Introduction



The church of St Margaret, Babington

In 1870-72, the *Imperial Gazetteer of England and Wales*:

BABINGTON, a parish in Frome district, Somerset; 5 miles WNW of Frome r. station. Post Town, Mells under Frome. Acres, 607. Real property, £1,448. Pop., 129. Houses, 25. The property is divided among a few. Babington House is the seat of W. F. Knatchbull. The living is a rectory in the diocese of Bath and Wells. Value, £170. Patron, the Rev. T. R. Jolliffe. The church is good; and there are an endowed school with £15, and other charities with £10.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 4 Jul 1844 p3:

In the House of Commons yesterday (Wednesday) week, Mr. Miles presented petitions from Babington, Kilmersdon, and other places in the country of Somerset, against the agitation of the Anti-Corn-Law

League, and in favour of protection to agriculture.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 4 Jul 1844 p3:

A grand ball and supper was given, last week, by W. F. Knatchbull, Esq., M.P., at his seat at Babington. There were about 200 visitors, including the Marquis of Bath, Lord H. Thynne, Colonel Sir William Miles, M.P., J. M. Paget, Esq., and family, and the *élite* of the neighbourhood. Dancing was kept up till five o'clock the following morning. The mansion was brilliantly illuminated by Mr. Symes, of Bath.

As reported in several newspapers, in 1862 the proprietors of the Westbury Iron works were prosecuted for obstructing the footway to Babington church by digging it up for a private railway to a coal pit. (*Wells Journal* Sat 12 Apr 1862 p2).

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 5 Jul 1866 p5:

SHOCKING COLLIERY ACCIDENT.—The adjourned inquest (as we mentioned last week) on the bodies of two men who were killed at the Newbury coal pit, Babington was resumed at the Anchor Inn, in that parish, on Saturday, by Dr. J. Wybrants. After hearing the evidence of Stephen Steeds, brother of one of the deceased, Abraham Hamblin, Mr. Lionel Brough, the Government Inspector, Sergeant Whitting, and Albert Plumber, the jury, after upwards of two hours' deliberation, returned a verdict of manslaughter against James Palmer, the engine driver, and William Baker, the manager of the works, and they were accordingly committed for trial at the ensuing Assizes, to be held at

Wells on the 3rd of August. Bail to the amount of £600 was offered and accepted.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 11 Feb 1869 p3 in an article on grammar schools in Somerset and Wiltshire:

We glean the following particulars relating to the endowed schools in Somerset, anciently founded for the primary instruction of boys and girls; they are styled non-classical schools because by foundation they were nor intended to afford instruction in grammar. At Babington (population 129) there is a school founded in 1758 by Elizabeth Long, which is managed by two trustees, by whom the teacher (a master) is appointed. The number of boys under instruction in 1867 was 8, who paid no weekly fee, and the whole endowment of the school, £15, is applied to education. There is a house for the teacher.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 11 May 1871 p3:

THE LATE MR. W. F. KNATCHBULL.—The remains of this lamented gentleman (whose death we noticed last week) having been removed from London to his late residence at Babington, were interred at that village on Saturday last in a new vault opposite the church door. A very large crowd of spectators was present to witness the ceremony at which the Rev. Prebendary Horner, of Mells, and the Rev. T. P. L. Yewens, curate of Babington officiated. The coffin was borne by six of Mr. Knatchbull's servants. The immediate mourners were the Rev. W. Knatchbull (brother of the deceased and heir to the property), Capt. Wyndham Knatchbull (both of Cholderton Lodge, Hants), Capt.

