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## Introduction



The church of St Nicholas, Kelston

From The History and Antiquities of the County of Somerset by Rev John Collinson Vol I p 127:

## KELWESTON [Anciently written KELVESTON]

Is a small parish three and a half [miles] northwest of Bath, on the northern bank of the river Avon, and in the upper turnpike road from that city to Bristol, by way of Kingswood. The road is as beautiful as can be imagined, being cut along a gently waving and dipping terrace, On the left is a rich vale, through which the Avon flows in a serpentine direction, having on its southern banks the villages of Corston, Newton, and Twiverton, with a fine lofty range of cultivated hills beyond them, which on that side bound the prospect. On the right, the still loftier

We have no account of this parish in the Norman record; but we find it was in very early times parcel of the possessions of the great abbey of Shaftesbury in Dorsetshire, and, as such, was in 1292 valued at 13l. Mabel (by some Matilda) Gifford, abbess of that monastery, procured a charter of free warren in all her lands here, 22 Edward I.

The abbess received a yearly pension of thirty marks from this manor. After the dissolution of religious houses, king Henry VIII. in the thirty-eighth year of his reign, granted this manor with those of Bath-Easton and Katherine, and the capital messuage called Katherine's-court, to John Malte and Etheldred Malte<sup>1</sup>, alias Dyngley, the King's natural daughter, begotten upon the body of Joanna Dyngley, alias Dobson. Which Etheldred was committed to the care of the said Malte, who was the king's taylor, for education: and the king, having special love and regard for her, granted these estates for her use and benefit; but she always passed for Malte's natural daughter. She was shortly married to John Harrington, esq; a confidential servant of the king, who thus obtained the several estates above-mentioned. . . . The chief residence

rumoured half-sister was imprisoned under suspicion of causing rebellion. She was present at the coronation of Elizabeth I on 15 Jan 1559 and she died that same month.

of the family was at Kelweston, and the manor continued in their possession till sold of late years to Cæsar Hawkins esq; created a baronet of Great-Britain July 25, 1776; whose grandson sir Cæsar Hawkins, baronet, is the present possessor. . . .

The old manor-house stood near the church, and was erected in 1587 by Sir John Harington, after a plan of that celebrated architect James Barozzi<sup>2</sup>, of Vignola. This house sir Cæsar Hawkins pulled down, and about twenty years since erected an elegant manor southward of it, on an eminence commanding a most beautiful varied prospect of the surrounding country, the Avon, and the city of Bath.

. . .

The church is dedicated to St. Nicholas. It stands at the western extremity of the village, and is a small low structure, seventy feet long, and nineteen wide, consisting of a nave leaded, and a chancel, and two porches tiled. The entrance into the south porch is walled up, and now serves for a vestry-room. At the west end is a square tower, forty feet high, containing four bells.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 26 Jul 1860 p6: Kelston Church, on the Bath side of the Avon is much delapidated, but is, I believe, about to be restored.

According to Pevsner's *The Buildings of England*: *North Somerset and Bristol*, 1958 the building was restored and rebuilt in the 1860s by B Ferrey. The 'B Ferrey' referred to is Benjamin Ferrey (1810-1880) who, after being educated at Wimborne Grammar

range of Lansdown-hills rise with a steep ascent immediately from the road. Under the last mentioned hills rise several springs, that uniting form a brook called Combesbrook, which, after crossing the parish, empties itself into the Avon just below. Another spring rises in that part of the parish which borders on North-Stoke, and forms a small rivulet. . . .

School, went to London to study under Augustus Charles Pugin. He was diocesan architect to the Diocese of Bath & Wells from 1841.

In 1860 the Diocesan Church Building Society made a grant of £40 for the provision of 66 additional sittings (all to be free) to Kelston Church.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 15 Sep 1864 p5 in a section on 'Objects of Interest within a Walk of any Part of the City':

KELSTON (3 miles from Bath).—Church restored 1860, a fresco painting found on the west wall, also the stem of an ancient cross, apparently Saxon.

From the Bath Chronicle of Thu 17 Nov 1870 p5:

THE BISHOP OF BATH AND WELLS AT KELSTON.-On Wednesday week, the eve of the Church Conference in this city, The Bishop of the Diocese consecrated an addition to the Churchyard at Kelston. He was received in the village with every token of respect and satisfaction by the parishioners. The bells rang merrily, the church was decorated, and the service attended by a very full congregation. The petition for consecration was presented to his Lordship by Lieut.-Col. Jones, the donor of the additional space. The Rural Dean of Keynsham, the Rev. J. Wood, attended as Bishop's Chaplain, Prayers were said by the Rector, the Rev. F. J. Poynton, and several neighbourhood clergy assisted at the special ceremony, which, owing to the lateness of the hour, had to be performed by torch-light, not without picturesque effect.

From the *Bath Chronicle* of Thu 23 Dec 1886 p2:

A new vestry has been added to Kelston
Church, near Bath. Mr. Wm. Veals, of

Bristol, was the contractor, and Mr. E. Henry Edwards the architect.

From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 17 Jan 1931 p20:

After a silence of 30 years, Kelston church bells are to rung again.

The ravages of the death watch beetle on the old wooden beams and supports made it unsafe to ring the bells, but now they are to be replaced by modern steel and two new bells are to be added at a cost of £466.

Four years ago, the Rev. E. W. Poynton (rector) opened a fund to collect the amount needed to restore the bells, His appeal met with instant response, not only from the parishioners but from people in other parts of the county and donations have been received from places as far distant as Java and New Zealand.

