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Introduction



The chapel

Rode Chapel, High Street, Rode was Grade II listed in 1968. The justification for the listing includes “Baptist church. Dated 1780 on tablet. Random rubble, dressed quoins, coped gable to frontage, continuous moulded cornice extending across the base of the gable, slate roof. Plain 2-storey facade, 3 bays; Gothicised sash windows with glazing bars in semi-circular headed bead-moulded stone surrounds.”

The plaque actually has ‘1786’ and ‘Rode Chapel’ is variously described as Baptist, Methodist and ‘Baptist/Methodist’ and as a ‘Single Congregation LEPs with Baptist participation’ where LEP stands

for ‘Local Ecumenical Partnership’ where more than one Christian denomination is working together under a formal agreement. This arose because the Rode Methodist Chapel closed and the congregations amalgamated.

The Suspicions of Mr Whicher or The Murder at Road Hill House (2008) is a novel by Kate Summerscale which gives an account of a true-life crime which occurred in 1860 at Rode. 3-year old Francis Saville Kent, son of a Samuel Saville Kent, an Inspector of Factories for the Home Office, was found murdered, his body stuffed in an outdoor privy of Road Hill House. The person leading the investigation was Mr Jonathan Whicher. It was the sensationalist tabloid story of its time and one of the most infamous murders of the 19th century. The *Frome Times* reported the arrest of Elizabeth Gough, a nurse, and the arrival from London of Inspector Whicher of the metropolitan detective police. The nurse was released but then Edmund John Gagg was charged with the murder following his confession but this was retracted and he was discharged. Some five years later, the victim’s half-sister Constance Emily Kent (1844-1944) was arrested based on a confession she had made. She was prosecuted, convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment. After serving 20 years, she was released and emigrated to Australia. The book mentions the Baptist Chapel at Rode which has led to it being on a literary/crime itinerary. The story was made into a TV programme which was broadcast in 2021.



Burial Registers

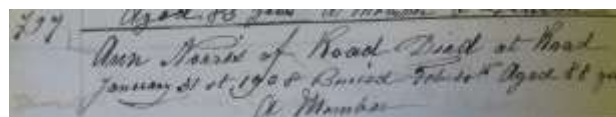

The first of these is a register of baptisms with a handwritten list of burials on the left-hand side of the pages at the front of the volume. It has a pre-printed title page with 'A Register for the Use of Congregations of Protestant Dissenters'. It is dated 1816 with 1817 on the cover but burials prior to this have also been entered. Entries are handwritten on a single line. It does not have abodes. At the end are burials after 1817, going up to 1853,



The second is the formal register, albeit a homemade one. It is not a register with pre-printed columns and entry numbers as would be found for an Anglican parish. Instead all entries are handwritten. The entries are numbered but have some missing in the sequence and some duplicates. The numbers end with 862 in 1979. Only 13% of entries have the name on a memorial. The entries do not, for the most part, give the names of children only stating 'child of'.

Previous Surveys

There was a survey by Robert Dainton in 2006 and the result put on a dedicated website which no longer exists. A further survey was carried out by the late Sir Mervyn Medlycott in 2007. In the latter, the six-page document states that "for most post-1837 memorials exact wording is not given on stones, but genealogical abstracts, giving all information in a concise form. Exact wording is however given for all pre-1837 and some other chapelyard, and all chapel interior memorials" and "I have not prepared a burial plot plan of the chapelyard." The memorials were numbered sequentially.

According to this document 'The former Rode Methodist Chapel is being converted into a private house (in 2007). I checked with the owner, but he informed me there are no memorials there.'

A spreadsheet was produced by Peter Harris with the names and dates from the memorials but omitting the burial dates and other information from the burial registers. This also contains a schematic map showing the locations of the memorials, the numbering this time using the section and a number.

