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Introduction



The abbey church from the east

From The Bath Chronicle of Thu 9 Oct 1873 p5 col f: ST. GREGORY'S COLLEGE, DOWNSIDE.-Yesterday week the foundation stones of the new church and collegiate and monastic buildings were laid amidst much ceremonial. Archbishop Manning presided the ceremony, and he was accompanied by Bishop Clifford, Clifton, the Bishop of Newport and Menevia, the Cistercian Abbot of Mount St. Bernard's, Leicestershire, Monsignor Capel, Monsignor Parfitt, Dr. Neve, the Vicar-General of the Diocese, Dr. Williams, President of Prior Park College. and among the Benedictine clergy, to which Order Downside belongs, was the Very Rev. Dr. Sweeney, of Bath. The ceremony commenced with Pontifical High Mass, celebrated Dr. Clifford. After the Gospel the Archbishop preached, taking his text, "One body and one spirit," Eph. iv., 4. After Mass, the music of which was strict Gregorian, a

procession was formed and moved through the grounds the college to the spot where the stones to be laid were prepared. The chief stone, forming the base of the north transept of the church, was laid by Archbishop Manning; the stone of the college by the Bishop of Clifton, and that of the monastery by the Bishop of Newport. At the end of the ceremony about £100 were laid upon the stone, but in addition to that the promises of contributions were very liberal. At the conclusion of the religious part of the day's proceedings the Benedictine Fathers entertained the visitors, numbering about 200, a luncheon laid out in the exhibition room of the college. The style of the new building, the architects of which are Messrs. Dunn and Hansom, of Newcastle, is mediaeval Gothic. The church, it is said, will be exceptionally grand, and with its lofty tower and spire will be a striking object to all in the neighbourhood. The building is to be constructed of stone from the neighbouring guarries at Doulting, which it may be mentioned furnished the material of the structure of Wells Cathedral and Glastonburv Abbev. The present Benedictine community purchased about 70 acres of land at Downside the year 1814, and removed thither from Acton Burnell Shropshire. By degrees they have increased their property to some 350 acres, and are known to have the best cultivated farms in their part of county of Somerset.

Thursday, April 30th, marked the Centenary of the settlement at Gregory's School Downside, near Bath, Various functions are to be held to celebrate this interesting event. On the actual centenary day there was a High Mass of thanksgiving with Te Deum. At Whitsuntide there will be a gathering of old Downside boys at the Abbey; on July 1st a centenary celebration dinner will be held in London, at which Cardinal Bourne has promised to be present; on July 30th there will be High Mass at Downside, at which the Bishop of Clifton (Dr. G. A. Burton) will preach and on July 31st, solemn Requiem Mass will be sung for deceased "Gregorians and Benefactors." Thus the Centenary will be observed with befitting dignity.

St. Gregory's School, which has always been attached to St. Gregory's Monastery, had its first home at Douay. After their departure from Douay during the French Revolution, the community of St. Gregory's became housed at Acton Burnell Hall, this shelter having been offered the Smythe family. As strange coincidence Acton Burnell Hail was burned down a few weeks ago. The community was at Acton Burneil from 1795 to 1814, when the migration took place for Downside. Sir Edward Smythe who had been such a great benefactor the community, from the time of their expulsion from

France died 1811, and his death made it imperative for another place of settlement to be obtained. In Henry N. Birt's comprehensive history of Downside. published some years ago it is recorded that Prior Kendal, who, at the demise of Dom Jerome Sharrock in 1808, had been intrusted with the Government of St. Gregory's, lost no time in writing to his friend, Bishop Collingridge, O.S.F., Vicar-Apostolic the western district, with the hope of securing a settlement within the limits his jurisdiction. Father Eldridge wrote to Dom Lerymer, who was also looking for an eligible site: "With you we think that Somersetshire possesses many advantages. However, we tie ourselves down to no particular county. The situation that shall possess the most permanent advantages is the one we shall fix upon." It is interesting to observe that before Downside was secured a site in the Isle of Wight was considered, while thoughts had been entertained of Challow House, Berkshire, Eventually the choice fell upon Downside, in the village of Stratton-on-the-Fosse, and on April 30th, 1814, the community at Downside and the history of St. Gregory's entered upon a new era. Here for one hundred years Gregorians have been housed and much has happened in that period. The development has been marked and the keynote has been progress, with the result that to-day Downside Abbey, with its school buildings, are among some of the architectural gems in a county so richly possessed of magnificent structures. There are now at Downside about 200 boys and the numbers have been steadily increasing during the last few years. It is an educational seminary which holds a foremost place amongst the Catholics of England. From the time that possession was