Wadham Knatchbull and Mr. Norton Knatchbull of Sherborne (nephews of the deceased). There also joined the procession Sir W. Miles (so long Mr. Knatchbull's colleague in the representation of East Somerset) and Mr. W. H. Miles, of Leigh Court, Major Paget, M.P., Mr. E. B. Napier, Mr. E. H. Dickinson, Mr. C. C. Tudway, and Mr. J. G. Mogg (magistrate for the county), Mr. George Mackay, solicitor, and Messrs. J. and C. Wainwright, stewards of the estates, and all the tenants on the Manors of Stratton, Stoke Lane, Holcombe, and Babington. On Sunday afternoon Mr. Yewens preached to a large congregation in the parish church an impressive sermon having reference to the melancholy event, his text being the 25th and 26th verses of the 6th chapter of St. John's Gospel.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 18 May 1871 p3:

DEATH OF MRS. KNATCHBULL.—The vault which received the remains of Mr. William Francis Knatchbull, of Babington, only a few days back, has been re-opened to receive all that was mortal of his widow, Emma Louisa, whose death took place somewhat suddenly in London, having survived her husband only nine days. The remains were removed to Babington over night, and the funeral took place at noon on Tuesday. It was attended by Mr. J. Gray, her brother, Rev. W. Knatchbull, Captain Knatchbull, Mr. Wadham Knatchbull, Captain Norton Knatchbull, Mr. Luscombe, and the family solicitor, Mr. Mackay, Mrs. Gray and Mrs. Gully, Mr. Wainwright, of Shepton Mallet (the agent), Mr. Blewer (butler), and Mr. Nicoll (head gardener). The rich violet pall was held by six of the principal tenants, Messrs. S. Steed, J. Steed, Swenton,

Butler, Osborn, and Ruth. The outer coffin was of oak covered with black cloth with bronzed mediæval handles and ornaments. The plate bore this inscription:— "Emma Louisa, widow of William Francis Knatchbull, Esq., died 11 May, 1871, aged 67 years." The burial service was jointly and very impressively read by the Rev. Prebendary Horner and the Rev. E. L. Yewens. After the service the members of the family entered the vault, and as a last tribute of affection placed elegant wreaths of flowers upon the coffin.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 30 Dec 1886 p2:

On Sunday evening the neighbourhood of Kilmersdon was visited with such a severe snowstorm as has not been known for many years, doing a considerable amount of damage to trees, especially in Lord Hylton's park, and also in Babington wood, where a great number of fine trees, the property of Captain Knatchbull, have been blown down in all directions. In the roads the snow in some places reaches a depth of four or five feet.

From *The Somerset Standard* of Thu 10 Jan 1902 p8:

BABINGTON.
CONCERT AT BABINGTON HOUSE.—A concert of classical music was given by Mrs. Knatchbull, at Babington House, on Wednesday, on behalf of the Babington Church Improvement Fund. Invitations to purchase tickets had been issued to all the gentry of the neighbourhood, and resulted in a large gathering, amongst whom being the Duchess of Somerset and party from Maiden Bradley, the Countess Waldegrave and Lady Margaret Knowles, Lord and Lady Hylton, Mrs. Horner (of Mells Park) and party, the Rev. F. and Lady Frances

Tufnell, Lady Paget. Mrs. Harvey Bruce and Miss Paget, Mr. and Mrs. Batten Pool, the Rev. W. A. Duckworth, the Hon. Mrs. Duckworth and party, Mr. and the Hon. Mrs. Helyar. the Rev, and Mrs. Randolph, Miss Jarrett and party, Mr. R. J. Bayntum Hippisley, Mrs. Henry Hippisley, and many others, while amongst those who arrived at the house for the concert were Mr. and Mrs. Napier Miles (of King's Weston), and Miss de Hochepped Sarpent.

...

An item of great interest in the programme was the singing of Mrs. Herbert Gladstone, who made her first local appearance since her marriage on this occasion, and this opportunity was taken for the presentation of a silver cup by those with whom she was so long associated in the operatic company of the "Babington Strollers." The Rev. S. Hailstone, on behalf of the "Strollers," asked Mrs. Gladstone to accept the gift with hearty wishes for her future happiness, to which the recipient made a most graceful reply. It only remains to add that Mrs. Knatchbull kindly played two pianoforte solos, and (as it seemed to many of the audience) with even more force and beauty of expression than ever. At the close of the concert the Rev. J. J. Coleman made a statement as to the financial position of the Church Improvement Fund. As the Rector of the Parish he thanked Mrs. Knatchbull and all those who had contributed to the success of the concert, which resulted in a sum of about £50 being added to the fund.