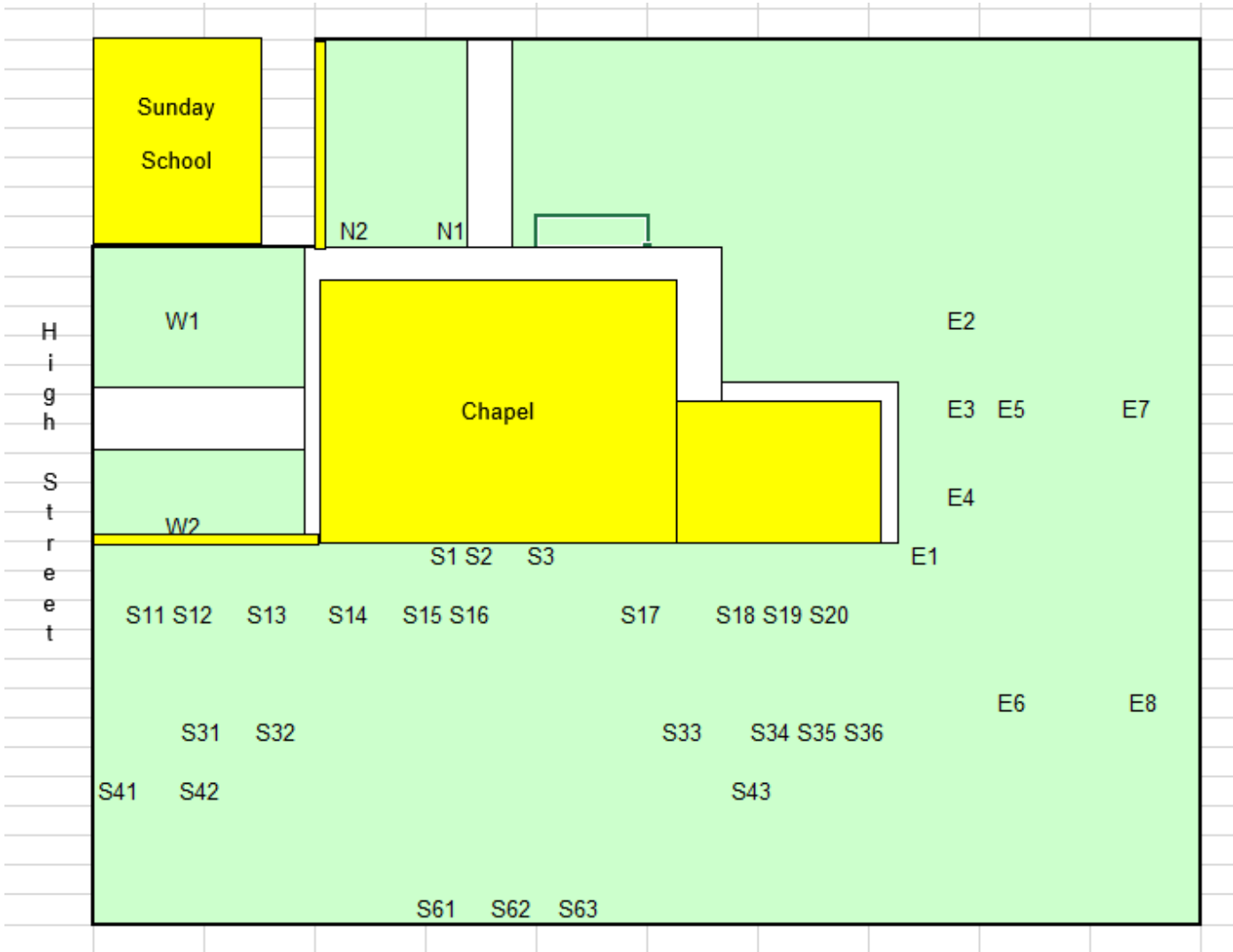
Current Survey

A visit to the chapel was made in Feb 2020. Photographs were taken of the internal and external memorials. A further visit was made in May 2025, after the burial ground had been tidied up and an area set aside as a 'quiet garden' with benches and a path. Various plaques affixed to a wall bounding this garden were found.

Since the previous surveys, some of the memorials have deteriorated and their inscriptions lost. Where the previous surveys have identified the missing text it is given here in grey.

The numbering scheme from the schematic in the spreadsheet has been retained here supplement by section 'X' for the plaques.

Layout



The chapel is oriented north-west/south-east. The memorials are arranged in a grid in rows parallel to this axis.

The numbering scheme from previous surveys has been retained in terms of the area (west, east, north and south). The numbers are broadly the same but the previous surveys were inconsistent in the southern section.

The western section, by the entrance, has only three memorials. The northern section has two memorials which are legible and two headstones that have fallen apart. The arrangement on the southern side is in rows, most memorials close to the chapel. The eastern section has a few memorials but less obviously in a grid arrangement.

The burial register does not indicate the location of burial which might have indicated section, row and plot. As a consequence, the memorials are allocated numbers in a sequence for each section.




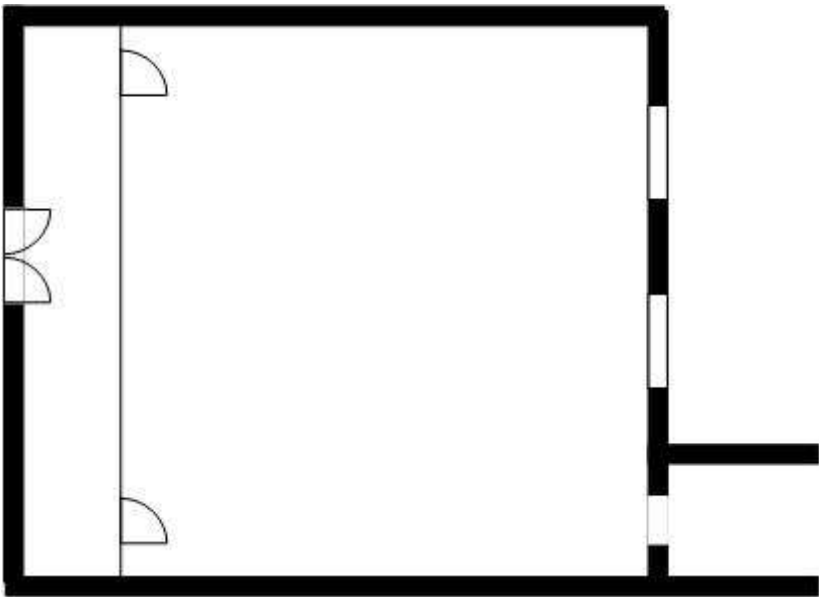
