ The conclusion was that such bent finials were the usual ornaments on tithe barns.

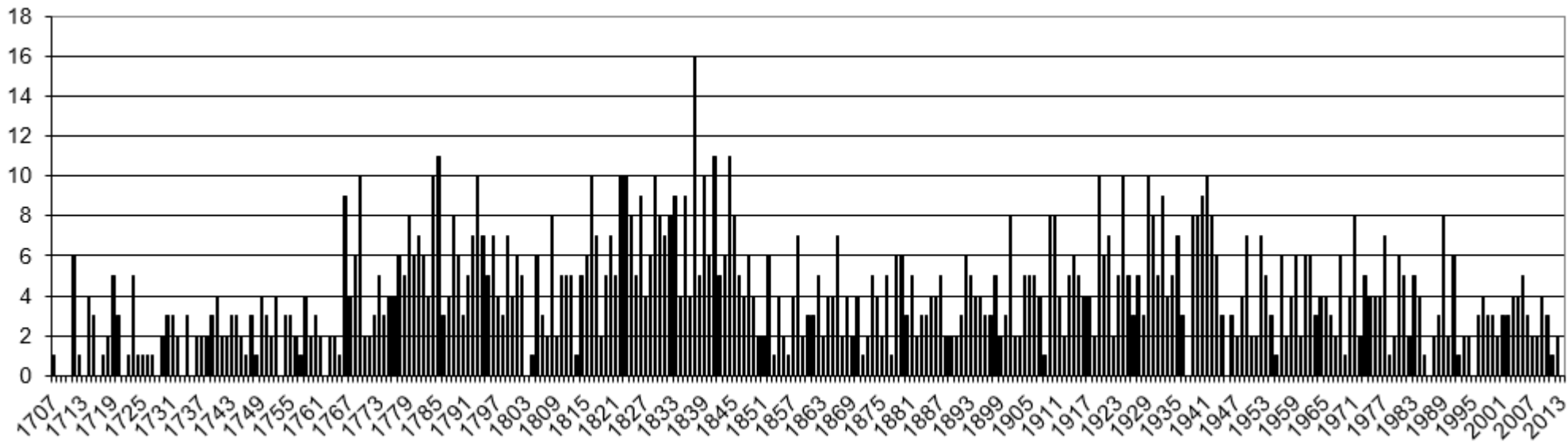


From the *Bath Weekly Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 17 Jan 1948:

In the current issue of “Home Words” is reproduced a photograph of one of the windows in Claverton Church, near Bath, which depicts the rescue of St. Peter from the sea by Our Lord. The apostle is shown with an anchor tattooed (sic) on his right fore-arm, just above the wrist—a somewhat unusual feature.



The hopper for water on the southern side of the church has the initials ‘WB’ and the year 1628. The church, extensive land (1500 acres, 607 hectares) and vineyards was purchased by Sir William Bassett in 1608 and remained in his family for almost a century



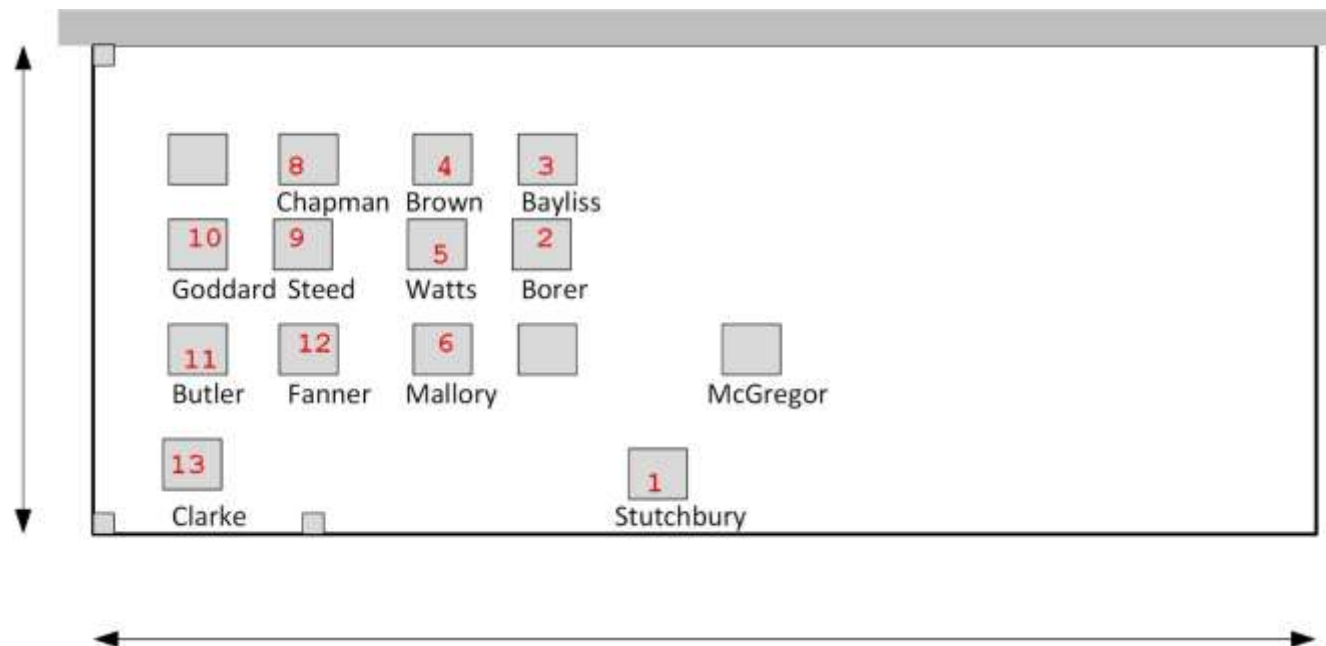