The press report of the funeral of Emma Pickford (1845-1913) in April 1913 refers to it being 'the first interment in the recently consecrated portion of the new burial ground at the parish church'.

From the *Western Daily Press* of Wed 24 Nov 1937
p8:

Restoration of Babington
Church

Mrs Knatchbull will give three concerts for the interior restoration of Babington Church, Frome. on Saturdays December January 1 and January 15. The artists who will assist her (on the dates when professional engagements permit) are Isolde Menges, Antonia Butler, Zara Nelson, Herbert Heyner, and Benjamin Dale. F.R.A.M. The Marquis of Bath will speak at the first concert. Lady Horner at the second, and Mr Cyril Maude at third.

From the *Shepton Mallet Journal* of Fri 24 Dec 1937
p5:

BABINGTON.
CHURCH RESTORATION FUND.

The Babington House concerts for the restoration of the little Wren Church on the lawns began it's series on Saturday last before an enthusiastic audience. The Marquis of Bath opened the proceedings with an explanation of the work to be done, and being—as he said—a staunch Conservative, he was exceedingly glad to know all the features of the church, including the old square pews, and the clerks desk, were to remain exactly as before. Madame Isolde Manges has never played better—she was absolutely brilliant—;—and the Schumann songs delighted her hearers. Lastly was Mrs. Knatchbull's playing, too well known in this neighbourhood to need description. It only remains to say that she appeared to be at her very best. It is seldom that country people are offered such

exceptional music as is promised at these concerts.

From the *Somerset Standard* of Fri 22 Jul 1938 p6:

The Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells, Dr. Francis Underhill, opened the afternoon performance by making reference to the many lovely Gothic churches to be found in Somerset, including the fifteenth century buildings at Chewton Mendip and Wrington. He had seen in the 'Times' a photograph of a church, and found to his great joy that it was in his diocese; it was a photograph of the little church at Babington, which was in need of restoration. Babington church was of the George II period, it had undergone no horrible restoration, it had lain forgotten until now. They were all most grateful to Mrs. Knatchbull for her help in working for its restoration.

From the *Somerset Guardian* of Fri 13 Oct 1939 p1:
Babington Church Work

Apropos of the note a few weeks ago, I understand that. owing to the war-time difficulty of raising further funds for Babington Church repairs, the architects, Messrs. Caroe and Passmore, have temporarily eliminated from the proposed work all that is not absolutely essential to save the roof from collapse. For this vitally important work a sum of about £260 is required, of which it is believed £197 is now available. A matter of £63 is thus needed before the work can be commenced. Anxiety is felt about the position, for, should the roof collapse, re-building will be far more costly than repair. The postponed part of the work originally specified by the architects includes repairs to the masonry, floors and windows, as well as the spraying of the

pews and floors to prevent the ravages of the death-watch beetle. This work will have to be done when circumstances permit, after the roof has received attention. On account of the isolated position of Babington Church. and the fact that most of the 248 inhabitants of the parish live nearer to other churches, the preservation of the church seems to concern lovers of buildings of architectural merit rather than the majority of the inhabitants. The latter have, however, done what they are able and have subscribed a sum in the neighbourhood of £40.

From the *Somerset Guardian* of Fri 22 Oct 1943 p7:
Babington Church

Sir,—In the account of the harvest festival held at Babington Church, which appeared in your last issue, I see that it is described as a Christopher Wren church. I think that your correspondent is in error. Sir Christopher Wren died in 1723, but, according to this month's issue of the *Kilmersdon* magazine, the church was not built until 1750. The description given conveys the impression that Wren built it himself, whereas at the most, it is a copy of one of his churches or built in his style. Perhaps someone interested in the church, would, through your correspondence column, endeavour to settle this point?

ALSO INTERESTED.

Yeovil.

The church is about 50 metres east of Babington House. It no longer holds regular services. It was designated as Grade I by Historic England in 1968. A group of three monuments to the east of the church have been designated as Grade II by Historic

England. These are described as “Three chest tombs. Two C17, one C18. Dressed stone. Oblong chests on plinths with hipped slab tops. That to John Shute to south dated 1688; that to north to Thomas Branch of 1779, though chest earlier. Chest to centre with all inscriptions decayed. Outer chests with fine C17 ornament.”