The amount needed has now been collected, and the bells were despatched on Friday to Bitton station, where they were sent by rail to the works of Messrs. John Taylor and Co., Loughborough, Leicester.

The tenor bell, which is the largest, weighs 10½ cwt. Each bell is inscribed "Mr. Stephen Toghill, Warden, 1762," and were cast at Chew Magna.

#### RECTOR AS RINGER

The Bishop of Bath and Wells has consented to consecrate the bells, and the Rector hopes to hold the consecration service on May 28th, providing the bells are returned to Kelston in time.

The Rector is an experienced bell ringer and has rung in many towers in the district. He is training a number of young bellringers in the village to ring a peal of six bells, by means of handbells.

From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 13 Jun 1931 p20 carried a report of the consecration of the bells.

From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 1 May 1937 p11 in a report on the Bath and District Archaeologists' annual excursion:

At St. Nicholas' Church, Kelston, the archæologists were welcomed by the Rector (the Rev. E. W. Poynton, M.A.), who succeeded his father in the living. The church has what is known as "a saddleback," there being a two-sided superstructure rising from the top of the tower.

The visitors constituted a goodly congregation, and its proportions were a subject of comment and contrast by the Rector. He said that it was to him somewhat of an ordeal to address so large a congregation, the number usually being about 20 morning and evening. And they were lucky of they got that!

In giving information respecting the church, Mr. Poynton brought in many stories and anecdotes. After describing himself as "hopelessly modern to begin with," he quoted his brother, Dr. F. J. Poynton, to the effect that it was supposed that there had been three churches there, but he added that he did not known on what authority—it was not in his father's book (which the Rector had under his arm).

"This church, which has had very noted people," he said, "has been most disgracefully let down. I think it is a case of plurality; that is to say that some who served as ministers here held very much higher office in some cathedral, so they put in some poor curate passing rich in £40 a year, or perhaps, a little more—because I started at £90! Consequently this parish was grossly neglected."

He had been told that there had been three churches on that site. There was one about which they knew nothing, but he was able to show a representation of the old church in 1860. (This was passed round.)

. . .

"I leave it with you to decide, on looking at the church, whether you think the modern church is better than the old one," the Rector remarked.

"We are 'hopelessly Protestant,' we always have been," he said, "but, thanks to my good wife, she has been able, with a certain amount of difficulty, to advance it a little bit.

. . .

Indicating the north side of the chancel, the Rector said that there was once a runic Transitional Saxon cross, a most beautiful piece of stone work. A Bishop of Bristol, when a little over 80 years of age, came over and took a rubbing of it. There was a rood cross in the stone jamb of the doorway, and those were two of the most treasured things they had in the church.

The rood cross is a carved stone about 3in square let into the jamb, and it is more noticeable because it is not of the same colour.

. . .

Taking up a suggestion that had been made to him that the tower was Saxon, the Rector said that it was 14th century and no earlier. He told a story of how one of the bells was taken out and sold by the churchwardens to pay expenses, the church always being in debt.

From A *Guide to St Nicholas Kelston* by Crofton Hayes (1987) (subsequently revised) the Saxon cross "was found in the East wall foundations of the old church. In the 1860 re-building it was built into the North wall of the sanctuary, but in 1980 was found to be suffering from damp. It was eventually removed in 1986 to dry out and final cleaning and restoration was finished in 1990." The same publication also refers to the rood cross saying that it was stolen in 2004 and that it has been replaced by "a new interpretation carved by Rory Young of Cirencester".

From *The Bath Chronicle and Herald* of Sat 26 Mar 1938 p21:

The organ of Kelston Church is wearing out. Mice have made their nests in the bellows and despite the efforts of the organist, Miss Craddock, the music is not of the high standard which could be desired.


At a sale of the work opened at Fortt's, Milsom Street, on Friday, the Rev. E. W. Poynton (Rector of Kelston) described how, when he came to the church nearly 34 years ago, it had been necessary to find

money for the restoration of the chancel. More money than necessary had been raised and the present organ purchased. It was a good old friend, but it was wearing out. Of the £240 necessary for its replacement £127 had been raised. The sale of work was to assist in making up the balance.

#### **Previous survey**

A survey was undertaken by <> and the late Helen Rogers. This yielded a map of the old section of the graveyard with (mostly) numbered memorials and a correlation between burial register numbers and grave numbers as they appear on that map.



These links between burial register entries and grave numbers allows attribution of surviving memorials even if no inscription remains. For pre-1813 entries (which do not have entry numbers) the link is between a memorial number and a surname. In most cases, this is insufficient to make an unequivocal match to individuals.



The register from 1993 is with the church and in 2017 had 46 entries.

Unusually, there is a register which starts with in 1538 when they were introduced.

## Layout



The graveyard developed in phases.

- The original churchyard north of the church
- An extension in 1870 to the south of the church
- A new rectangular plot in 1937.


A burial on 31 Dec 1937 has an annotation '1st in new graveyard'. However, curiously the same area has a burial from 1927.

At some point - possibly during the renovation of 1860 - various memorials within the church were removed and placed in the churchyard. The evidence for this is the account by Rev John Collinson in his *History of Somerset*, dating from the 1780s, which has various memorials were noted as being in the church but have been found in the churchyard. This includes some wall memorials which are now embedded in a wall and ledger stones leaning against the same wall.

The old section of the graveyard is on four sides of the church. The north-eastern part has a series of graves for the Harington family.