taken of "Manor House" in 1814 great extensions and enlargements have taken place. The transepts of the Abbey, the tower of which still remains unfinished. were opened in 1862 while the opening of the choir and Sanctuary of the Abbey Church were opened in 1906. The elevation of Downside to the dignity of an Abbev is referred by Dom Birt as follows: "The Holy Father, Pope Leo XIII, as mark of his esteem for the venerable English Benedictine congregation, and a sign of his appreciation of the work done by it in the past, graciously deigned, propria motu, to raise the three ancient houses St. Gregory's, St. Lawrence's, and St. Edmund's the rank and dignity of Abbeys, with all the rights and privileges thereto pertaining, by a bull dated June 29th, 1899,"

The blessing of the lady chapel took place on the feast St. Benedict in July. 1888, by Cardinal Vaughan.

The school premises have been very considerably enlarged of recent years and in May, 1912. Cardinal Bourne visited Downside for the purpose of formally opening the new schools. Anyone who was privileged to be present this function will not readily forget its impressiveness for the ceremony was performed with all the beauty and the dignity of the ornate ritual of the Catholic Church.

The eighties were eventful times for Downside and Dom Birt pens the following: "At the time of the Parliamentary general elections held the autumn of 1885, riots took place at Radstock and were expected to break out at Midsomer Norton on polling day. A large force of police was drafted into Norton, showing that the district authorities entertained grave fears for the public peace. As dire threats of special vengeance at the expense of the "—— papists" had

been made, every precaution dictated by prudence was taken against any attempted attack by rioters; for, infuriated as they were by strong partisan feeling, it was feared that perhaps some of the more violent of the "free and independent electors" might attack the monastery and school. The stained-glass windows of the church were therefore either boarded up or shrouded with tarpaulins, for there happened to a great heap of stones ready broken for road-mending purposes, which would have come in handy for windowsmashing. Twenty "special constables" were sworn in, including employees, lay masters, and stalwart sixth-form boys. This force undertook the preservation of peace and property throughout Stratton. Every "man" was armed with a truncheon. The corps was drilled and instructed in approved police tactics for such mob emergencies, and was divided into three sections, which relieved one another the duty of night patrolling. An officer in charge of each section visited the patrols, "communicating circumstances," while a mounted messenger was stationed in Norton ready to bring the first tidings of the advance of the rioters. The fire-engine was kept in readiness to pour water on man or flame. In case of attack, the reserve, consisting of the monks and picked boys, was to called out by the tolling of the great bell. Our preparations for giving the rioters a warm reception got wind, and with commendable discretion they refrained from trying conclusions with us, though it is said they had gathered for the purpose to the number two or three hundred. The affair fizzled out like damp squib; but the fear of attack was real and well-grounded. and the circumstances connected with it are worthy of record, and might furnish a

Thackeray with the subject of an epic poem."

From 1878 1885 Aidan Gasquet, who has been recently made a Cardinal, was headmaster of the School and Prior of St. Gregory's Monastery. The first Abbot of Downside, Edmund Ford, who was prior and headmaster from 1885 to 1888 (became prior again in 1894) was elected in 1910 and the second and present Abbot is the Right Rev. Cuthbert Butler.