It is managed by a charitable trust whose objective to hold the lease to the Church and Churchyards of St Margaret's Babington in the Parish of Kilmersdon with Babington and to utilise the income generated by the property for the maintenance thereof. According to the latest accounts in 2018, income is mainly from holding events.

The parish itself is part of the East Mendip Benefice which also includes Coleford, Holcombe and Kilmersdon.

There is a Knatchbull chapel as a part of St Vigor's church, Stratton on the Fosse. Rebuilt in 1782 it forms the northern aisle. There are some Knatchbull burials there.

There are memorials to the east of a church and a separate rectangular area with graves arranged in a grid.

Survey

A preliminary survey was carried out in September 2022 to establish the general layout.

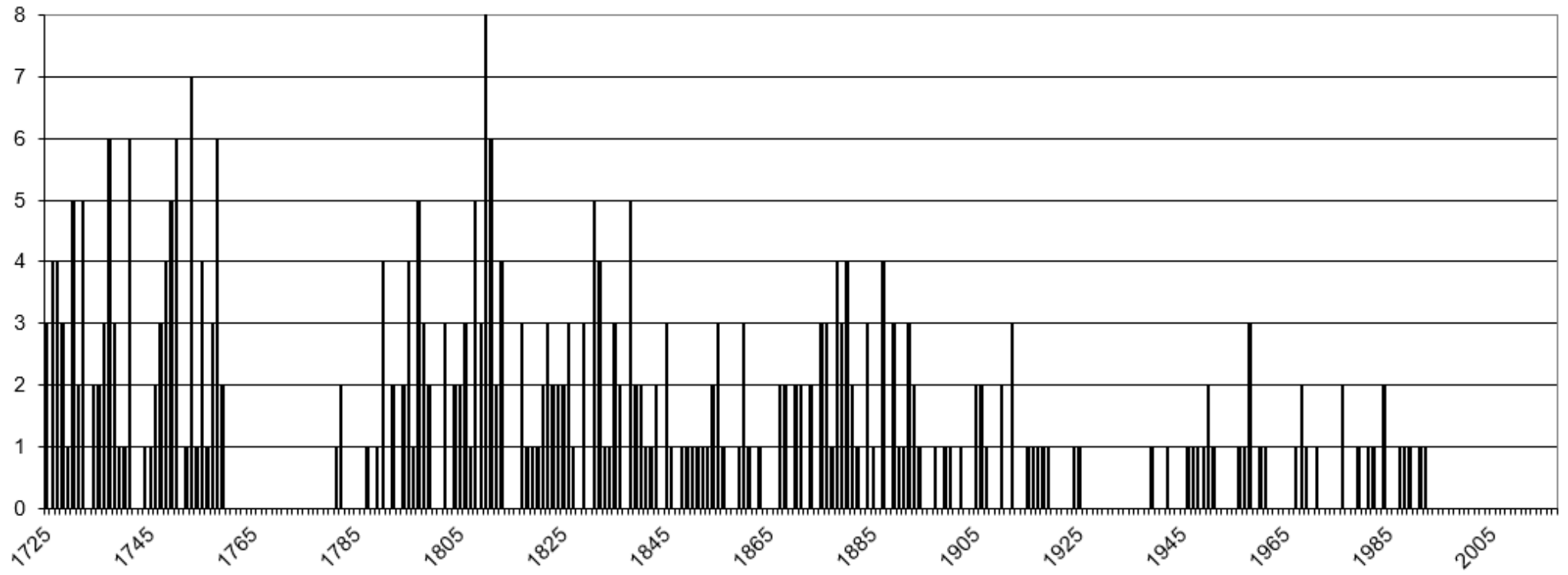

In the register with burials 1725-1804 there is an annotation that there was a retrofitting of entries in the late 1740s by enquiring of families. There is also a gap from 1760 to 1780. Ages are present from 1804 when a pro-forma register was used before the statutory registers were introduced in 1813.