In 2020, the monastic community of Downside Abbey was home to fifteen monks when the monastic community announced that it would move away from the present monastery and seek a new place to live. On 27 Oct 2021, the monastic community further announced - and it was reported in many newspapers - that as part of their transition they would move in Spring 2022 to the temporary accommodation of Southgate House, in the grounds of Buckfast Abbey, another Benedictine establishment. They left in early March 2022.



Memorials

The memorials are now standard as a black cast iron cross with raised letters coloured gold.



The inscriptions take the following form:

ANI MÆ IM PLO RA PA CEM

R.D. SEBASTIANI MOORE SACERDOTIS: OBIIT 28 FEB 2014 AET 98

R·I·P

The forenames are in Latin and in the genitive case. For the monks, the forename is that of the saint's name adopted when entering the order, which may or, more likely, may not correspond with forenames given at birth.

St Benedict's has three headstones which were originally at St Gregory's as implied by inscriptions on their western faces. They were re-used for

memorials to nuns. These western-facing inscriptions date from 1844, 1902 and 1905.

In Row 7 are memorials to a pilot in the Fleet Air Arm and ten pupils. On 15 May 1943 a Sea Hurricane based at Yeovilton crashed on Downside Abbey's cricket field during a practice low-flying attack and the pilot as well as schoolboys were killed.

Burial Registers

It is unclear whether or not a burial register exists. If it does it would be expected to take the form of the *liber defunctorum* used at Bath for St John the Evangelist's cemetery at Perrymead.

The records of burials used here come from a list of burials, possibly just memorials, produced by volunteers which was provided by Steven Parsons, Abbey Outreach Officer. This has names, plot numbers and years of burial. It deals solely with the burial ground.



Findagrave has information on 68 individuals buried at Downside Abbey. While there is a picture of the main burial ground, it does not document these memorials systematically.

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


Number of burials per year

Layout

This document divides the burials into four sections:

- A the main burial ground 72' wide and 97' long with a double gate on the northern side. It is bordered on four sides by a hedge. It has 8 rows of memorials, the separation between memorials being 3'6". There are 201 memorials.
- B an additional burial ground east of the sacristy with 4 memorials
- C the abbey church which has a number of burials, some with effigies, as well as wall plaques.
- D the undercroft of the Lady Chapel



Burial Ground


The main burial ground is 72' wide and 97' long. It is surrounded by a hedge 2'6" wide. There are currently eight rows of memorials, The offsets from the eastern side are: 1', 8', 15', 29', 39', 57', 66' and 72', the memorials in the westernmost row being right by the hedge. There is double gate 5'6" wide which starts 39' from the eastern side.

The metal memorials are 2' wide and the distance between the centres of adjacent memorials is 3'6". The gravel areas by the memorials are 3' wide.

There is a tarmac path 8' wide running north-south leading to the gates. Another path outside the northern hedge runs east-west is made of flagstones and is 3' wide.

Although arranged in a grid, the memorials are not quite aligned between rows.

For rows 1-5, the numbers of the plots ascend going from north to south. This is reversed for rows 6-8.

On Tuesday evening it was found necessary to administer the last Sacraments, and when it was announced to him that this holy duty was to be performed, he lifted up his hands and eyes towards heaven and said the prayer which each day he had said at the Offertory of the Mass: "In spiritu humilitatis et animo contrito suscipiamur a Te Domine, et sic fiat sacrificium nostrum in conspectu Tuo, ut placeat Tibi Omnipotens Deus." The Blessed Sacrament was brought in procession from the church to his cell, and he most devotedly received the Viaticum and Extreme Unction, surrounded by his brethren. During the night he





He went to Downside at an early age, and the dearest earthy wish of his heart was that he might never leave the home of his education and religious profession. His wish was granted; for it was in the midst of his brethren that he died most happily after a long lingering consumptive illness, which in his case could scarcely be called painful, so perfectly did his patience conceal every sign of pain. He was buried in the conventual cemetery by the side of the late Bishop Morris, with the impressive solemnity attendant upon the Benedictine ritual. 


